Declaring Murchison Registry District, and altering Boundaries of Gascoyne, Northampton, Geraldton, and Greenough Registry Districts.

#### PROCLAMATION

(Mestern Anstralia, ) to wit.

W. C. F. ROBINSON. (L.S.)

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distin-guished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Com-mander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the 4th section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 12, intituled "An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia," that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may for the purpose of such Ordinance divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth, and may in like manner, by any subsequent Proclamation, from time to time alter such division : Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following districts, bounded respectively as described below, to be known and designated as the Gascoyne, Murchison, Northampton, Geraldton, and Greenough Districts, to be Registry Districts.

The boundaries of the Gascoyne, Bowes and Murchison, Victoria and Greenough Registry Districts, as hitherto defined by Proclamation, are hereby abolished.

#### THE GASCOYNE REGISTRY DISTRICT.

#### BOUNDARIES.

Bounded on the North by an East line extending from the Sea-coast and passing through a spot situate 30 miles South from Mount Alexander, on the Ashburton River; on the East by the East boundary of

the Colony; on the South by a West line passing through Mount Murchison, on the Murchison River; and on the West by the Sea-coast, including the Islands adjacent.

#### THE MURCHISON REGISTRY DISTRICT.

#### BOUNDARIES.

Bounded on the North by an East line passing through Mount Murchison, on the Murchison River; on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the South by a West line passing through a spot  $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles North from Gullewa Spring; and on the West by a North line passing through a spot 8 miles West from Tallering Peak.

# THE NORTHAMPTON REGISTRY DISTRICT.

#### BOUNDARIES.

Bounded on the North by an East line from the Sea-coast, in direction of Mount Murchison, on the Murchison River; on the West by the Sea-coast, including the Islands adjacent; on the South by an East line from the Sea-coast through Wokatherra Trigonometrical Station to the Greenough River, thence upwards along said river; and on the East by a North line from said river through a spot 8 miles West of Tallering Peak.

#### THE GERALDTON REGISTRY DISTRICT.

#### BOUNDARIES.

Bounded on the North by an East line from the Sea-coast through Wokatherra Trigonometrical Station to the Greenough River, thence upwards along said river to a point due South from a spot 8 miles West from Tallering Peak; on the East by a due South line from spot aforesaid; on the West by the Sea-coast, including the Islands adjacent; on the *South* by a line from the mouth of the Greenough River to Wizard Peak, and thence due East to the South end of the East boundary.

#### THE GREENOUGH REGISTRY DISTRICT.

#### BOUNDARIES.

Bounded on the North by lines starting from the mouth of the Greenough River and extending to Wizard Peak, thence due East to a spot due South from a point 8 miles West of Tallering Peak; thence due North to a spot due West from a point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles North of Gullewa Spring, in Victoria Location 836, and thence due East passing through the point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles North of Gullewa Spring as aforesaid; and on the *East* by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such district, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District : Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following Boundaries :----Bounded on the North by a due East line produced from a spot situate one and a half miles North from Gullewa Spring; on the East by the 125th Meridian of East Longitude; on the South by a due West line in direction of Mount Stirling to the 123rd Meridian of East Longitude, thence South along said Meridian to a spot due East from Mount Ridley, and thence West passing through said Mount Ridley; and on the West by the 120th Meridian of East Longitude-shall be and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

# THE COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT,

and further I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing Boundaries of the Yilgarn and the Plantagenet Magisterial Districts respectively, and declare them to be for the future as follows:—

THE YILGARN MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a due East line produced from a spot situate one and a half miles North from Gullewa Spring; on the East by the 120th Meridian of East Longitude; on the South by a due West line in direction of Millingnalling Pool on the Hotham River; and on the West by a North line passing through a spot situate 10 miles West from Trigonometrical Station on Yorkrakine Hill.

#### THE PLANTAGENET MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Eastward by the East boundary of the Colony; on the Southward by the Sea-coast from the said East boundary to D'Entrecasteaux Point, including the islands adjacent; on the Westward and Northward by lines extending North-North-Easterly from Point D'Entrecasteaux aforesaid to the junction of the Wilgarup River with the Warren River, thence by an Easterly line to the South-West corner of Nelson Location 6 at Topanup, thence Easterly by the Road to Albany to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River, thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to "Upper Yerriminup Pool," thence Northerly to a point 16 miles West from the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East passing through the said mile mark to the junction of the Jackitup Creek with the Pallinup River, thence East-North-Easterly in direction of Mount Glasse to the 120th Meridian of East Longitude, thence South along said Meridian to a spot due West from Mount Ridley, thence East passing through said Mount Ridley to the 123rd Meridian of East Longitude, thence North along said Meridian to a spot due East from Mount Stirling, thence East to the 125th Meridian of East Longitude, thence North along said Meridian to a spot due East from the highest summit of the Wongan Hills, and thence due East to the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

And I do also, with the like advice, declare that the Boundaries of the Williams, York, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively, shall be and are hereby altered in so far as they are affected by the Boundaries of the Yilgarn and Coolgardie Magisterial Districts, and that the Boundaries of the Toodyay, York, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively, shall be and are hereby extended to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District.

#### "THE COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD";

and I do further, with the like advice, alter the existing Boundaries of the Yilgarn and Dundas

#### BOUNDARIES.

HEREAS by Order in Council, dated the 10th day of May, 1892, the introduction of Grapes into the Colony is prohibited, and whereas it has been deemed desirable that such restriction should be removed, so far as the introduction of Grapes North of Champion Bay is concerned : Now, therefore, I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., by virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880," with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that, from and after this date, the said restriction on the importation of Grapes North of Champion Bay shall be removed.

#### Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay Opened.

The Treasury, Perth,

April 4th, 1894. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by *Gazette* notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st of April to the 30th June, 1894.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows :----

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

portions of the area as he may approve of. The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.

#### Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands.

1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within two years from the date of sale.

2. 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.



#### Albany Local Board of Health.

Under the provisions contained in Section 24 of the Public Health Act (50 Victoria, No. 19) and amendments thereto, the Local Board of Health of the Municipality of Albany, by the powers therein contained, do hereby repeal the By-Laws Nos. 1 to 27 with Schedule attached, and published in the *Government Gazette* under date of April 26th, 1888. And do hereby make the following By-Laws for the abatement and prevention of Nuisances, and for securing the healthfulness of the Municipality of Albany.

#### GENERAL BY-LAWS.

Section 1.—Words used in these By-Laws, and having meanings assigned to them by the 50 Vic., No. 19, Sec. 2, shall have the same meaning in these by-laws.

Section 2.—The Local Board of Health, or the Chairman, may from time to time appoint any place or places within the Municipality of Albany, or elsewhere, for the reception of night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter, and may at any time cancel or vary such appointment; and the Inspector of the said Board may at all times have free ingress and egress upon the said places, und such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in carrying out the above mentioned Act.

Section 3.—No person shall deposit, place, or put any night-soil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter whatsoever from any house, stable, cow-house, lane, yard, or other premises in the Municipality of Albany, in any place within the said Municipality other than the place or places appointed by the Local Board of Health for such purpose under the last section, except in such box or receptacles as the Board may from time to time authorise.

Section 4.—No person shall exercise or practise or be in any manner concerned in the business of a nightman, or drive any night cart within the limits of the Municipality of Albany, until and unless he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector of the Local Board of Health.

Section 5.—Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman, whether as master or labourer or otherwise, shall make an application for license so to do, at the Inspector's Office, which application shall be in writing and shall be signed by two or more respectable householders, certifying the fitness of the applicant to hold such license; and such license he shall, upon presentation of such certificate, and registry being made of his true name and place of abode, be entitled to receive; provided that it shall be lawful for the Inspector to refuse to issue such license to any person who shall have been convicted of any offence against the provisions herein contained.

Section 6.—Nightmen's licenses shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto annexed (marked A) or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the said Local Board.

Section 7.—Nightmen's Licenses shall be of two kinds, namely, Masters' Licenses and Labourers' Licenses; and every license of whatever description, and at whatever period of the year the same may be granted shall remain in force only until the thirty-first day of December next ensuing; provided that apart from or in addition to any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the said Local Board, upon being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman, whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel any such license, or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as the said Local Board may think proper; and if any such nightman shall, after such cancellation, or during the period of such suspension of his license, he shall be subject to and liable, upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace for the said Municipality, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Section 8.—If any person, for the purpose of securing a Nightman's License, shall use or employ, or shall cause to be inserted in such license any false or fictitious name or description of his place of abode, he shall be subject to the penalty described herein for offences against the provisions hereof, and such license shall be cancelled.

Section 9.—Whenever any licensed nightman shall change his place of abode he shall, within two days next after such change of abode, give notice thereof in writing to the nspector, specifying his new place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

Section 10.—Every licensed nightman, whenever or so long as he shall be engaged in removing any nightsoil or other offensive matter or thing, or in driving any night cart, or otherwise in conducting the said business shall carry with and about him his license, and shall produce and show the same whenever required by any person to do so, and such license he shall on no pretence whatever lend or part with to any person.

Section 11.—Every licensed nightman, before using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, shall register the same in such manner as the said Local Board may direct, in the office of the Inspector, and shall receive a memorandum of the number assigned to such cart: Provided that no such registration of any night-cart shall be made unless and until such cart shall have been inspected by the Inspector or other officer appointed for that purpose by the Local Board of Health, and certified by him to be fit and suitable for the purpose of a night-cart.

Section 12.—Every licensed nightman shall, whilst using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, have painted, and kept at all times conspicuous, on the right side thereof, white upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman," in letters not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and the number assigned to such cart, in figures not less than four inches in length, of proportionate breadth.

Section 13.—Every night-cart shall be kept by the owner thereof watertight and free from leakage, and shall be provided with covering so as effectually to prevent the splashing or spilling of anything carried therein.

Section 14.—Every licensed master nightman shall, within twenty-four hours of demand made for that purpose, properly clean any cesspool or earth closet, or bucket kept for the reception of night-soil, dust-bin, or other offensive matter, and shall be entitled to and charge therefor, from the occupier of the premises, or person living therein, the sum that shall be fixed by the Local Board from time to time of which due notice shall be given in at least one local paper, which sum shall be recoverable in a summary manner before one or more Justices of the Peace for the district. If any licensed master nightman shall, without good, just or lawful excuse, neglect, decline, or refuse to properly cleanse any such cesspool, earth-closet, bucket, dust-bin, or other offensive matter as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a breach of these By-Laws, and may be proceeded against for every such offence before any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the district.

Section 15.—Any licensed master nightman or licensed labourer or other person who shall ask or demand or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, a sum greater than that fixed by the Local Board from time to time provided in Section (14) shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws.

Section 16.—No privy or cesspool shall be emptied, nor any night-soil carted away, nor any offensive liquor or matter of any kind whatsoever pumped out of or removed from any house or premises whatsoever within the said Municipality, between the hour of 5 a.m. and the hour of 11 p.m. of any day.

Section 17.—For the purpose of this By-Law the word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who for remuneration shall remove, or assist to remove, any night-soil or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever; and the words "night-cart" shall mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever, ...sed by any nightman for the conveyance of any night-soil, ammoniacal liquor, or other offensive liquid or substance.

Section 18.—The occupier or occupiers of premises whereon earth closets, or buckets, or other receptacles above ground are kept for the reception of night-soil, shall keep the same clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause them to be cleaned at least once every week, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws.

Section 19.—Every bucket, or pan, or other receptacle kept for the reception of nightsoil shall be first approved by the Inspector, and shall be at all times free from leaks and holes, and shall have affixed thereto a handle working on a pivot at each side.

Section 20.—Each house shall be provided with a dustbin and every premises where horses and cattle are kept with a manure-bin, the said bins to be of a size to be approved by the Inspector, and to be kept at all times clean and free from offensive smell, and be cleaned out at least once every month, or oftener if the Inspector so direct, Section 21.—Every closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house or occupied building, and every person having or building a closet contrary to this Dr Lorr shall be built for survey? this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

Section 22 .- No closet shall be erected except in such a or other officer appointed by the Local Board of Health; and any person being guilty of a breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Section 23.—Any person who shall lay, cast, or throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast, or thrown any bottle, bottles, broken glass, china, crockery, empty tins, or other rubbish or refuse in or upon the carriage-way, footother rubbish or reuse in or upon the carriage-way, foct-way, street, beach, reserve, or other public place within the District of the said Local Board, shall upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace for the District forfeit and pay for the first offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; for the second offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds; and for the third and subsequent offence, not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence.

Section 24.—No person or persons shall keep any swine or pigsty within the Municipality of Albany within the area defined by the following boundaries:—On the South by Princess Royal Harbour, between Parade Street and Osnaburg Street; on the West by Parade Street and the Western boundary of Sub. Lot 37 to Perth Road, Ulster Road from the Monument to Spencer Road; on the North by Perth Road from Cross Street to the Monument, and Middleton Road from the Monument to the Church of Echan Lawrence France for the Annual form the England cemetery; Eastward by a line drawn from the Church of England cemetery to Short Street East by way of Rowley Street, thence to Osnaburg Street on to Princess Royal Harbour, and not within 100 feet of either side of the several roads named.

Section 25 .- Whenever in these By-Laws any act, deed' matter, or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed, matter, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, comply, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing or prevent being done any act, deed, matter, or thing shall be deemed guilty of an offence under these By-Laws; and in determining the responsibility of the person against whom any proceedings may be taken under the By-Laws it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person is the occupier, or resides either together with other or others or alone, and whether as a lodger or part occupier or otherwise upon the premises whereon the offence is committed.

Section 26. -For every offence against any of the provisions of these By-Laws to which no fixed penalty is attached herein, the offender shall upon conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Section 27.—All penalties recoverable under these By-Laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance, 50 Victoria, No. 19.

Whenever in these By-Laws the word Inspector is used it shall be taken to mean the Inspector for the time being of the said Local Board, or anyone acting in his place.
