BY-LAWS OF THE VICTORIA PARK ROADS BOARD.

The Victoria Park Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-Laws:

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1888," and "The Amendment Act, 1889," the Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the District of Victoria Park, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-Laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

CHAPTER I.

Interpretation.

1. In these By-Laws the following terms shall, unless 1. In these By-Laws the following terms snail, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively; that is to say:—"District," the Victoria Park Roads Board District; "Board," the Board of the said District; "Chairman," the member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board; "Member," a member of the Board; "Secretary," the Secretary of the Board; "The Act," "The Roads Act, 1888"; "Meeting," a meeting of the Board; "Road or Reserve," a public road or reserve as the case may be under the control of the Board. reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

CHAPTER II.

The Board.

2. The Board shall consist of seven members, elected by the ratepayers, as laid down in the Act. (See Secs. 43, 44,

Vacancies.

- 3. If any member be absent without leave from three consecutive ordinary meetings, his seat shall be declared vacant. (Vide Sec. 44.)
- 4. The Board shall commence business so soon after the time appointed as there is a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum.
- 5. Three members shall be a quorum for the transaction of business. (52 Vic. No. 22.)
- 6. If after thirty minutes of the time appointed for the meeting there be no quorum, the meeting shall stand adjourned.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

Meetings.

- 7. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members of the Board to exclude the public, when in their opinion it is expedient to do so; providing the business before the Board warrants such action being
- 8. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the Office of the Board on the last Wednesday in each month.
- 9. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the 9th section of the Act; but the Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, that no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called. (Vic. 52, 16, Sec. 9.)
- 10. The Board shall hold a general meeting of the ratepayers upon the requisition of any seven or more ratepayers.
- 11. Public notice of each such general meeting shall previously be given.

Notice of Meetings.

12. Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least three days before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days.

- 13. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside (Act sec. 11).
- 14. The Chairman shall preserve order at all meetings, and his decision, subject to the provisions of the following rule (No. 21) of these By-laws, shall be final and binding upon every member.

Voting.

15. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote; and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Proceedings.

16. (a.) In addition to the Minute Book prescribed to be kept by the 10th section of the Act, a Rough Minute Book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by

the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act, in the Minute Book.

(b.) Before reading the minutes at a meeting the Secretary shall hand the rough minute-book to the Chairman, in order that while the minutes are being read he may verify the record before signing the same on confirmation of the Board.

(c.) Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary subsequent meeting.

(d.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Order of Business.

- 17. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:-
 - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, and of special meetings, if any.
 - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes. (c.) Reading of correspondence (in or out) and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.

(d.) Passing of accounts for payment.

- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f.) Consideration of tenders, and ratification of contracts.

Petitions.

A petition shall be presented only by a member who makes himself responsible for the respectful nature of its language, and, so far as possible, acquaints himself before presentation with the subject to which it refers.

Call to Order.

- 19. It shall be competent for any member to rise to order, on which the member speaking must at once resume his seat and remain silent until the point of order has been succinctly, but briefly, stated by the member who has risen.
- 20. The Chairman must thereupon decide the point of order or practice, and, if required, cite the rule applicable to the case without argument or comment.
- 21. It is then competent for any member, not being the member interrupted by the member who rose to order, to demand that the sense of the Board be taken on the point, when the decision of the majority shall prevail, and be final and binding on every member.

Speaker must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

23. (a.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by the consent of the Board.

- (b.) One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.
- (c.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- (d.) In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Amendment becomes a Substantive Motion.

(c.) When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Appointment of Committee.

- 24. The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon; but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the by-laws or by a resolution of the Board.
- 25. The quorum of a committee of three shall comprise two members.

Finance Accounts.

- 26. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.
- 27. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received, from whatever source, shall be paid into such Bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, together with the signature of the Secretary.
- 28. All moneys shall, within seven days after they have come into the hands of the Board or of any officers, servants, or clerks for the use of the Board, be paid into such Bank.

Audit of Accounts.

- 29. Two Auditors shall be appointed, one of whom shall be a Resident Magistrate of the district, or a person appointed by him; the other shall be elected by the rate-payers at the annual general meeting. Should the rate-payers neglect or refuse to appoint their Auditor, or the Auditor fail or refuse to act, the appointment shall be made by the Resident Magistrate. (Sec. 101.)
- 30. In the event of the Auditor appointed by the rate-payers refusing or failing to act, the Board shall then appoint a person in his place.
- 31. The accounts shall be balanced annually up to the 31st December in each year; and after such balancing the auditor shall audit the said accounts as provided by Section 103.

Urgent Work.

32. The Chairman, with one member, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, but shall, in every case, report the same at the next following meeting of the Board.

$Unauthorised\ Expenditure.$

33. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these by-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

Appointments.

34. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

Bonds.

35. Every officer whose duty it is to receive or have the custody of moneys, the property of the Board, may be required to furnish a fidelity bond to such amount as may be prescribed by the Board.

Custody of Records, &c.

36. The Secretary shall have the custody of all contracts, books, and records of the Board or relating to the property thereof, and the same shall be kept by him in such place as the Board may direct from time to time.

Free Use of Roads.

37. The free use of the roads in the district shall not be in any manner obstructed except as hereinafter provided. Any person obstructing the free use shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Unlawful Acts.

38. A person who commits within the district any of the following acts, that is to say :-

Removing Timber.

(a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road.

Erecting Structures.

(b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon.

Depositing Earth, &c.

(c.) Deposits, without the consent as aforesaid, earth, stone, timber, or other material or rubbish upon a road.

Crossing Water-Tables, &c.

- (d.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed pipe approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle.
- (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road.

Driving without Lights.

(f.) Drives without lights a vehicle upon a public road after the hour of sunset and before sunrise.

Nuisances.

- (g.) "Abattoirs" or "Slaughter-house" shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called abattoirs, or slaughter-houses, and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.
- (h.) "Piggeries" shall mean and include the buildings and place commonly called piggeries, and any building or place used for an enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs kept for profit.
- (i.) Any person who establishes or newly carries on within the district of the Board, without their consent in writing, any of the undermentioned trades, businesses, or occupations (viz., that is to say):

Manure Works.
Works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal.

Bone Mills or Bone Manure Depôts. Fellmongeries, Tanneries, or Wool-Scouring

Establishments.

Glue Factories.

- Piggeries. Soap or Candle Works or Factories. Fish-curing Establishments.
- (j.) Places for storing, drying, or preserving of bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, or any other noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufacture, or who without such consent assists or extends any building or premises used for the purpose of such trade, business, or manufacture, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds in respect of the establishment or extension thereof, and shall also be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Forty shillings, for every day during which such trade, business, or manufacture is carried on.
- (k.) Provided that prior to the granting of any such consent, notice of intention to apply for the same shall be given by advertisement one month previously in two of the newspapers circulating in the district, and that if any person, whether a resident in the district of such Board or not, object to the establishment of such business he may state such objections to the Board.
- (l.) No person shall keep, or cause to be kept, any swine or pigsty within one hundred feet of any house, neither establish a piggery, as defined in the interpretation, within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any persons, or injurious to the public health.
- (m.) Deposits or easts upon a road or public place the carcase of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter.
- (n.) Causes or permits the drainage from a sewer, slaughterhouse, closet, or stable to discharge on any road or public place, or injures or pollutes any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-Laws, and be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

Licenses.

 $39.\,$ All licenses for carriages or carts, &c., shall be payable to the Officer appointed by the Board, on the 1st of January in each year, in advance, as prescribed by Act 40 Vic.,

That Sub-section (4.) read as follows:—

The applicant shall, previously to making application for a lease, mark the land intended to be applied for, at each corner, by a post standing three feet out of the ground, and four inches in diameter, such post to be kept uncovered, and set in L trenches three feet long and six inches deep along each boundary line; and shall at the same time post a notice in the form of No. 20a, hereto annexed, on a conspicuous part of the land intended to be applied for; and shall, at the time of lodging his application at the Warden's Office, post a notice thereat in the form of Schedule 20. Applications for leases shall be heard by the Warden not less than thirty days after the date of lodging of the application at the Warden's Office.

- 1. No cab, carriage, cart, trolly, or other wheeled vehicle will be allowed to enter upon the Railway premises, for the purpose of plying for hire, unless the person in charge thereof has been licensed for that purpose by the Commissioner.
- 2. Application for Licenses must be made to the Commissioner (in the form in the Schedule hereto), and forwarded through the Station Master or other official in charge of the place for which the License is required.
- 3. Applicants for License must forward with the application certificates of character from at least two persons of repute, and also (if required) a certificate of age.
- 4. Before the issue of any License, the applicant will be required to deposit with the Station Master, or other official in charge of the place for which the License is required, a sum of 10s.; which sum will

- be forfeited to the Commissioner in case the holder of the License should fail, neglect, or refuse to deliver up his badge to the Commissioner or any of his servants, whenever lawfully required so to do.
- 5. Should the holder of a License be convicted of a breach of any of the Railway By-laws, his License will be liable to be cancelled.
- 6. The holder of a License shall not solicit custom or hire, or in any way interfere with or obstruct any passenger or railway servant, upon any railway premises or any approach thereto. (Vide By-law 21.)
- 7. Upon the issue of a License (see Schedule B) the holder thereof will be provided with a badge (see design), showing the number of his License; which badge shall be worn by the holder at all times whenever engaged or seeking engagement as a carrier of passengers or goods upon any railway premises.
- 8. The holder of a License shall produce his badge, and allow the number thereof to be taken, whenever required by the Commissioner or any of his servants, or by any person by whom he may be engaged or employed.
- 9. Any holder of a License who may be proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner to have been guilty of any disorderly conduct, or of making use of any threatening, abusive, insulting, obscene, indecent, or offensive words, or to have been guilty of any like behaviour upon any railway premises, and whether towards any person or not, will be liable to have his License cancelled.
- 10. The Commissioner may, without giving any reason, cancel any License issued by him under these Regulations.
