WHEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Acts: AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 10th day of March, 1877, a Quarantine Station for Stock was set apart at Geraldton: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to reduce the area of such Quarantine Station: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby reduce the said Quarantine Station to the following dimensions:—Bounded on the *East* by the West side of Point Street; on the *South*, *West*, and *North* by the Sea Coast; excluding all lands sold, reserved, or otherwise leased within those boundaries.

Extension of the Opening of Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act (55 Vic., No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay, which were opened by *Gazette* Notice dated April 4th, 1894, from 1st April to 30th June, 1894, will be opened for a further period of three months from 1st July instant.

The Area comprised on No. 3 is as follows:—

All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said Point.

No dredging will be allowed on any "pick-up" banks within the area, except on the edges of the shallow banks where it is impossible to pick up by hand at low tides, but permission in writing may be issued by the Inspector to use a dredge on such other portions of the area as he may approve of.

The Inspector shall have power to stop the work of collection or of dredging at any time, if in his opinion the industry is being injured.

Amendment of Clause 5 of the Regulations for the Management of Goldfields.

MINERS' RIGHTS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 79 of the Goldfields Act (50 Vict., No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clause 5 of the Regulations thereunder, so as to read as follows:—

“5. A Miner's Right in the form of Schedule No. 1 hereto annexed, to be in force for a period not exceeding ten years, will be issued to any person not being an Asiatic or African alien, upon application to the Minister or his Agent, or a Warden, on payment of the prescribed fee of One pound per annum, and any person desiring to prospect or mine for gold must first obtain such a Right. The rights and privileges conferred by a miner's right are set forth in Section 9 of the Act. Such Miner's Right issued by the Minister, Wardens of Goldfields, or any other authority, shall have full force and effect over any Crown Lands, whether inside or outside of a proclaimed Goldfield.”

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Assay of any West Australian Mineral, Rock, or Ore, for any Commercial Metal such as Gold, Silver, Lead, Copper, Tin, Iron, Zinc, Mercury, or Antimony, will be prepared by the Government Assayer for a fee of Five shillings for each Metal sought.

DIRECTIONS FOR SENDING SAMPLES.

1. Send from 3oz. to 4oz. of each sample.
 2. Do not crush the sample unless you wish to send an average from a large quantity.
 3. Wrap each sample separately in strong paper, enclosing a piece of white paper with the number of the sample and your own name.
 4. Address the parcel to “The Government Assayer, Perth.”
 5. Send a letter at the same time to the same address, stating for what metals you desire the samples to be assayed, and enclosing the fees.
 6. Always retain duplicate samples of whatever you send, marked with the same numbers, and dated.
- N.B.—The rate of postage is one penny for every 2 ounces and under.

If goods are entered for Bond, they shall be reloaded into railway trucks, and delivered to the Custom House Department, and a charge of 1s. per ton, minimum 3d. per consignment, will be made for haulage from the Receiving Warehouses to Customs Bond Stores.
