By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Dis-tinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

To His Honour Alexander Campbell Onslow, Chief Justice of Western Australia.

HEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent, passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 25th August, 1890, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government or from the Colony, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint our Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such officer, then any other person, to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others: Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct;

AND WHEREAS I, the said Governor, purpose to absent myself temporarily from the said seat of Government as authorised ;

AND WHEREAS there is no Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony :

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument, under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint you, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said seat of Government, and during such absence, to exercise, perform, and execute for and on my behalf as such Governor all such powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent as you may from time to time be requested or advised by a Responsible Minister or by the Executive Council to discharge.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Perth, this 23rd day of January, 1894.

The Electoral Act, 1893.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, January 18th, 1894.

Section 25 of "The Electoral Act, 1893." enacts that the Electoral Registrar of every Electoral District shall include in the list of persons qualified in the district to vote for a member to serve in the *Legislative Council* "the name of every person in the "Electoral Roll then in force for the Province in "respect of a qualification situate or arising in such "district."

At present there is no Electoral Roll in force for a *Province*, and the fact of a name being on the Roll in force for an Electoral *District* will not justify the insertion of that name in the list of Electors for a *Province*.

Every person therefore is recommended to make a claim to have his name placed on the Electoral Lists for such *Provinces* in respect of which he holds the requisite qualifications.

Section 6 of the "Instructions to Electoral Registrars," dated 13th November, 1893, is hereby cancelled.

A DDITIONAL Regulations for the Working, Management, and Use of the Fremantle, Bunbury, and Geraldton Sea Jetties, framed by the Governor in Executive Council on the 10th day of January, 1894, in accordance with the provisions of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878" (42 Vict., No. 18):—

"Any child or children under the age of nine years, unaccompanied by parent or other guardian, will not be allowed on the Sea Jetties at Fremantle, Bunbury or Geraldton.

"Any child or children so found on the abovementioned jetties will be given in charge of the police.
