WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 25th August, 1890, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government or from the Colony, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such Officer then any other person, to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these Our Letters Patent as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others: Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct;

AND WHEREAS I, the said Governor, purpose to absent myself temporarily from the said Colony as authorised;

AND WHEREAS there is no Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony:

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony constitute and appoint His Honour

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said Colony and during such absence, to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on my behalf as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

WHEREAS the Parliament of Western Australia stands prorogued until the 6th day of June next; AND WHEREAS for divers weighty reasons it is desirable that the Legislative Assembly should be dissolved: NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., do hereby dissolve the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia from and after the 1st day of June next, and the same stands dissolved accordingly.

BY virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vic., No. 5), I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order that "Quinces" shall not be introduced into the Colony of Western Australia, and the introduction thereof is hereby prohibited. And I do further, with the like advice, authorise the destruction of any and all Quinces landed or introduced or found on board of any ship or vessel within the limits of any Port or Harbour of Western Australia, and of any package or covering in which the same may be found or be reasonably suspected to have been.

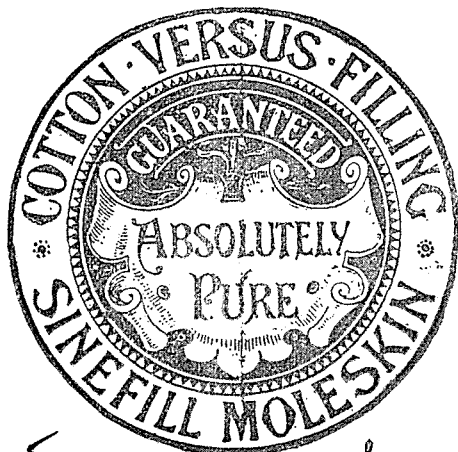

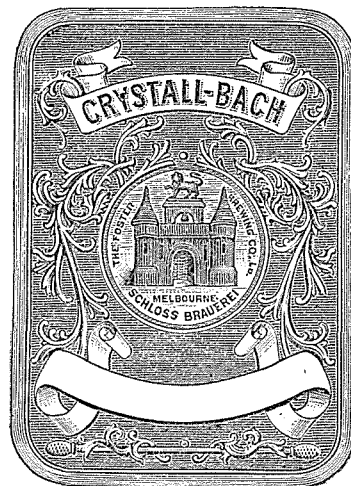

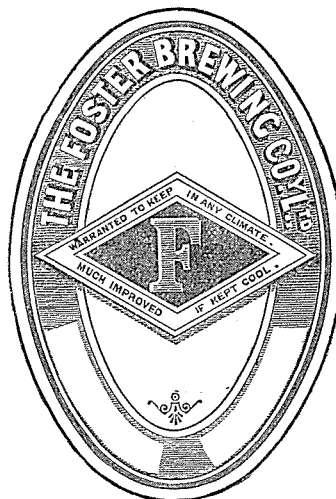
