THEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such district, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following Boundaries:— Bounded on the North by a due East line produced from a spot situate one and a half miles North from Gullewa Spring; on the East by the 125th Meridian of East Longitude; on the South by a due West line in direction of Mount Stirling to the 123rd Meridian of East Longitude, thence South along said Meridian to a spot due East from Mount Ridley, and thence West passing through said Mount Ridley; and on the West by the 120th Meridian of East Longitude—shall be and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

THE COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT,

and further I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing Boundaries of the Yilgarn and the Plantagenet Magisterial Districts respectively, and declare them to be for the future as follows:—

THE YILGARN MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *North* by a due East line produced from a spot situate one and a half miles North from Gullewa Spring; on the *East* by the 120th Meridian of East Longitude; on the *South* by a due West line in direction of Millingnalling Pool on the Hotham River; and on the *West* by a North line passing through a spot situate 10 miles West from Trigonometrical Station on Yorkrakine Hill.

THE PLANTAGENET MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Eastward by the East boundary of the Colony; on the Southward by the Sea-coast from the said East boundary to D'Entrecasteaux Point, including the islands adjacent; on the Westward and Northward by lines extending North-North-Easterly from Point D'Entrecasteaux aforesaid to the junction of the Wilgarup River with the Warren River, thence by an Easterly line to the South-West corner of Nelson Location 6 at Topanup, thence Easterly by the Road to Albany to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River, thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to "Upper Yerriminup Pool," thence Northerly to a point 16 miles West from the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East passing through the said mile mark to the junction of the Jackitup Creek with the Pallinup River, thence East-North-Easterly in direction of Mount Glasse to the 120th Meridian of East Longitude, thence South along said Meridian to a spot due West from Mount Ridley, thence East passing through said Mount Ridley to the 123rd Meridian of East Longitude, thence North along said Meridian to a spot due East from Mount Stirling, thence East to the 125th Meridian of East Longitude, thence North along said Meridian to a spot due East from the highest summit of the Wongan Hills, and thence due East to the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

And I do also, with the like advice, declare that the Boundaries of the Williams, York, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively, shall be and are hereby altered in so far as they are affected by the Boundaries of the Yilgarn and Coolgardie Magisterial Districts, and that the Boundaries of the Toodyay, York, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively, shall be and are hereby extended to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the Boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District, and also to alter the name of a Magisterial District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the North-West Magisterial District comprised within the following boundaries, namely:—Bounded on the North by the parallel of 19° 30′ South Latitude; on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the South by a West line from the said East boundary of the Colony in direction of a spot situate thirty miles South from Mount Alexander on the Ashburton River; and on the West by a line extending North from said South boundary in direction of Trigonometrical Station B 3 to a spot situate due East from Mount Vigors, thence East to a spot due South from the summit of Mount Macpherson, thence North passing through the said summit of Mount Macpherson to a spot due East from the junction of the Shaw River with the DeGrey River, and thence West through the said junction to a spot due North from aforesaid Trigonometrical Station B 3, thence North to the Sea-coast and along it Eastwards to the parallel of 19° 30′ South Latitude. And that portion of the Gascoyne Magisterial District comprised within the following boundaries, namely:—Bounded on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the North by a line extending West therefrom in direction of a spot situate thirty miles South from Mount Alexander, on the Ashburton River; on the South by the Tropic of Capricorn; and on the West by a line extending North therefrom in direction of Trigonometrical Station B 3—shall no longer form parts of the North-West and Gascoyne Magisterial Districts respectively, but shall be added to and shall form part of the Pilbarra Magisterial District.

AND FURTHER I do hereby declare that that portion of the Pilbarra Magisterial District comprised within the following boundaries, namely:-Bounded on the West by a line extending South from a spot on the Sea-coast South by West from Depuch Island, and passing through a spot eight miles West from the summit of Mount Negri, continuing South till it meets a due West line from Trigonometrical Station B 3; on the South by an East line in direction of said Trigonometrical Station B 3; on the East by a line extending North therefrom to Cape Thouin and on the North by the Sea-coast. And that portion of the Gascoyne Magisterial District comprised within the following boundaries, namely: -Bounded on the South by the Tropic of Capricorn; on the East by a line extending North therefrom in direction of Trigonometrical Station B-3; on the North by a line extending West therefrom in direction of a spot thirty miles South from Mount Alexander on Ashburton River; and on the West by a line extending North from said Tropic of Capricorn in direction of Mount Lionel—shall no longer form parts of the Pilbarra and Gascoyne Magisterial Districts respectively, but shall be added to and form part of the North-West Magisterial District.

And I do hereby also declare that the Magisterial District now known as the North-West, and altered as aforesaid, shall hereafter be named the Roebourne Magisterial District, and that the Boundaries of the Roebourne, Pilbarra, and Gascoyne Magisterial Districts shall respectively be as follows:—The said Roebourne Magisterial District being bounded on the South and West by a South-South-East line from the Sea-coast to the Trigonometrical Station on Pedamullah Hill, thence East-South-Easterly to the Trigonometrical Station on Mount Darnell, thence East-South-Easterly to the Trigonometrical Station on Mount Rica, thence East-South-Easterly to Trigonometrical Station Y 13, thence South-South-Easterly to the Trigonometrical Station on Mount Lionel, thence due South to the Tropic of Capricorn and along it East to a point due South from Trigonometrical Station B 3; on the East by a North line from said Tropic of Capricorn to said Trigonometrical Station B 3, then West to a point due South from Cape Thouin and North therefrom to the Sea-coast; and on the North by the Sea-coast, including the Islands adjacent.

The said Pilbarra Magisterial District being bounded on the West by a line extending due South from Cape Thouin till it meets a due West line from Trigonometrical Station B3; on the South by a line extending East to said station B3, thence South to the Tropic of Capricorn, and along it East to the East boundary of the Colony; on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the North by a West line extending from the said East boundary of the Colony along the 19° 30′ parallel of South Latitude to the Sea-coast, and thence along the Sea-coast West-South-Westwards to Cape Thouin, including all Islands adjacent.

The said Gascoyne Magisterial District being so far amended that its North boundary is the Tropic of Capricorn.

Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay Opened.

The Treasury, Perth, April 4th, 1894.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st of April to the 30th June, 1894.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows:—
All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.

THE following Regulations for the Management of the Northampton Commonage, approved by of the Northampton Commonage, approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

NORTHAMPTON COMMONAGE REGULATIONS.

- 1. That no stock whatever (except bond fide travellers or travelling teams) be allowed to run free of charge on the Commonage, and that all large stock be charged at the rate of 3s. 6d. (three shillings and six-pence) per head per annum or any part thereof, calves and foals above six months old to be chargeable; and that bonû fide butchers only be allowed to keep 150 (one hundred and fifty) sheep at one time, and no more, at the rate of 2d. (two-pence) per head per annum. Teams, whose owners do not reside within the limits of the Commonage, shall be considered travelling teams, and shall be allowed to remain a period not exceeding 7 (seven) days free of charge. Goats to be charged at the rate of 6d. (sixpence) per head per annum, and that only 2 (two) shall be kept by one family; kids when six months old to become chargeable. Bona fide butchers shall be considered those who reside within the townsite of Northampton, and keeping a butcher's shop for the convenience of the public; and that no rams, store or breeding sheep be kept under any pretext whatever on the Commonage; and further, that no stock shall be allowed to run on the Commonage unless they be the property of persons residing within the limits of the said Commonage. Pigs not to be allowed to run on the Commonage.
- 2. That each householder be allowed to run 15 (fifteen) head of large stock, and that a lodger be allowed to run a number not exceeding 2 (two)
- 3. That the Secretary of the Northampton Commonage Board be empowered to grant a special license to persons wishing to keep a dairy herd, such not to exceed 20 (twenty) in number, and the period of such license not to exceed 3 (three) months, at a charge of 3s. 6d. (three shillings and six-pence) per head.
- 4. That one month after the publication of these Regulations in the Government Gazette, all stock found depasturing on the Commonage (the fees chargeable on them not having been paid) may be impounded by such person as the Board may appoint, in any safe place within the neighbourhood of Northampton, and be dealt with under the provisions of the Trespass
- 5. That it shall be compulsory for each and every owner of stock residing within, and making use of the said Commonage, to send in, in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Commonage Board for the time being, a return showing the number and description of his stock depasturing on the Commonage, not later than one month after the publication of the said Regulations, and on or before the same date in each and every succeeding year; and the said owner shall also obtain the necessary certificate under the hand of the Secretary for the time being.
- 6. That all fees for licenses be paid to the Secretary, or through the Ranger to the Secretary, and when the amount in the hands of the Secretary exceed the sum of £5, the amount be placed to the credit of the Board in the W. A. Bank at Geraldton, and all moneys paid therefrom be by cheque signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the Chairman.

- 7. That travelling sheep be allowed to remain on the Commonage for 24 (twenty-four) hours and no more.
- 8. That the owners or occupiers of unfenced free-hold property within the Commonage shall have the right of depasturing 4 (four) head of large stock within the said Commonage, free of charge, for every 100 (one hundred) acres, on condition of allowing other stock depasturing on the Commonage to have free access to the said freehold land at the discretion of the Board.
- 9. That in the event of the scale of charges herein named for large stock, sheep, &c., proving insufficient to meet the expenses of working the Commonage, the Board may increase the charges to such an extent as may be found necessary to defray the costs.
- 10. That all persons found hunting, driving, or removing stock off the Commonage, not being the owners of licensed stock or bona fide servants of the same with written authority from the owner, be prosecuted under the Trespass Act. No person shall be allowed to drive stock from one end of the Commonage to the other. Stock when required must be driven into the nearest stockyard, and for no greater distance than three miles.
- 11. All persons travelling sheep across the Commonage must give not less than 24 (twenty-four) hours or more than 48 (forty-eight) hours notice in writing to the Chairman, Secretary, or Ranger.

Regulations respecting the discovery, disposal, and removal of Guano.

TIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations respecting the discovery, disposal, and removal of Guano existing upon islands or coasts within the territorial limits of Western Australia.

Reward for the discovery of Guano.

1. The discovery and detailed report of a hitherto unknown deposit of not less than 2,000 tons of Guano shall entitle the discoverer to a reward equal to ten per cent. of the amount received for the Guano by the Government within five years following the discovery.

Commissioner of Crown Lands may issue Licenses.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands may, at his discretion, license the master of any vessel to collect and remove guano. The license shall be deemed to be under the Act 40 Victoria, No. IX.

Classes and forms of Licenses.

3. A license to remove Guano shall be either General, Special, or Exclusive, according to the forms annexed.

General License.

4. A General License shall apply, save as excepted under these regulations, to all coasts and islands within the territorial limits of the Colony. It shall only be issued in exceptional cases, to encourage the discovery and utilisation of new deposits of Guano. Localities comprised within any previously issued Exclusive License, or localities which the Commissioner of Crown Lands may deem it desirable to reserve, shall be excepted from the operation of a General License, and so noted thereon. The localities comprised within any subsequently issued Exclusive License shall also be excepted from the operation of a General License, but not until the Exclusive License has been exhibited by the holder thereof, or his agent, to the master of the vessel acting under the General License.

Special License.

5. A Special License shall apply to localities specified and described therein, but shall not exclude the holder of a General License, or the holder of any other Special License, applicable to the same locality.

Exclusive License.

6. An Exclusive License shall only be issued to the master of a vessel the owners or charterers of which are under special agreement with the Government to remove the whole of the Guano in a particular locality; such agreement shall not be entered into unless the Government are fully informed as to the quantity and quality of the Guano. An Exclusive License shall confer the sole right to Guano in the locality specified therein.

Licenses not transferable.

7. A License under these Regulations shall not be transferable, and shall apply only to the vessel named therein.

Royalty on Guano for Export.

8. A Royalty of ten shillings per ton, calculated on the registered tonnage of the vessel, shall be paid to the Collector of Customs, or other duly authorised Officer, before the issue of any license to collect Guano for export from the Colony; but this charge may, in the case of an *Exclusive* License, be increased by the Governor in Executive Council.

Guano for use in the Colony.

9. Licenses to collect Guano for use in the Colony will be issued free of royalty, on the applicant entering into a bond, with one surety, in the prescribed form, for an amount sufficient to cover the royalty calculated as prescribed in the preceding clause.

Term of Licenses not to exceed 12 months.

10. Licenses shall be for a period not exceeding 12 months, to be fixed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

Commissioner of Crown Lands may impose further Conditions.

11. Licenses shall be subject to any special conditions and limitations which the Commissioner of Crown Lands may deem it proper to endorse thereon.

Commissioner of Crown Lands to supervise removal of Guano.

12. Guano shall be removed under the direction and supervision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or of his agent resident upon the spot. The Commissioner or his agent may mark off spaces from which only the Guano is to be taken, and may order accordingly, and shall prevent waste and unprofitable working of the deposits.

Penalties. Revocation of License.

13. Holders of licenses and their agents should understand that they are liable to the penalties specified in Act 40 Victoria, No. IX, in respect of any act not duly covered by the terms of their licenses and these Regulations; and the license of any ship infringing the conditions of the license, or of these Regulations, or any order thereunder, shall be held to be revoked, on intimation to that effect given to the master of the ship or his principals by the Commissioner of Crown Lands or his agent.

Government do not guarantee Guano.

14. The Government will not be responsible for the quantity or quality of any Guano licensed to be removed under these Regulations.

Questions to be decided by Governor in Executive Council.

15. Licenses under these Regulations shall be subject to the condition that any question or matter in dispute arising between the Government and the holder of a license shall be referred for the decision of the Governor in Executive Council, and that such decision shall be final and binding upon both parties.

Regulations to come into force on 1st April, 1894.

16. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st April, 1894.

Former Regulations repealed.

17. All former Regulations are hereby repealed.
