ECTION 25 of "The Electoral Act, 1893," enacts that the Electoral Parist that the Electoral Registrar of every Electoral District shall include in the list of persons qualified in the district to vote for a member to serve in the Legislative Council "the name of every person in the "Electoral Roll then in force for the Province in "respect of a qualification situate or arising in such " district."

At present there is no Electoral Roll in force for a Province, and the fact of a name being on the Roll in force for an Electoral District will not justify the insertion of that name in the list of Electors for a Province.

Every person therefore is recommended to make a claim to have his name placed on the Electoral Lists for such Provinces in respect of which he holds the requisite qualifications.

Section 6 of the "Instructions to Electoral Registrars," dated 13th November, 1893, is hereby cancelled.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council, by his Deputy, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette Notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 4, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st January, 1894, to 31st March, 1894, subject to the special conditions named hereunder, and to the Regulations in force for the time being.

The area comprised in No. 4 is as follows:

All that portion of Hopeless Reach, Sharks Bay, lying between the shores of Faure Island, Peron Penin-sula, and lines drawn from the North-Eastern shore of Faure Island to Cape Peron, and from the South end of Faure Island to the end of the Cliffs, about 1½ miles South from Dubaut Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any of the pick-up banks within the area, and the collection must only be by hand, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

IIIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands.

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony shall after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within two years from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within twelve months, by four equal quarterly instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.


