HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Temporary Quarantine Station, near Perth; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a Temporary Quarantine Station, near Perth, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed two months from this date, the locality known as "Perry's Limekiln Paddock."

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality, and by the same Proclamation to define the boundaries of such Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, do hereby, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim the Town of Kalgoorlie to be a Municipality, under the style and title of "The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Kalgoorlie." And do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

# High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this generous action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.





### Perth Local Board of Health.

# By-Laws for the Perth Municipal Water Supply Area.

THE Local Board of Health for the City of Perth, under and by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and the amendments thereto, and "The Municipal Water Supply Preservation Act, 1892," and of all other powers and authorities enabling it in this behalf, doth hereby make and proclaim the following By-laws:—

- 1. In the construction and for the purposes of these by-laws, the following words, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—
  - "Cesspit" and "Cesspan" means any receptacle for fæcal matter.
  - "Closet" means the structure above or enclosing a cesspit or cesspan.
  - "House" has the meaning assigned to it by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and also means and includes huts, tents, and mills, or other buildings or premises.
  - "Water Area" means the catchment area of the water supply for the City of Perth.
  - "Occupier" means any person living in or being in the possession, use, or enjoyment of any house, whether paying rent for the same or not.
  - "Owner" has the meaning assigned to it by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and also means and includes any person or company in the possession, occupation, or enjoyment of any land within the water area under lease or license from the Crown, and also his and its agent or manager.
  - "Inspector" means an inspector of nuisances appointed by the Perth Local Board of Health, and any subinspector appointed by the said Board.
  - "Refuse" means and includes any decomposing animal or decaying vegetable matter, house refuse, slops, soapsuds, sawdust, and ashes.
  - "High Water Mark" means the highest point on either bank of any water course to which the waters of such water-course have risen, or may at any time rise.
- 2. These by-laws apply only and are limited to the water area.
- 3. The owner or occupier of every house shall, within one month after the publication of these by-laws, construct or cause to be constructed a closet and cesspan for the use of the occupants of such house. Such closet and cesspan shall be constructed in the position, mode, and manner hereinafter declared. Provided however, that on the permission of the Inspector one closet may be constructed and used for not more than four houses, and such permission may at any time be revoked.
- 4. Every closet shall be so constructed as to effectually screen the persons using the same from observation, and every cesspan shall consist of a portable bucket, which shall be emptied and cleansed once every week, or as much oftener as may be directed by the Inspector.
- 5. No closet shall be constructed within fifty feet of a house or within one hundred and fifty yards of high water mark, and any closet situated within fifty feet of a house

- or one hundred and fifty yards of high water mark shall, within one calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier by the Inspector, be taken down, and the cesspan cleansed and a fire made therein, after which the cesspit shall be filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector by the owner or occupier of the house to which such closet or cesspit is appurtenant.
- 6. Any owner or occupier who permits a cesspan to overflow from any cause whatever shall be guilty of an offence.
- 7. No owner or occupier of a house shall permit any closet or cesspan appertaining to or used by the occupants of such house to become offensive or a nuisance, and every such owner or occupier shall, when required so to do by the Inspector, properly and effectually empty and cleanse such closet or cesspan to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 8. Nightsoil, fæcal matter, or refuse shall, when removed from a closet or cesspan be buried at least two feet below the surface of the ground, but no such nightsoil shall be buried within 300 yards of high water mark of any water-course in the said area.
- 9. No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any facal matter, refuse, dung, manure or any other offensive matter in or near any water-course, nor within 300 yards of high water mark, nor in any place where storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any water-course.
  - 10. No swine shall be kept within the water area.
- 11. No stable, cow-shed, or goat-shed shall be erected or constructed within 300 yards of the high water mark of any water-course, nor in such a position that storm waters can wash any manure or refuse therefrom into any water-course; and each stable, cow-shed, or goat-shed shall have attached a proper receptacle for liquid manure to the satisfaction of the Inspector. Every stable, cow-shed, and goat-shed, when situate upon grounds sloping to a water-course, shall be excavated to a depth of at least 12 inches, and the soil so obtained shall be used as an embankment around the enclosure to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 12. Every stable, cow-shed, and goat-shed situated within 300 yards of the high water mark of any water-course or in any such a position that storm waters may wash manure or refuse therefrom into any water-course shall, within one month after the publication of these by-laws, be cleansed by the owner or occupier, and shall no longer be used for housing animals, and shall be taken down if the Inspector so directs.
- 13. Dung or manure shall not be allowed to accumulate in or near any stable, cow-shed, or goat-shed, but the same shall be periodically removed or disposed of to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and in such manner that it cannot pollute the water flowing or which may flow into any water-course.
- 14. Any owner or occupier of a stable, cow-shed, or goat-shed who, within 7 days after notice to do so, neglects or refuses to collect the manure and refuse therein, and to cleanse the same, shall be guilty of an offence.
- $15.\,$  No animal shall be stabled, housed, or yarded within 300 yards of the high water mark of any water-course.
- 16. No slaughter-house shall be permitted and no animals shall be slaughtered within 300 yards of the high water mark of any water-course. The owner or occupier of any slaughter-house shall daily collect and remove therefrom all offal, blood, manure, and filth, and shall not allow the same to flow or escape on to any ground from whence it may be carried by storm waters into any water-course. Such offal, blood, manure, and filth shall be removed to such place as the Inspector may approve, or shall be disposed of otherwise to his satisfaction.
- 17. No sawdust or ashes shall be allowed to remain for the space of more than one day within 300 yards of any water-course, and the owner or occupier of any premises on which such sawdust or ashes shall be shall within such time remove the same to such distance, or otherwise dispose of the same to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 18. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine, or other refuse water within 300 yards of a water-course, nor on any part of the water area from whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm waters into a water-course, and pollute the water supply for the City of Perth.
- 19. No person shall allow any filth, rubbish, blood, offal, manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine, or other refuse waters to flow from or escape from any house or premises occupied or owned by him.

Any person committing or suffering a breach of or offending against or not complying with the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and upon con-viction thereof before two Justices of the Peace shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10 nor less than Five shillings for every such offence. Any person neglecting, refusing, or omitting to do any matter or thing enjoined by these by-laws, or doing anything which is forbidden herein, after notice by the Inspector, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, upon conviction as aforesaid, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5 nor less than Five shillings for each day he refuses or neglects to comply with such notice.

21. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, in case of any

breach of these by-laws, if in his discretion such course is necessary for the preservation of the public health to enter upon any house, slaughter-house, stable, yard, closet, or other premises where such breach shall occur, and do any act or remove or cause to be removed anything thereon or therein in breach of these by-laws, or take such other steps as he may deem necessary for carrying out the provisions hereof, and that either before or after notice to the owner or occupier of such premises, and the cost of such removal or other necessary act shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the premises where such breach shall occur, and may be recovered from him in a summary manner before two or more Justices of the Peace.

When a house, slaughter-house, cow-shed, or yard is occupied by two or more persons, each and every of them shall be liable to conviction for any offence against these by-laws committed or suffered by any one or more of such occupiers

23. All previous by-laws relating solely to the water area are hereby repealed.
