WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such District, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following boundaries:—

Bounded by lines starting from the 125th Meridian East Longitude, due East from a spot one mile and a half North from Gullewa Spring, and extending due West to the North-East corner of Coolgardie Goldfield as now amended, thence South to the summit of Mount Malcolm, thence in a Southerly direction to a spot situate 25 miles East from survey

post [^]₂ on the Western side of Goongarrie Lake at the 90-Mile Diggings, thence in a South-Westerly direction to a spot situated 5 miles West from the Black Flag Diggings, thence South-Easterly to the North-East corner of Hampton Lands Company's

Location No. 53, thence Eastward to the summit of Mount Belches, thence South to the Northern boundary of the Dundas Goldfield which lies due East from the summit of Mount Stirling, then due East to the 125th Meridian of East Longitude, and along it North to the starting point,—shall be and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

THE EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be for the future as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Yilgarn Goldfield which lies on the 120th Meridian East Longitude, due East from a spot situate one mile and a half North from Gullewa Spring, and extending East to a spot due North from the summit of Mount Malcolm, thence South to the said summit, thence in a Southerly direction to a

spot situate 25 miles East from survey post [^]₂ on the

Western side of Goongarrie Lake at the 90-Mile Diggings, thence in a South-Westerly direction to a spot situate 5 miles West from the Black Flag Diggings, thence South-Eastward to the North-East corner of Hampton Lands Company's Location No. 53, thence Eastward to the summit of Mount Belches, thence due South to a point due East from Mount Stirling, thence East to the 123rd Meridian of East Longitude and along it South to a point due East from Mount Ridley, thence West passing through said Mount Ridley to the 120th Meridian of East Longitude and along it North to the starting point.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality: AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the Municipality of Coolgardie were defined by Proclamation dated the 4th day of July, 1894: AND WHEREAS it is provided by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876" (40 Vic., No. 13), that if at any time subsequent to the constitution of a Municipality the population shall exceed one thousand, there shall be a Council consisting of a Chairman and Nine Councillors: AND WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act Amendment Act, 1892" (55 Vic., No. 16), it is further provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation to be gazetted, declare the number of the population of any Municipality as well when first proclaimed as at any subsequent period, and the number of the members of the Council shall not be increased without such declaration: AND WHEREAS the population of Coolgardie exceeds one thousand: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G.,

Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, for the purpose of enlarging the representation on the Council of the Municipality of Coolgardie, do hereby declare that the population of the said Municipality exceeds one thousand and does not exceed five thousand.

WHEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Quarantine Station at Woodman's Point near Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Quarantine Station near Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, all that piece or parcel of land situate at Woodman's Point near Fremantle—bounded on the *North* by the South side of Marmion Road; on the *East* by the West side of Rockingham Road; on the *South* by the prolongation West of the North side of Steere Road; and on the *West* by the sea-coast and the East boundary of Reserve 207A—for a Quarantine Station for Stock.





BY-LAWS of the Municipality of Coolgardie submitted to the Central Board of Health, Perth, for approval as By-laws under the Health Act:—

BY-LAW No. 1.—For providing and maintaining suitable closets, and for prohibiting cesspits.

The owner of every house or premises within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health shall cause to be constructed, on the said premises, a suitable closet, provided with the sealed pans adopted by the Local Board. Such closet shall be maintained and ventilated to the satisfaction of the officers of the Local Board, and shall in no case be situated at a less distance than twenty feet from any dwelling house or place of business, except by the express permission of the Local Board first obtained. Existing cesspits shall forthwith be carefully emptied, cleansed, re-filled with clean earth or stone, thoroughly rammed, and under no circumstances whatever shall new or additional cesspits be made in any place within the jurisdiction of the Local Board.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach or omission shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 2.—For preventing the placing of any offensive liquid or any refuse matter on streets or lanes.

No foul or offensive water or other liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or any other refuse, matter, or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged into or upon any part whatever of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the limits of the district over which the Local Board has jurisdiction.

No garbage, sweepings, or other refuse shall be scattered heaped, or deposited within any yard or premises within the town, or within the Local Board district, save in boxes or vessels, which, when filled, may be reasonably carried by one man, and which shall be specially provided by the occupier of the house or building to which such yard is attached, and shall be so placed and kept as to be readily accessible to the person employed by the Local Board for removing the same.

For every offence against the provisions of this by-law, the offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

BY-LAW No. 3.—*Prohibiting slaughtering of certain animals and regulating sale of meat.*

It shall not be lawful for any person to slaughter cattle or sheep within the limits of the district over which the Local Board has control, save and except for the sole use of himself and his family.

No person shall bring, or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat for food, unless such meat shall be protected from the sun and dust.

Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, shall be kept in a clean and healthy state.

Every person offending, by neglect or otherwise, against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a fine of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 4.—*Prohibiting the keeping of pigs.*

It shall not be lawful for any person to keep or breed any kind of living swine within the limits of the district controlled by the Local Board.

Any person who shall offend against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

Nothing in this by-law shall apply to any swine brought into the town for sale, and removed therefrom within twenty-four hours.
