Amended Orders under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 13th day of March, 1895.

BY virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vict. No. 5), I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the following Orders, under the above cited Act, shall come into force on the day of the date hereof, and shall supersede those published in the *Government Gazette* of the 11th day of May and 29th day of June, 1894, respectively.

The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880.

Orders for the Disinfection of Vine Cuttings.

1. All consignees, agents, or other like persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall, within 24 hours of the arrival of any such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia, notify the fact of such arrival to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, appointed under the provisions of the said Act.

2. The importation of vines with roots, or of vines that have had their roots cut off, is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes, vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited (except from the Province of South Australia).

3. All vine cuttings imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation by the Chief or Local Inspector, and,

if found infested with injurious insects, which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Order No. 5, the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

4. All vine cuttings or buds imported from South Australia are required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed. If any of the said vine cuttings are found to be infested with insects (or their germs), or with fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to grapes or to fringe vines or to other trees or plants, they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days, or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said vine cuttings are free from injurious insects, or their eggs, larvæ, or pupæ.

5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings required by the 4th Order shall be effected by dipping the vine cuttings into a solution of:—

(a.) Sulphide of potash, in proportion of one pound (1lb.) to twenty (20) gallons of water, the cuttings to be immersed for twenty (20) minutes;

or (b.) A solution of one part of liver of lime to twenty (20) parts of water, the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes.

6. The dip to be used shall be determined by the Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector. After the vine cuttings have been dipped, they shall, if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector, remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen (14) days for disinfection.

Regulations for the Disinfection of Imported Trees, Plants, Cuttings (other than Vines), Grafts, Buds, Seeds, Pits, Scions, and Fruit.

1. All consignees, agents, or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit, fruit trees, plants, cuttings, buds, seeds, pits, or scions, shall within twenty-four (24) hours after the arrival of any fruit, fruit trees, plants, cuttings, buds (other than vine cuttings or buds), seeds, pits, or scions, at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia, notify the fact of such arrival to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.

2. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs), or with fungi, blight, or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees, or to other trees or plants, they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days, or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions are free from injurious insect pests, or their eggs, larvæ, or pupæ.

3. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), fungi, blight, or other diseases that are known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees, or to other trees or plants, and liable to spread contagion, are hereby required to be disinfected before removal from the place where they are landed.

4. All peach, nectarine, apricot, plum, prune, almond, or other trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots, and all peach or other pits, cuttings, buds, or scions, raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist, are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.

5. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must, before removal from the first port or place of debarkation, be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees, will be destroyed. If the fruit on examination is found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs), or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or other trees, the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect, after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit is packed have been disinfected, as pro-

vided by Order 6, and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection as prescribed in the schedule below. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material, the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector will, if such fruit is found to be free from disease, issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee as prescribed in the schedule below.

6. Transportable material of any kind infested with insect or insects (or their germs), or by fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees, and liable to spread contagion, is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation, or from being offered for sale, gift, or distribution, or transportation, until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Bureau of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping it in boiling water, and allowing it to remain in the said boiling water not less than two (2) minutes, such boiling water used as such disinfectant to contain in solution not less than one pound (1 lb.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.

7. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 6.

8. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Bureau of Agriculture) be disinfected by dipping in a solution of one pound (1 lb.) of whale-oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water: said whale-oil soap solution shall be kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit: said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions have been disinfected, they shall, if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection, or for further disinfection.

9. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Bureau of Agriculture) be further disinfected by fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—Said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box, and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein shall be used for—

PLANTS IN POTS AND IN LEAF—

400 grains of fused Cyanide of Potassium (58 per cent.) with 1½ ounces of fluid Sulphuric Acid.

FRUIT TREES AND SHRUBS—

530 grains of fused Cyanide of Potassium (58 per cent.) with 1½ ounces of fluid Sulphuric Acid.

The Cyanide of Potassium shall be placed in the generator, and the box immediately closed tightly, when the Sulphuric Acid shall be added. The box shall remain closed for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed, they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment.

10. All trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds, seeds, pits, or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first point of debarkation, and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 8 and 9 of these Orders, they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.

11. Consignees or their agents must deliver the fruit, fruit trees, vine cuttings, packages, and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection, consignees or their agents must repack the fruit, fruit trees, vine cuttings, packages, or transportable material that have been disinfected, and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.

12. Any fruit, fruit trees, vine cuttings, packages, or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection, and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours, by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking, may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.

13. Blank forms for certificates of disinfection will be supplied to the Chief Inspector and Local Inspectors, and

the fees to be charged by Inspectors for such certificates (made out in duplicate) shall be as in schedules below :—

Rebate of Duty on Kerosene Oil used as a Fuel for Machinery.

WHEREAS by the 115th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," power is given to the Governor, by Special Order in each case, to exempt from the payment of duty or any proportion thereof, under circumstances of an exceptional nature to be stated in such order, any goods upon which duties of Customs may be leviable; And whereas it is desirable to encourage the erection of machinery for the crushing of ores upon the various Goldfields of the Colony; And whereas those machines, the motive power of which is provided by the use of oil as a fuel are more simple of construction and more readily erected than those that burn wood or coal as a fuel, and are more adapted to the circumstances connected with the present development of the Goldfields of the Colony: Now therefore, under the special circumstances hereinbefore set forth, it is hereby ordered that Kerosene Oil imported into this Colony, and used in any oil engine or other machinery now or hereafter

to be erected on any Goldfield in the Colony, as a fuel for the providing of motive power to such engine or machinery, shall be subject to a rebate of Two pence half-penny per gallon on every gallon so used. Provided that claims for such rebate shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration by the Manager, or other responsible person in charge of the works or machinery in which such oil has been used, that the oil in respect of which the claim is made was used solely and *bonâ fide* as a fuel in the machinery under his control, and for no other purpose whatsoever, and also by a certificate from the Warden of the Goldfield, or of some Officer of Police, that he believes the facts stated in such declaration to be true.

Surveys of Gold Mining Leases and Declarations as to Pegging.

Amendment of Clauses 60 and 60a of the Regulations for the Management of Goldfields.

18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 60 and 60a of the Regulations thereunder, as shown below.

Regulation 60, paragraph 6, is amended as follows:—

The survey of every Gold Mining Lease shall be made by a Licensed Surveyor specially appointed by the Minister to perform mining surveys.

The instructions for such surveys shall be issued by the Warden, or Inspecting Surveyor, to the Mining Surveyor, who shall, within three months from the date of application, or within such other extended period of time as the Warden may see fit to allow, furnish to the Warden a plan, in duplicate, showing the boundaries of the land as actually surveyed and marked.

The survey and plan of a Gold Mining Lease shall be executed in accordance with the general directions issued by the Minister.

No Surveyor, acting as a Mining Agent or Broker, shall be competent to perform surveys of Gold Mining Leases, and the Minister may at any time cancel the special appointment of any Licensed Surveyor to perform mining surveys.

Regulation 60A is amended by the omission of the words "Statutory declaration as per Schedule 20B," and the substitution of the word "declaration" in lieu thereof. The Regulation will be read as follows:—

Regulation 60A.—Every application for a lease shall be made at the office of the Registrar of the district within ten days from the time of marking or pegging off the land required, accompanied by a declaration setting forth the day and the hour when such marking or pegging off shall have been completed.

(N.B.—The form of application for lease is altered as below, so as to bear the declaration upon it; but where it is found necessary to use old forms, the words in italics in the fourth, fifth, and sixth lines should be inserted.)

High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.

AN ACT to provide for the Preservation of Imported Birds and Animals, and of Native Game.

[Assented to, 18th March, 1892.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient for the benefit of the Colony that encouragement should be given to persons to import any Bird or Animal not previously existing therein, and that Protection should be given to such Birds or Animals and their progeny, as also that Native Game should have Protection: Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Game Act, 1892."

Interpretation.

2. For the purposes of this Act, the following terms in inverted commas shall, unless the context otherwise indicate, bear the meanings set against them respectively:—

"Gazette"—The *Government Gazette* of Western Australia;

"Governor"—The Officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council;

"Native Game"—The birds and animals for the time being included in the First Schedule to this Act under the provisions of this Act;

"Close Season"—The period during which, by any Proclamation issued under the authority of this Act, it may be declared unlawful to kill, destroy, take, or disturb any particular native game named in any such Proclamation.

Repeal of previous Acts.

3. The Acts 38 Vic., No. 4, the 40 Vic., No. 7, and the 42 Vic., No. 23, are hereby repealed.

Power to Governor to proclaim (a) Close season for native game; (b) Reserves; (c) What game to be strictly preserved.

4. The Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Gazette*, declare—

(a.) The close season for any particular native game, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof, to be defined in any such Proclamation:

(b.) Any one or more portions of the Colony or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in any such Proclamation a reserve for native game or any particular native game:

(c.) That any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof.

Penalty for destroying imported bird or animal.

5. If any person not being the owner thereof, or without the permission of the owner, shall at any time wilfully kill, destroy, take, or disturb, or attempt to kill, destroy, take, or disturb, or shall use any instrument whatever, or other means, for the purpose of killing, destroying, taking, or disturbing any imported bird or animal, and mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Act subject to the provisions of Section 14, such person shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, in addition to the sum of Ten shillings for every bird or animal so destroyed or taken, and the Justice or Justices by whom such conviction shall be made may order that any instrument used as aforesaid shall be destroyed or forfeited.

Penalty for destroying native game out of season, any game on a reserve, or strictly preserved.

6. If any person not licensed under the provisions of section seven of this Act shall wilfully kill, destroy, take, or disturb, or attempt to kill, destroy, take or disturb, or shall use any instrument whatever or any other means, for the purpose of killing, destroying, taking, or disturbing—

(a.) Any native game during the close season for such game in any place where such close season applies; or

(b.) At any time of the year any bird or animal whatever on any Reserve proclaimed under this Act; or

(c.) At any time of the year any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia, in any portion of the Colony or locality included in any Proclamation, declaring such bird or animal to be strictly preserved,

such person shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding the sum of Five pounds, in addition to the sum of Ten shillings for each bird or animal so destroyed or taken, and the Justice or Justices by whom such conviction shall be made may order that any instrument used as aforesaid shall be destroyed or forfeited.

Colonial Secretary may grant licenses to shoot on Reserves.

7. The Colonial Secretary may from time to time grant and revoke, as he may think fit, licenses to shoot or destroy any birds or animals to be mentioned in such license upon any reserve declared under this Act, and also to destroy the eggs of any such bird.

Penalty on taking or destroying eggs.

8. If any person, not being the owner or without the permission of the owner, shall wilfully take out of the nest or destroy in the nest the eggs of any imported bird, or if any person shall wilfully take out of the nest or destroy in the nest the eggs of any bird of native game for which a close season has been proclaimed, or shall knowingly have or permit or suffer to be in his house or possession any eggs of any such birds so taken after the passing of this Act,

every such person shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten shillings for each egg so destroyed or found in his house or possession.

Game, &c., to be forfeited.

9. It shall be lawful for any Justice of the Peace, on the conviction of any person under this Act, to order the forfeiture of any imported bird or animal or native game, and also any eggs, whether of imported or native game birds, found in the possession of or taken from any offender.

Persons offending against this Act to give name and address and deliver up game, &c., otherwise may be apprehended.

10. If any person shall be found offending against the provisions of this Act, and shall not give his name and address, and shall not deliver up any imported bird or animal or native game, or any instrument or means used to kill, destroy, take, or disturb such bird or animal or such game, to any person who may demand the same respectively, it shall be lawful for such last-mentioned person, with any assistance he may require, or for any police constable, to take and detain such first-mentioned person in custody until he can be brought before a Justice of the Peace, to be dealt with according to law. And any person who shall assault or resist any such person so demanding such bird, animal, or game, or instrument or means as aforesaid, shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, besides any other penalty he may have incurred under this Act, and shall forfeit such bird, animal, game, instrument, or thing.

Act not to apply to birds or animals kept in confinement or domesticated.

11. Nothing in this Act shall apply to any bird or animal kept in confinement or in a domesticated state, provided such birds or animals shall not have been caught or taken contrary to the provisions of this Act.

Forfeitures to be sold.

12. Any instrument, bird, animal, game, eggs, or other thing forfeited under this Act may be ordered by the convicting Justice or Justices to be sold, and the proceeds of any such sale shall be appropriated in like manner as any penalty under this Act.

Summary jurisdiction with appeal.

13. All offences against this Act shall be summarily punishable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, in Petty Sessions, and any person who shall feel himself aggrieved by the order or conviction made by any Justice or Justices may appeal to the Supreme Court.

Power to revoke, cancel, or alter proclamation.

14. It shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time by notice published in the *Gazette*, to revoke, cancel, or alter any proclamation at any time made and published under the authority of this Act, and by like notice to add to or remove from the Schedules to this Act, respectively, any bird or animal.

Shortening Ordinance.

15. Sections A, C, F, G, and H of "The Shortening Ordinance, 1853," shall be incorporated with and taken to form part of this Act, to all intents and purposes, and in as full and ample a manner as if the said Sections had been introduced and fully set forth in this Act.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1892," that "the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare the Close Season for any particular Native Game included in the "First Schedule to the said Act, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof, to be defined in any such Proclamation"; and also to declare that any Bird or Animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof": Now THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that within the limits of that portion of the Colony—bounded on the *West* and *South* by the Sea Coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the *North* by the Murchison River; on the *East* by a line from Bompas Hill, in the Great Northern Bend of the Murchison River, through Wongan Hills and Mount Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River, and including a strip of land five miles wide along the South Coast and a block of land at Eucla measuring 20 miles along the Coast by 10 miles in depth—the Close Season for the following Birds, viz. :—

Wild Ducks of all species (including Musk Duck or Steamer), Teal, Emu, Wild Geese, Bustard or Wild Turkey, Swamp Hen, Bronze-winged and other Pigeons, Gnow, Quail, Rottnest and other Snipe, shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, and November.

For Swans the Close Season shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, November, and December.

For the Booby, Frigate Bird, Noddy, Pelican, Curlew, Sea Pie, Sea Snipe, Mutton Bird, Red Bill, Cormorant or Shag, the Close Season, *North of the Moore River*, shall be for and during the months of June, July, August, and September.

For Seals the Close Season shall be for and during the months of November, December, January, February, and March.

The Bittern, Magpie, Laughing Jackass, Wattle Bird, Wag-Tail, and Robin Redbreast are declared to be *strictly preserved* throughout the Colony, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden:

AND WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," it is further provided that "the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, by like Proclamation, declare any portion of the "Colony or locality a Reserve for Native Game": Now THEREFORE I, the said ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, as such Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare so much of the River Swan as lies between the Bunbury Railway Bridge, at Bishop's Island, and the Narrows, at Mill Point, a Reserve for Native Game, and all shooting within such limits is *strictly prohibited*.

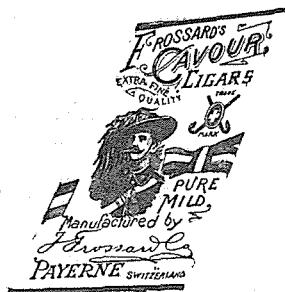
