HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly : Now THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Chief Justice of the said Colony, Governor's Deputy, in exercise of the powers so vested in the Governor, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FIRST SESSION OF THE SECOND PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF JULY INSTANT, at the hour of twelve of the clock (noon): the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality, and by the same Proclamation to define the boundaries of such Municipality : Now THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Chief Justice of the said Colony, Governor's Deputy, do hereby, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim the Town of Coolgardie to be a Munici-pality, under the style and title of "The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Coolgardie." And do also

declare and proclaim the Boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows :---

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 60 chains South and 44 chains 23 links West from Survey tree H 8, near Bayley's Reef, and extending North 23 chains 45 links, thence West 80 chains, thence South 23 chains 45 links, thence East 51 chains 33 links, thence South 12 chains, thence East 16 chains 67 links, thence North 12 chains, and finally East 12 chains to the starting point.

BY virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vict., No. 5), I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, by my Deputy, His Honour A. C. ONSLOW, Chief Justice, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the following Amendments of the Regulations, under the above cited Act, gazetted on the 11th day of May, 1894, shall come into force on the day of the date hereof.

Amended Regulations under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

5. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) grown in any foreign or other country, or any of the Australian or other colonies must, before being offered for sale, gift, or distribution, be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the first port of debarkation in the Colony, and if found infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees, or to other trees, will be prohibited from being offered for sale, gift, or distribution.

If the fruit on examination is found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees, or other trees, the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector may issue a certificate after the cases, or packing, or transportable material in which such fruit is packed have been disinfected as provided by Regulation 6, and on receipt of Ten shillings and sixpence, the fee for inspection and disinfection.

Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector will, if such fruit is found to be free from disease, issue a certificate upon payment of a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence. No. 5687.--C.S.O.

Extension of the Opening of Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay.

IS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, which were opened by *Gazette* Notice dated April 4th, 1894, from 1st April to 30th June, 1894, will be opened for a further period of three months from 1st July instant.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows :---

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.
