PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS.

"The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Electoral Acts 1889 and 1893."

THE special attention of Returning Officers, Resident, Police, and other Magistrates, Electoral Registrars, District Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, Clerks of Municipal Councils and District Roads Boards, Inspectors, Sub-Inspectors, and Sergeants of Police, Officers in charge of Police Stations, Postmasters, and Headmasters of Government Schools is drawn to the duties imposed upon them, respectively, by the above mentioned Acts, and also to the Notices appearing in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* of the 13th November, 1893.

Persons desiring to be registered as Electors for Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly are required to claim, in writing, in the prescribed form.

Forms may be obtained from the Electoral Registrars and in Country Districts, also from the Police Stations and Post Offices.

Claims must be received by the Electoral Registrars on or before the 15th of February next, to enable the Claimants' names to be inserted in the Electoral Rolls for the year 1894.

Secon, Summary 18th, 1894. SECTION 25 of "The Electoral Act, 1893," enacts that the Electoral Registrar of every Electoral District shall include in the list of persons qualified in the district to vote for a member to serve in the Legislative Council "the name of every person in the "Electoral Roll then in force for the Province in "respect of a qualification situate or arising in such "district."

At present there is no Electoral Roll in force for a *Province*, and the fact of a name being on the Roll in force for an Electoral *District* will not justify the insertion of that name in the list of Electors for a *Province*.

Every person therefore is recommended to make a claim to have his name placed on the Electoral Lists for such *Provinces* in respect of which he holds the requisite qualifications.

Section 6 of the "Instructions to Electoral Registrars," dated 13th November, 1893, is hereby cancelled.

H IS Excellency the Governor in Council, by his Deputy, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by *Gazette* Notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered No. 4, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st January, 1894, to 31st March, 1894, subject to the special conditions named hereunder, and to the Regulations in force for the time being.

The area comprised in No. 4 is as follows :-

All that portion of Hopeless Reach, Sharks Bay, lying between the shores of Faure Island, Peron Peninsula, and lines drawn from the North-Eastern shore of Faure Island to Cape Peron, and from the South eud of Faure Island to the end of the Cliffs, about 12 miles South from Dubaut Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any of the pick-up banks within the area, and the collection must only be by hand, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time if, in his opinion, the industry is being injured.

The Notice gazetted on the 10th January, 1894, is hereby cancelled.
