HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Acts: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 10th day of March, 1877, a Quarantine Station for Stock was set apart at Geraldton: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to reduce the area of such Quarantine Station: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby reduce the said Quarantine Station to the following dimensions:—Bounded on the East by the West side of Point Street; on the South, West, and North by the Sea Coast; excluding all lands sold, reserved, or otherwise leased within those boundaries.

Extension of the Opening of Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay.

Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, which were opened by *Gazette* Notice dated April 4th, 1894, from 1st April to 30th June, 1894, will be opened for a further period of three months from 1st July instant.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows:-

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.
