Lulworth, and onwards to the summit of Beebynbeebynganna, and onwards to the summit of Tuckanarra; thence due East to the Eastern boundary of Murchison Goldfield, and along it North-North-Easterly to the summit of Mt. Russell; thence Westwards to the summit of Mt. Hale.

CUE.

Bounded by lines starting from the summit of Mt. Hale, and extending South-Easterly to the summit of Mt. Lulworth, and onwards to the summit of Beebynbeebynganna, and onwards to the summit of Tuckanarra; thence due East to the Eastern boundary of Murchison Goldfield, and along it South-South-Westerly to a spot due East from the summit of Mt. Farmer; thence North-Westerly along the Western boundary of the Murchison Goldfield, North-

Westerly to the summit of Mt. Luke, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Murchison; thence North-Easterly to the summit of Mt. Hale.

BY-LAW NO. 3.

- A BY-LAW TO REGULATE BATHING IN THE RIVER SWAN, AT PERTH, IN THE BATHING HOUSE AND ITS IMMEDIATE
- 1. By-law No. 3, of the 6th March, 1885, is hereby repealed.
- 2. The Council of the City of Perth, in exercise of the power in that behalf vested in them by Acts of Council, 40 Vic., No. 13, and 41 Vic., No. 18, doth hereby enact that from and after the date of these By-laws coming into operation, it shall be lawful for any person to bathe (except on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in each week, which days are hereby reserved for the exclusive use of females and little children) in the enclosure attached to the bathand little children) in the enclosure attached to the bathing house, situate between William Street and Barrack Street Jetties
- That no undressing or dressing will be permitted except in the covered portion of the bathing house.
- 4. That all persons over the age of ten years bathing between the hours of 7 o'clock in the morning and 5 o'clock in the evening, during the period between 1st May and 31st of August, and between the hours of 7 o'clock in the morning and 7 o'clock in the evening, from 1st September, to 30th April, both inclusive, must use a bathing dress or drawers.
- 5. That persons making use of profane or indecent language, or damaging the bathing house or the enclosure, or otherwise misbehaving themselves, will be prosecuted. Any offence against either of these Regulations will render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
- 6. The above By-laws shall apply only to the bathing house mentioned in By-law No. 1.
- It shall not be lawful for any person to bathe in or near to any public wharf or public place, or quay, or jetty, within the limits of the municipality, between the hours of 6 o'clock in the morning and 8 o'clock in the evening, under a penalty, on conviction or in view of any justice, of a sum not exceeding One pound.

High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this generous action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.




