WHEREAS a certain Townsite has been duly proclaimed a Townsite, under the name and "Kalgoorlie Townsite," such Townsite style of consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto: AND WHEREAS such Townsite is included in and forms a portion of the Coolgardie Goldfield : AND WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to except from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence, or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield : Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., GOVERNOR as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such Townsite from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence, or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, such Townsite being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield, to wit, "The Coolgardie Goldfield": And I do order all persons from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the Government Gazette to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

KALGOORLIE TOWNSITE.

Bounded on the North-East and South-East by lines starting from a post situate West 29 chains 26 links and North 15 chains 4 links from a cairn on the summit of Mount Gledden, and extending

respectively 313° 30' 23 chains 60 links and 223° 30' 26 chains; and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings being true or thereabouts, the measurements more or less, and a post placed at each corner of the Townsite.

HEREAS by the provisions of "The Elemen-

W tary Education Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1893," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to constitute Educational Districts, and to define and alter the Boundaries of any District: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute the Educational Districts of-

Beverley, Broomehill, Katanning, Kojonup, Moorumbine, Narrogin, Sharks Bay, Wagin, Williams.

And with the like advice do define the Boundaries of the said Educational Districts to be as set forth in the following Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF BEVERLEY EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward by an Easterly line from Mount Dale to the South corner of Avon Location 30, thence East-North-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of Avon Locations 30 and 0 to the Avon River, then across said river and downwards along its right bank to the Northern boundary of Avon Location H 2, thence East-North-Easterly to that Location's North corner, thence to Mount Stirling, and thence due East; on the West by a line starting from Mount Dale, and extending in a South-Easterly direction to a spot 20 miles East from the 41-Mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence South-Easterly towards Cojatotine Pool, in the Hotham River; on the South by an East line passing through the South corner of Avon Location 1034 at Sunning Hill; on the East by a North line which, if produced, would pass through a spot 20 miles West from the North-West corner of Avon Location 998 at Eenuin.

BOUNDARIES OF BROOMEHILL EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an Easterly line from a post at the intersection of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256 with the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning to the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 249 (Garrity's), thence due East; on the West by part of the West boundary of Location 256, extending South from the post above mentioned on the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning to the South-West corner of Location 256 aforesaid, thence in a South-South-Easterly direction to the centre of the Gordon River at its intersection with the East boundary of Reserve 875 near the Gordon bridge; on the South by an Easterly line from the spot above mentioned on the East boundary of Reserve 875, passing through the South-West corner of Plantagenet Location 169 near Pootenup; on the South-East by a North-Easterly line passing through survey post O 11, near Kybelup Pool, in the Pallinup River, and extending onwards in the same direction towards Mount Glasse, in the Bremer Range.

BOUNDARIES OF KATANNING EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by a North line starting from a post on the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning, passing along part of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256, and through that Location's North-West corner, then by the Eastern portion of a North-Easterly line extending from the 147-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, and passing through the South-East corner of Reserve 338, near Boyerine Pool; on the North by an East line passing through the North boundary of Williams Location 71 at Woolkabunning; on the South by an Easterly line from the post before mentioned, at the intersection of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256 with the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning to the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 249 (Garrity's), thence due East; on the East by part of a North-Easterly line between Survey post O 11, near Kybelup Pool, in the Pallinup River, and Mount Glasse, in the Bremer Range.

BOUNDARIES OF KOJONUP EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the 147-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, and extending in a North-Easterly direction towards the South-East corner of Reserve 338, near Boyerine Pool to a spot due North from the NorthWest corner of Kojonup Location 256; thence South, passing through the North-West corner of Location 256 aforesaid, along that Location's West boundary to its South-West corner; thence in a South-South-Easterly direction to the centre of Gordon River at its intersection with the East boundary of Reserve 875; then by the Gordon River downwards to its junction with the Frankland River; then in a Northerly direction to a spot situate 16 miles West from the 175-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; then from spot aforesaid to the junction last-mentioned towards the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers to a spot due West from the 147-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; thence East to said 147-Mile post before-mentioned as the starting point.

BOUNDARIES OF MOORUMBINE EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the summit of Mount Dale, and extending in a South-Easterly direction to a spot 20 miles East from the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; thence South-Easterly in direction of Cojatotine Peol, to a spot due West from the South corner of Avon Location 1034, at Sunning Hill; thence due East to a spot due South from a point situate 20 miles West from the North-West corner of Avon Location 998, at Eenuin, near Lake Deborah; thence South to a spot due East from Millinggnalling Pool, in the Hotham River; thence West to said Millinggnalling Pool; thence along the right bank of the said Hotham River downwards to the Perth-Albany Road; then by the East side of the said road in a North-Westerly direction to a spot due East from the South-East corner of Reserve 334; then by a West line, passing through the South boundary of Reserve 334 aforesaid; then by the Northern end of a North-Westerly line from the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers to the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; then from said 41-Mile post along the West side of said road to a spot near the old 33-Mile tree, said spot being situate due East from the South boundary of Rockingham Townsite; then from said spot near the 33-Mile tree on the Perth-Albany Road to the starting point on the summit of Mount Dale.

BOUNDARIES OF NARROGIN EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Hotham River upwards from the North-East corner of Reserve 907 near the York Road Crossing to Millinggnalling Pool, then by an Easterly line to Mount Glasse, in the Bremer Range; on the West by a South-South-Easterly line from the North-East corner of Reserve 907 aforesaid, passing through the South-West corner of Williams Location 263 (McAullay's); on the South by part of an East-North-Easterly line from the South-West corner of Williams Location 126 at Tarwonga to survey post Q6 near Bungon Pool, in the Arthur River, from said post due East; on the East by the Northern portion of a South-Westerly line from Mount Glasse towards survey post O 11 near Kybelup Pool, in the Pallinup River.

BOUNDARIES OF SHARKS BAY EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the 25° 30' parallel of South Latitude; on the East by a North and South line, which if produced would pass through Trigonometrical Station (X39)on the North side of the Gascoyne River at the Southern end of the Kennedy Range, such Trigonometrical Station being situate about 10 miles West from the junction of the Gascoyne and Lyons Rivers; on the South by an East line from the Sea-coast, in the direction of Mount Murchison on the Murchison River; on the West by the Sea-coast, including the islands adjacent.

BOUNDARIES OF WAGIN EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the 147-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, and extending in a North-Easterly direction through the South-East corner of Reserve 338, near Boyerine Pool to a spot due West from the North boundary of Williams Location 71, at Woolkabunning; then from spot aforesaid due East to a line from survey post O 11 near Kybelup Pool, in the Pallinup River, to Mount Glasse, in the Bremer Range, then along line last mentioned to a spot due East from survey post Q6, near Bungon Pool, in the Arthur River; thence West to said post Q6, thence in a West-South-Westerly direction through the South-West corner of Williams Location 126, at Tarwonga, to a line from the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers to the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers, then along said line to a spot due West from the 147-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, then from spot last mentioned to the 147-Mile post previously referred to as the starting point.

BOUNDARIES OF WILLIAMS EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the East side of the Porth-Albany Road at a point due East from the South-East corner of Reserve 334, and extending along said side of said road to Hotham River, and along it upwards to the North-East corner of Reserve 907, near the York Road Crossing, thence South-South-East through the South-West corner of Williams Location 263 (McAullay's) to a line from survey post \bigcirc 6 near Bungon Pool, in the Arthur River, through the South-West corner of Williams Location 126 at Tarwonga; then by the Western end of said line and its prolongation in a West-South-Westerly direction to a line from the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers to the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers to the junction of the South-North-Westerly in direction of the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road to a point due West from the South-West corner of said Reserve 334; thence East to starting point.

Establishing Wardens' Courts on Murchison and Coolgardie Goldfields, and abolishing Warden's Court at The Island, Murchison Goldfield.

W. C. F. ROBINSON. (L. S.) By His Excellency SIE WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the thirtyfirst section of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine all actions, suits, claims, demands, disputes, and questions which may arise in relation to mining : AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that several such Courts should be established on the Murchison Goldfield and the Coolgardie Goldfield : Now THERE-FORE I, SIE WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Yalgoo for and in respect of the Murchison Goldfield, and at Kalgoorlie, Kurnalpie, and Goongarrie for and in respect of the Coolgardie Goldfield; such Courts to be presided over and holden by the Resident Wardens of the said respective Goldfields, or, in their absence, by the Acting Wardens thereof.

And I do further, with the like advice, abolish the Warden's Court at the Island (Lake Austin), Murchison Goldfield, established by Proclamation dated the 1st day of August, 1893, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd *idem*.

INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT CONVENTION-GREAT BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.

SIR,-

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and Austria Hungary for the Establishment of International Copyright, which was signed at Vienna on the 24th April, 1893, and of which the ratifications were exchanged on the 14th April, 1894.

I have also to enclose a copy of the Order of Her Majesty in Council, which was issued on the 30th April last for giving effect to the provisions of the Convention.

I have to draw your attention to Article IX. of the Convention, from which you will observe that if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the Colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given by Her Majesty's Representative at the Court of Vienna within two years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

I shall be glad to be informed at an early date whether your Government would wish the Convention and Order in Council to be applied to the Colony under your Government.

WHEREAS a Convention has been concluded on the 24th day of April, 1893, between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, and Apostolic King of Hungary, with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works:

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the 14th day of April, 1894, between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the Emperor :

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy have made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the Authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order and it is hereby ordered as follows .—

1. The Convention as set forth in the First Schedule to this Order shall as from the commencement of this Order and subject to Clause 5 of this Order have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions, and all persons are enjoined to observe the same.

2. The author of a literary or artistic work which on or after the commencement of this Order is first produced in the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy shall, subject as in this Order and in the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, mentioned, have as respects that work throughout Her Majesty's dominions, but subject to the exceptions specified in clause 5 of this Order, the same right of copyright, including any right capable of being conferred by an Order in Council under section two or section five of the International Copyright Act, 1844, or under any other enactment, as if the work had been first produced in the United Kingdom, and shall have such right during the same period.

Provided that the Author of a literary or artistic work shall not have any greater right or longer term of copyright therein than that which he enjoys in the country in which the work is first produced.

The author of any literary or artistic work first produced before the commencement of this Order shall have the rights and remedies to which he is entitled under section six of the International Copyright Act, 1886.

3. Section six of the International Copyright Act, 1852, shall not apply to any dramatic piece to which protection is extended by virtue of this Order.

4. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the International Copyright Act, 1886.

5. This Order shall apply to all the Colonies and Foreign Possessions of Her Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to :---

Provided, nevertheless, that the provisions of this Order may be applied by further Order to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to the effect indicated in Article 9 of the Convention shall be given.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of May, 1894, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT.

Signed at Vienna, April 24, 1893.

[Ratifications exchanged at Vienna, April 14, 1894.]

[A Hungarian version was also attached to the Convention as signed.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of Indua, &c., and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, animated with the desire to secure in the most complete manner, within their respective dominions, the rights of authors, or their legal representatives, over their literary or artistic works, have resolved to conclude a Convention to that effect, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., the Right Honourable Sir Augustus Berkeley Paget, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, &c., &c., &c.

His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, the Count Gustave Kálnoky de Köröspatak, Knight of the Golden Fleece, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of St. Stephen, Knight of the Order of Leopold, His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty's Privy Councillor and Chamberlain, Minister of the Imperial House and of Foreign Affairs, General of Cavalry, &c., &c., ;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles :--

ARTICLE I.

Authors of literary or artistic works and their legal representatives, including publishers, shall enjoy reciprocally, in the dominions of the High Contracting Parties, the advantages which are, or may be, granted by law there for the protection of works of literature or art.

Consequently, authors of literary or artistic works which have been first published in the dominions of one of the High Contracting Parties, as well as their legal representatives, shall have in the dominions of the other High Contracting Party the same protection and the same legal remedy against all infringement of their rights as if the work had been first published in the country where the infringement may have taken place place

In the same manner, the authors of literary or artistic works, and their legal representatives, who are subjects of one of the High Con-tracting Parties, or who reside within its dominions, shall, in the dominions of the other Contracting Party, enjoy the same protection and the same legal remedies against all infringements of their rights as though they were subjects of, or residents in the State in which the infringement may have taken place.

These advantages shall only be reciprocally guaranteed to authors and their legal representatives when the work in question is also protected by the laws of the State where the work was first published, and the duration of protection in the other country shall not exceed that which is granted to authors and their legal representatives in the country where the work was first published.

ARTICLE II.

The right of translation forming part of the copyright, the pro-tection of the right of translation is assured under the conditions hid down by this Convention. If ten years after the expiry of the year in which a work to be protected in Her Majesty's dominions on the basis of this Convention has appeared, no translation in English has been published the right of translating the work into English shall no longer within those dominions exclusively belong to the author.

In the case of a book published in numbers, the aforesaid period of ten years shall commence at the end of the year in which each number is published.

ARTICLE III.

Authorised translations are protected as original works. They con-sequently enjoy the full protection granted by this Convention against the unauthorised reproduction of original works.

It is understood that in the case of a work for which the translating right has fallen into the public domain, the translator cannot oppose the translation of the same work by other writers.

ARTICLE IV.

The expression "literary or artistic works" comprehends books, pamphlets, and all other writings; dramatic or dramatico-musical works, musical compositions, with or without words; works of design, painting, sculpture, and engraving, lithographs, illustrations, geo-graphical charts, plans, sketches, and plastic works relating to geography, topography, architecture, or science, in genoral; in fact, every production whatsoever in the literary, scientific, or artistic domain which can be published by any mode of impression or reproduction.

ARTICLE V.

In the British Empire, and in the Kingdoms and States represented in the Austrian Reichsrath, the enjoyment of the rights secured by the present Convention is subject only to the accomplishment of the con-ditions and formalities prescribed by the law of that State in which the work is first published; and no further formalities or conditions shall be required in the other country.

Consequently, it shall not be necessary that a work which has obtained legal protection in one country should be registered, or copies thereof deposited in the other country, in order that the remedies against infringment may be obtained which are granted in the other country to works first published there.

In the dominions of the Hungarian Crown the enjoyment of these rights is subject, however, to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the Laws and Regulations both of Great Britain and of Hungary.

ARTICLE VI.

In order that the authors of works protected by the present Conven-tion shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be considered as such, and be, consequently, admitted to institute proceedings in respect of the infringement of copyright before the Courts of the other State, it will suffice that their name be indicated on the work in the accustomed manner.

The Tribunals may, however, in cases of doubt, require the production of such further evidence as may be required by the Laws of the respective countries.

For anonymous or pseudonymous works, the publisher whose name is indicated on the work is entitled to protect the rights belonging to the author. He is, without other proof, reputed the legal representative of the anonymous or pseudonymous author, until the latter, or his legal representative, has declared and proved his rights.

ARTICLE VII.

The provisions of the present Convention cannot in any way derogate from the right of each of the High Contracting Parties to control, or to prohibit by measures of domestic legislation or police, the circula-tion, representation, exhibition, or sale of any work or production.

Each of the High Contracting Parties reserves also its right to prohibit the importation into its own territory of works which, accord-ing to its internal Laws, or to the stipulations of Treaties with other States, are or may be declared to be illicit reproductions.

ARTICLE VIII.

The provisions of the present Convention shall be applied to litera-ture or artistic works produced prior to the date of its coming into effect, subject, however, to the limitations prescribed by the following Regulations:-

(a.) In the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy-

Copies completed before the coming into force of the present Con-vention, the production of which has been hitherto allowed, can also be circulated in future.

In the same manner, appliances for the reproduction of works, such as stereotypes, wood-blocks, and engraved plates of every description, such as lithographers' stones, if their production has not hitherto been prohibited, may continue to be used during a period of four years from the coming into force of the present Convention.

The distribution of such copies, and the use of the said appliances, is, however, only permitted if an inventory of the said copies and appliances is taken by the Government in question, in consequence of an application of the interested party, within three months from the coming into force of the present Convention, and if these copies and appliances are marked with a special stamp. Dramatic and dramatico-musical works, or musical compositions, legally performed before the coming into force of the present Conven-tion, can also be performed in the future. (b.) In the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland— The author and unbilisher of any literary or artistic work first

(b.) In the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland-The author and publisher of any literary or artistic work first produced before the date at which this Convention comes into effect, shall be entitled to all legal remedies against infringement; provided that where any person has, before the date of the publication of the Order in Council putting this Convention into effect, lawfully produced any work in the United Kingdom, any rights or interests arising from, or in connection with such production, which are subsisting and valuable at the said date, shall not be diminished or prejudiced.

ARTICLE IX.

The provisions of the present Convention shall apply to all the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India, India, The Dominion of Canada. Newfoundland. The Cape. Natal. New South Wales. New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia, New Zealand,

Provided always that the provisions of the present Conventions shall apply to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at the Court of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE X.

The present Convention shall remain in force for ten years from the day on which the ratifications are exchanged; and in case neither of the two High Contracting Parties shall have given notice twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of their intention of terminating the present Convention it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Con-tracting Parties shall have given such notice.

Her Britannic Majesty's Government shall also have the right to denounce the Convention in the same manner, on behalf of any of the Colonies or foreign possessions mentioned in Article IX., separately.

ARTICLE XI.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Vienna as soon as possible. It shall come into effect ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the Laws of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed this Convention, and have hereunto affixed their seals.

Done at Vienna, the 24th day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

That Sub-section (4.) read as follows :----

The applicant shall, previously to making application for a lease, mark the land intended to be applied for, at each corner, by a post standing three feet out of the ground, and four inches in diameter, such post to be kept uncovered, and set in L trenches three feet long and six inches deep along each boundary line; and shall at the same time post a notice in the form of No. 20A, hereto annexed, on a conspicuous part of the land intended to be applied for; and shall, at the time of lodging his application at the Warden's Office, post a notice thereat in the form of Schedule 20. 
