The Electoral Act, 1893.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, January 18th, 1894. CECTION 25 of "The Electoral Act, 1893," enacts that the Electoral Parist that the Electoral Registrar of every Electoral District shall include in the list of persons qualified in the district to vote for a member to serve in the Legislative Council "the name of every person in the "Electoral Roll then in force for the Province in " respect of a qualification situate or arising in such " district.

At present there is no Electoral Roll in force for a Province, and the fact of a name being on the Roll in force for an Electoral District will not justify the insertion of that name in the list of Electors for a Province.

Every person therefore is recommended to make a claim to have his name placed on the Electoral Lists for such *Provinces* in respect of which he holds

'IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette Notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 4, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st January 1894, to 31st March, 1894, subject to the special conditions named hereunder, and to the Regulations in force for the time being.

- 2. The area comprised in No. 4 is as follows :--
 - All that portion of Hopeless Reach, Sharks Bay lying between the shores of Faure Island, Peron Peninsula, and lines drawn from the North-Eastern shore of Faure Island to Cape Peron, and from the South end of Faure Island to the end of the Cliffs, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles South from Dubaut Point.

This area will be opened till 31st March, 1894, and, by the special permission of the Inspector, during the month of April. No dredging will be allowed, and the collection must only be by hand, and subject to the right of the Inspector to stop work at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

Regulations under "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892."

HEREAS under the powers conferred upon Whim by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892," His Excellency the Governor in Council did, on the 7th day of June, 1893, make certain Regulations, which were published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of June, 1893; AND WHEREAS it has been determined to make the following additional Regulations: Now THEREFORE His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations under the authority of the said Act :-

I. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.

2. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.

3. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the pro-visions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.

Any person offending against the provisions of any of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50. Made and approved in Executive Council, this

II S Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regu-lations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands.

1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony shall after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within two years from the date of sale.

2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. Section 22.

That in each case of the BIRTH of every child in the said Colony the parent shall, within thirty days, and in the case of the DEATH of any person the tenant of the house or place shall, within fourteen days next thereafter, respectively inform the District Registrar of such Birth or Death, and of all the particulars concerning the same, according to the form of registration hereinbefore referred to.

Section 26.

That in case any new-born child, or any dead body, shall be found exposed, the constable, in case of a new-born child, and the coroner, or, if none such, the Resident or Police Magistrate of the district, in case of a dead body, shall forthwith inform the District Registrar thereof, and of the place where the child or dead body was found; and where an inquest or magisterial inquiry shall be held on any dead body, the coroner or magistrate, as the case may be, shall notify to the District Registrar the verdict of the jury, or the opinion of such magistrate, with all other particulars required to be registered, concerning the death; and such District Registrar shall make the entry accordingly.

Section 30.

That every person who shall offend against this Ordinance by refusing or neglecting to give any notice or information required by any of the foregoing sections, or by knowingly registering any Birth or Death contrary to the provisions of any of the said sections, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not less than Two pounds, nor exceeding Twenty pounds.




