WHEREAS a certain Townsite has been duly proclaimed a Townsite, under the name and style of "Kanowna," such Townsite consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto; AND WHEREAS such Townsite is included in and forms a portion of the East Coolgardie Goldfield; AND WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to except from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such Townsite from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, such Townsite being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield, to wit, "The East Coolgardie Goldfield." And I do order all persons, from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the 43rd year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 23, intituled "An Act for the Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is empowered, by Proclamation, to prohibit the Importation of Stock, and to make Regulations for regulating the conditions upon which Stock may be introduced into the Colony: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor aforesaid, in exercise of the powers possessed by me under the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby make the following further Regulations for governing the Importation of Stock into Western Australia:—

1. It shall not be lawful to land camels imported from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies, at any West Australian port other than Fremantle, Albany, and Champion Bay.

2. All camels from elsewhere than the Australasian Colonies shall be landed under the supervision of an Inspector of Stock, and shall forthwith be removed by the owner or consignee to such land as the Inspector shall direct, there to be kept in quarantine, and dressed and treated as the Inspector shall order.

3. The period of quarantine of such camels shall be thirty days, but an Inspector of Stock may order any camel to be further detained in quarantine and treated which, at the expiration of the thirty days of quarantine, is not in his opinion free from all disease, for such further period as such Inspector may deem necessary to effect its cure.

4. All stock from the Australasian Colonies entering the Colony of Western Australia, whether by land or sea, must be accompanied by a statutory declaration by the owner or station manager that such stock are, at the time of departure from their station, and have been for the three months immediately preceding, free from disease and have not for such period been in contact with diseased animals, and a certificate of a duly qualified Government Inspector that they are free from disease.

5. Any owner intending to introduce any cattle by land into Western Australia shall give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector of Stock in the district into which they are to be introduced, in the form in Schedule A hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such cattle; and shall produce a certificate of a duly qualified Government Inspector that such cattle have been successfully inoculated immediately prior to their departure for Western Australia.

6. The crossing place for cattle in the Kimberley District, *via* South Australia, shall be at the Ord Station.

7. No cattle adjudged by an Inspector to be diseased shall cross the Border into Western Australia; and any person so introducing such diseased cattle shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

THE AUDIT ACT, 1891.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the following amendments in the Regulations respecting the Public Accounts of the Colony, framed in pursuance of Section 8 of "The Audit Act, 1891," shall come into operation from and after this date:—

Regulations 43 to 45, inclusive, are hereby cancelled, and the following new Regulations shall be substituted in lieu thereof, and stand as numbers 43, 44, and 45 respectively:—

43. All Government Stores, of any nature whatsoever, shall be under the sole charge of the Government Storekeeper, subject to the stock-taking and audit required by Section 28 of the Audit Act, and to such regulations and instructions as may be made and issued by the Honourable the Colonial Treasurer from time to time.
44. All indents and requisitions for Stores to be purchased from England or elsewhere, or in the Colony, shall be forwarded (in *triplicate*, if so required) by Heads of Departments direct to the Government Storekeeper, who, after checking them as provided for in the Regulations published for his guidance, shall submit them for the approval of the Colonial Treasurer. Bills of Lading and other documents received from time to time by the Colonial Treasurer from London or elsewhere will be forwarded to the Government Storekeeper, who will be held responsible for making the necessary arrangements for clearing from the ships and receiving into Store all such Stores on their being landed or delivered, and the said Government Storekeeper shall cause to be kept all books which the Colonial Treasurer may consider necessary for checking the receipts into and issues from the Stores.
45. All goods which are purchased in England or elsewhere, or in the Colony, and received by the said Government Storekeeper into Store, shall be treated in the books of the Treasury as an asset until issued to Departments for consumption, and shall, together with all expenses connected therewith, be charged to the undermentioned personal accounts:—

Railway Stores Account,

General Stores Account,

Stationery Stores Account,

or to such other or additional personal accounts as may from time to time appear to the Honourable the Colonial Treasurer necessary or desirable to be established or opened. Claims for all issues from the Stores shall be rendered at least once a quarter by the said Government Storekeeper to Heads of Departments for schedule in the usual manner, and after credit for the same has been given in the proper account, the Government Storekeeper will be held responsible for the amounts standing to the debit of the above-mentioned accounts in the books of the Treasury.

THE AGRICULTURAL BANK ACT, 1894.

Regulations.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that pursuant to the provisions of the 30th Section of "The Agricultural Bank Act, 1894," His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

1. Applications for advances shall be made in writing, addressed to "The Manager of the Agricultural Bank, at Perth," and in the form hereinafter prescribed, or as near thereto as circumstances permit.

2. The applicant must state his name in full, give his age, address, and occupation.

3. The nature of the title to the land which it is proposed to offer as security for the advance must be clearly stated, and a list of the deeds or other documents affecting the title be given in detail.

4. No advance will be made upon any land which is otherwise encumbered, nor will any security, other than a first mortgage over fee simple lands, be accepted as sufficient. When the proposed security consists of lands held under S.O.L. or Conditional Purchase, the applicant will be required to execute an absolute transfer of all his right, title, and interest in the land, together with all improvements thereon, to the Manager of the Bank; and when the security consists of land held under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893," the applicant will be required to transfer his interest to the Crown.

5. The applicant will also be required to furnish a statement showing what improvements, if any, have been effected on the land proposed as security, and also the nature, extent, and cost of the improvements proposed to be made, giving the nature and cost as near as possible of each class of improvement.

6. In all cases the applicant should state what he estimates the fair value of the land, without improvements.

7. The applicant may be required to furnish, at his own expense, a certificate or statutory declaration by some person approved by the Manager, as to the nature, extent, and value of any improvements.

8. Not more than one-half of the fair estimated value of improvements proposed to be made will be advanced, nor will more than £400 be advanced to any one person or on any one security.

9. Interest at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged upon all advances, and must be paid half-yearly, on the 30th June and 31st December in each year.

10. Advances made for the purpose of effecting improvements will only be paid proportionately, as the improvements are effected.

11. The Manager may refuse to make any further advance in any case where, in his opinion, the amount already advanced has not been carefully and economically expended, or has been applied to purposes other than those for which the advance was approved, and in any such case may call in immediately whatever sum has been advanced.

12. All applications must be accompanied by a valuator's fee equivalent to One per cent. of the amount applied for, and, in the event of the advance being approved, the applicant will be required to forward the stamp duty and registration fees to the Manager before any advance whatever will be made. No charge will be made for drawing or preparing any mortgage or transfer.

13. Interest will be charged upon the actual amount of the advance or advances made as and from the date of such advance or advances being made.

14. In all cases where an application for an advance is approved of, a notification thereof, in the form in the Schedule B hereunder, will be sent immediately to the applicant.

15. Should an applicant fail to furnish and complete his security within one month of the date of the notice of the advance being approved having been posted to him, the application will be deemed to have lapsed, and the approval will be cancelled.

16. Should an extension of time for the completion of the security be required, written application should be made therefor to the Manager.

17. All applications must be for one or more of the following sums, viz., £50, £75, or £100.

REGULATIONS

For the purchase, control, and issue of Government Stores.

PURCHASE OF STORES.

1. All Stores required for the Public Service of the Colony shall be procured by the Government Storekeeper, except in case of departments having special powers and regulations now in force, or hereafter to be promulgated, to purchase or indent for themselves.

2. Not later than the 31st of December in each year, heads of departments shall furnish the Government Storekeeper with a detailed statement of all Supplies required, under local contract, during the financial year commencing 1st July following. These estimates will be classified by the Government Storekeeper, in accordance with the various descriptions of supply, and submitted for the approval of the Colonial Treasurer before tenders are invited.

3. Indents for Stores required from the Agent-General, or otherwise from outside the Colony, shall be prepared in triplicate by the heads of the various departments and forwarded to the Government Storekeeper, who will retain a copy thereof before forwarding the indents to the Treasury for transmission to the Agent-General or ordering the goods from outside the Colony.

4. Supplies shall be purchased under contract whenever practicable and advantageous, tenders being invited in the *Government Gazette* and other publications, whenever desirable.

5. All purchases of Stores within the Colony for stock shall be made by the Government Storekeeper.

6. Stores, including rations, provisions, light and fire-wood, for immigrants, paupers, lunatics, etc., for which contracts have been, or may be, entered into by the Government Storekeeper, will be supplied direct to the several establishments by the contractor on the order of the officer in charge of the establishment, and monthly accounts for such Stores must be certified and passed for payment by the same officer, after comparison with the contract rates (*vide* Regulation 7).

7. The Government Storekeeper shall, on application, furnish each department with a copy of the particulars of any contract especially affecting the department; and every officer will be expected to make himself familiar with such in the event of receiving Supplies direct from the contractor. In the case of improper or inferior supplies, the department shall at once report the matter to the Government Storekeeper.

8. No purchase order is to be given by the Government Storekeeper for contract or other Stores for stock without the approval — on form H — of the Colonial Treasurer. Should, however, articles be demanded for immediate use that are not in stock, and the "Departmental Authority" number is properly quoted on the Store Order, the goods can be purchased on that authority. Purchases are not to be made so long as there is anything in the Store adaptable to the service for which requisition is made.

9. No goods purchased from local contractors or otherwise shall be received into Store unless accompanied by a priced invoice (invoice forms obtainable from Government Storekeeper) and delivery note, both of which shall have the number of the purchase order under which the goods were supplied, quoted thereon.

10. Monthly accounts for goods delivered to the Government Stores shall be made out and rendered by the contractor or supplier (contract lines being kept separate from those not under contract) on proper forms, which will be supplied by the Government Storekeeper on application. These accounts must be rendered by the 22nd of every month, and shall include all deliveries of goods to date, together with the number of the purchase order upon which they were supplied; they will then be scheduled by the Government Storekeeper for payment, who, if the Stores were purchased under contract, shall certify that such are in accordance with contract, or, if not purchased under contract, that the price charged is fair and reasonable.

ISSUE OF STORES.

11. Stores are to be issued only on a written Store Order bearing the approval of the head of the department concerned (excepting the Railway and Works Department, in which case the head of the branch department will approve) or of some person duly appointed by him. All Store Orders are to be made chargeable to the proper Head of Service, Item Number (per Estimates), and Departmental Authority, the number of which is to be quoted, otherwise the Stores will not be issued. The officer who receives the Stores for use or custody must in all cases sign the receipts, date his signature, and immediately return the vouchers to the Government Storekeeper.

12. Telegraphic or telephonic communications requesting the issue of stores will only be complied with under the most exceptional circumstances, and then only on the strict understanding that these irregular demands are immediately followed up by the transmission of a proper Store Order, as required by Regulation 11.

13. Heads of Departments are expressly enjoined to send in their Store Orders for Stationery Stores on or before the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October respectively, for the ensuing quarter. General Stores and Railway and Public Works Stores may be ordered, as needed from time to time. Each class of Stores, viz., Stationery, General, and Railway Stores, should be presented on separate "Store Orders," and should in all cases be correctly described.

14. No stores shall be lent, exchanged with, or sold to any department or private persons, except with the approval of the Colonial Treasurer. Private sales shall only be made at an advance of 20 per cent. on the cost to the Government Stores Department, and by settlement of account at the time of delivery of stores.

15. Every consignment of stores or stationery shall be accompanied by a priced invoice and advice, and on no account shall the figures of weight, quantity, or prices be altered; but the officer receiving the supplies may make a remark indicating where an error is apparent, at the time he affixes his signature.

16. The Government Storekeeper shall, on or before the last day of each month, render accounts to heads of departments for all General and Railways and Works Stores supplied during the current month. Accounts for transport for the above supply will be rendered in like manner. Accounts for stationery and transport thereon will be rendered quarterly.

17. Upon receipt of any account from the Government Storekeeper, monthly or otherwise, the department concerned shall immediately acknowledge the same to the Government Storekeeper, and in due course schedule the values against the various Votes to which they are chargeable, and forward the same to the Treasury for payment. Officers are requested not to alter the figures or Votes quoted on the monthly statement of accounts or vouchers attached thereto. If any corrections appear necessary, the documents should be returned to the Government Storekeeper, with an explanatory memo. attached.

CONTROL AND INSPECTION OF STORES.

18. The custody, control, and issue of all Stores shall be vested in the Government Storekeeper; and in all matters relating thereto he shall be directly responsible to the Colonial Treasurer, from whom he will receive such instructions as from time to time may be necessary.

19. Every officer in the Government Stores Department shall keep a clear and exact account of all articles which may be specially placed in his charge. He shall attend to the proper preservation of the Stores on hand, and maintain, by frequent report to the head of his department, the necessary supplies of articles in constant demand. All articles in Store shall be kept easily accessible for observation, and frequently inspected in detail. The contents of closed packages or cases should at all times be correctly noted, in legible characters, on a label securely attached to the case itself.

20. The Government Storekeeper or officer immediately in charge shall from time to time inspect all Stores, and satisfy himself that due order and regularity is maintained by all connected with the department.

21. Heads of departments shall from time to time forward, through their responsible Minister, to the Government Storekeeper, a list in triplicate of any surplus or unserviceable Stores in their charge, so that the Government Storekeeper may ascertain whether such Stores can be used by any other department.

22. Unserviceable Stores on hand should be examined annually, or oftener if required, and authority obtained from the Colonial Treasurer for the disposal of such by public auction or otherwise, as he may direct.

23. Suitable precautions against loss by fire shall be continually taken, both by way of prevention and insurance.

STORES RETURNED, AND DEPRECIATION.

24. Stores returned from other departments will only be received and checked on receipt of a proper advice of details, &c.

25. The credit value of all Stores returned from works shall be submitted by the Government Storekeeper, for the consent of the head of the department accepting credit. Any difference of opinion as to such value shall be referred to the Colonial Treasurer for final decision.

26. Depreciation in the value of Stores hereafter obtained for special works, shall be debited to the cost of such works.

TRANSPORT OF STORES TO DEPARTMENTS.

27. The transport of Supplies placed in requisition upon the Government Storekeeper shall be undertaken by him

or contracted for under his orders, and all Supplies shall be delivered at the place mentioned upon the face of the Store Order.

28. In case of the non-arrival of the Supplies within seven days after receipt of the invoice by post, the department shall communicate with the Government Storekeeper at once, in order that the necessary steps may be taken.

29. Any officer to whom Supplies are consigned by the Government Storekeeper, shall, on no account, refuse to receive them; and he is in all cases to take care that they are properly protected from loss or damage of every kind. If he be unable to properly store them, he shall immediately report (by telegraph, if necessary) the circumstance, through the head of his department, to the Government Storekeeper.

GENERAL.

30. All Supplies imported into the Colony for the Public Service shall be cleared at the Customs House by the Government Storekeeper, or some officer deputed by him.

31. All indents, contracts, and documents relating to Supplies, in which the Government Storekeeper is in any way concerned, shall be transmitted to his office for notice and action.

32. The accounts, books, and stock shall at all times be available for the inspection of the Auditor General, as required under the provisions of the Audit Act.

33. A debtor and creditor general account of all transactions connected with the receipt and issue of Stores shall be made out monthly for the information of the Colonial Treasurer.

34. Requisitions for printed forms or printing must not be included in demands on the Government Stores.

35. The several conditions in the foregoing regulations that relate to annual Supplies shall also apply (so far as they consistently may) to biennial or other time contracts.

36. These regulations shall take effect from the 16th January, 1895, and supersede any rules remaining in force at that date; but nothing herein contained shall be construed by heads of departments as dispensing with the Ministerial or other authority required by the Audit Act and the regulations thereunder.
