PROCLAMATION

HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Ordinance to make provision for the trial of Criminal Offences at Albany and other remote Districts of the Colony of Western Australia," it is provided that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for the various Districts of this Colony may be holden, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance, at such times and in such places as the Governor shall, by Proclamation, from time to time appoint: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, do hereby appoint Broome, Roebuck Bay, as a place where such a Court shall be held; and I do further appoint and direct that the said Court shall be held on the first Wednesday in the months of August and November in the present year, and on the first Wednesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each and every succeeding year. And I do further, with the like advice, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Jury Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1878," hereby fix Tuesday, the fifth day of June next ensuing, as the day

for first holding the Special Sessions for the revision of the Jury Lists, in accordance with the provisions of section 12 of "The Jury Act, 1871."

R. W. Duff, Governor. Proclamation by His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Robert William Duff, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

WHEREAS by section ten of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the Government Gazette of the 10th January, 1893, pursuant to the provisions of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things Scab in Sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease: And whereas there is reason to believe that Scab in Sheep exists at the present time in the colony of Western Australia, and that foreign stock are admitted into that colony without the necessary disinfection and quarantine: Now therefore I, Sir Robeirt William Duff, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, absolutely prohibit, for a further period of twelve months from this date, the importation or introduction of any stock, or any fodder or fittings put on board any vessel, with, or for the use of, any stock from the colony of Western Australia.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws of the York Municipal Council.

The following By-Laws were made and passed at an ordinary Meeting of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of York, holden in the Council Chambers, at York aforesaid, on Friday, the second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and were finally adopted at the following Meeting, holden at the Council Chambers aforesaid, on the fourth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four:—

- 1. By-Law No. 1 made and passed on the thirtieth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, shall be and is hereby repealed.
- 2. The York Municipal Council shall meet at the Council Chambers, Avon Terrace, in the Town of York, on the first and third Tuesdays in each month during the year, at the following hours :-
 - (a.) During and between the months of April and September, at the hour of 7 30 p.m.
 - (b.) During and between the months of October and March, at the hour of 8 p.m.
- 3. That portion of the Public Gardens (York Town Lots 9 and 10) facing the Avon Pool and set apart by the Council for bathing purposes, and on which is erected a Bathing House, may be used by the public for bathing
- 4. No person shall bathe from any portion of the said Public Gardens, excepting only that portion set apart for a Bathing House as aforesaid.
- 5. No person shall be allowed to bathe from the Bathing House unless in proper bathing costume.
- 6. The Bathing House may be used by the public during the following hours:
 - (a.) Ladies—between the hours of two and five in the afternoon, Saturdays and Sundays excepted.
 - (b.) Men—between the hours of 5:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., and after 5:30 p.m., Sundays excepted.
 On Sundays, before 10 a.m. and after 4 p.m. only.

Any person who shall offend against this or the two preceding By-Laws shall be liable to prosecution, and to forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding (20s.) Twenty shillings.

- 7. Any person committing a nuisance on any part of the Public Gardens shall be liable to prosecution, and to forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds
- 8. The following charges shall be levied for the use of the said Bathing House:—

Adults of the age of 16 or over, 2s. 6d. per annum.

Persons under the age of 16 years, and of or over 12 years, 1s.

Children under 12, free.

DY virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vict., No. 5), I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the following Regulations for preventing the introduction into Western Australia of Insects or of Matter destructive to Vegetation shall come into force on the 12th day of May, 1894.

Regulations for the Disinfection of Imported Trees, Plants, Cuttings (other than Vine), Grafts, Buds, Seeds, Pits, Scions, and Fruit.

- 1. All consignees, agents, or other persons shall, within twenty-four (24) hours, notify the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector of the arrival of any trees, plants, cuttings, buds, seeds, pits, or scions, at the first point of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia.
- 2. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions imported or brought from any foreign or other country, or the Australian or other British colonies, are hereby required to be disinfected immediately upon arrival at any point where they are to be unloaded. And, further-more, if any of said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions are found infested with insects (or seeds, pits or scions are found infested with insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to fruit or fruit-trees, or to other trees or plants, they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days, or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests, or their eggs, larvæ, or pupæ, before they can be offered for sale, gift, or transportation, as hereinafter provided. provided.
- 3. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), fungi, blight, or other diseases that are known to be injurious to fruit, or to fruit trees, or to other trees or plants, and liable to spread contagion, are hereby required to be disinfected before removal for distribution or transportation, or before being offered for sale or gift.
- 4. All peach, nectarine, apricot, plum, prune, almond, or other trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots, and all peach or other pits, cuttings, buds or scions raised or grown in any district, in any foreign or other country, or in any of the Australian or other colonies where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist, are hereby prohibited from being offered for sale, gift, distribution, or planting within the Colony of Western Australia.
- 5. Fruit of any kind grown in any foreign or other country, or any of the Australian or other colonies, and found infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees, or to other trees, is hereby prohibited from being offered for sale, gift, or distribution.
- 6. Transportable material of any kind infested with insect or insects (or their germs), or by any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit, or to fruit trees, or to other trees, and liable to spread contagion, is hereby prohibited from being offered for sale, gift, distribution, or transportation until said material has been disinfected by dipping it in boiling water, and allowing it to remain in said boiling water not less than two minutes, and helicing water and disinfected to water the water water water water water to be said to such boiling water used as such disinfectant to contain in solution not less than one pound of concentrated potash to each and every ten gallons of water,

- 7. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions shall be disinfected by dipping in a solution of one pound of whale-oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water; said whale-oil soap solution shall be kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit; said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two minutes. After said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions have been disinfected, they shall remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection, if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, for further disinfection.
- 8. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions shall be disinfected by fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas, as follows: said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box, and for each and every one hundred cubic feet of space therein one ounce of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.), one fluid ounce of sulphuric acid, and two fluid ounces of vater shall be used. The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in an earthenware vessel, the water poured over the said cyanide of potassium, after adding sulphuric acid, and the box to be immediately closed tightly, and allowed to remain closed for not less than forty (40) minutes. After the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions have been treated with hydrocyanic acid gas, as above directed, they shall remain in quarantine for fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection, if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.
- 9. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first point of debarkation, and if found infested with injurious insects, which have not been destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 7 and 8 of these regulations, they shall be proceeded against as may be directed.
- 10. Any person or persons having in their possession any trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees, or to other trees or plants, and who refuse or neglect to disinfect the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, seeds, buds, pits or scions, as required by Rules 7 and 8 of these regulations, after having been notified to do so by the Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector, the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits or scions shall be declared a public nuisance, and shall be proceeded against as provided by law.

Regulations for the Disinfection of Vine Cuttings imported from the Colony of South Australia.

- 1. All consignees, agents, or other persons shall, within twenty-four (24) hours, notify the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector of the arrival of any vine cuttings at the first point of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia.
- 2. All vine cuttings imported from South Australia are hereby required to be disinfected immediately upon arrival at any point where they are to be unloaded, and furthermore, if any of the said vine cuttings are found infested with insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to grapes or grape vines, or to other trees or plants, they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days, or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said vine cuttings are free from injurious insects, or their eggs, larvæ, or pupæ, before they can be offered for sale, gift, or transportation, as hereinafter provided.
- 3. All vine cuttings infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), fungi, blight, or other diseases that are known to be injurious to grapes or grape vines, or to other trees or plants, and liable to spread contagion, are hereby required to be disinfected before removal for distribution or transportation, or before being offered for sale or gift.
- 4. All vine cuttings shall be disinfected by dipping in a solution of :—
 - (a.) Sulphide of potash, in the proportion of one pound (1lb.) to twenty (20) gallons of water, the cuttings to be immersed for twenty (20) minutes.
 - (b.) A solution of one part of liver of lime to twenty parts of water, the cuttings to be immersed for ten minutes.

The dip to be used to be determined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector; after the vine cuttings have been disinfected they shall remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection, if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, for further disinfection.

- 5. All vine cuttings imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first point of debarkation, and if found infested with injurious insects, which have not been destroyed by the remedies required by Rule 4 of these regulations, they shall be proceeded against as may be directed by law.
- 6. Any person or persons having in their possession any vine cuttings infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to grapes or to grape vines, or to other trees or plants, and who refuse or neglect to disinfect the said vine cuttings as required by Rule 4 of these regulations, after having been notified to do so by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, the said vine cuttings shall be declared a public nuisance, and shall be proceeded against as provided by law.

Regulation governing the Issue of Certificates of Disinfection by Chief Inspector or Local Inspectors.

7. Blank forms for Certificates of Disinfection will be supplied to the Chief Inspector and Local Inspectors, and the fees to be charged by Inspectors for such Certificates, made out in duplicate, shall be ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) in each case, which will cover all expenses incurred in the disinfection, including material and appliances, which will be provided by the Inspectors.

Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay Opened.

The Treasury, Perth, April 4th, 1894.

III Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, closed by Gazette notice on 26th March, 1892, and numbered 3, will be opened for Pearl Shelling from the 1st of April to the 30th June, 1894.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows:—

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point,

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.

It is Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands.

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within two years from the date of
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. În every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within twelve months, by four equal quarterly instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.
