WHEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Vic., No. 12), it is, amongst other things, enacted that all vessels, as well Her Majesty's Ships of War as others, coming from or having touched at any place from which the Governor shall have adjudged and declared it probable that any infectious disease, dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought, shall, upon their arrival at any port or place in the Colony, be obliged to perform Quarantine: AND WHEREAS it has been reported to the Governor that the Island of New Guinea is infected with the infectious disease known as Small Pox: Now Therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the infectious disease known as Small Pox may be brought from the Island of New Guinea.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF YORK.

The foll-wing By-law was made and passed at an ordinary meeting of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of York, holden in the Council Chambers, York, aforesaid, on Tuesday, the fifth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and was finally adopted at the next following meeting holden at the Council Chambers aforesaid, on Tuesday, the third day of July, One thousand

eight hundred and ninety-four:

"Any person who, after sunset in the evening and before Any person who, after statiset in the evening and before sunrise of the following morning, shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons, goods, or merchandise, in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality of York, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed on the right or off-side of the front portion of such vehicle, lighted and burning; or who shall, during the said period of time, ride any bievele or other similar machine propelled by manual any bicycle or other similar machine propelled by manual labour, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed on the front of such bicycle or other similar machine, lighted and burning, shall be liable to prosecution, and on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each such offence."

OTICE is hereby given that the Government offers a Bonus to any person or company who, from this date to the 31st of March, 1896, shall sink on the Kimberley Goldfield a Shaft as hereinafter mentioned, and according to the following conditions, from a depth previously attained of not less than 100 feet:—

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 100 feet to a depth of 200 feet, @ $\pounds 4$ per foot.

For a shaft to be sunk from below the depth of 200 feet to a depth of 300 feet, @ $\mathcal{L}6$ per foot.

CONDITIONS.

With regard to existing shafts, no payment will be made in respect of work done before the date hereof.

Any person intending to deepen any existing shaft of or exceeding the depth of 100 feet shall give notice in writing to the Warden or his Deputy of the depth of the said shaft, and of his intention to deepen the same.

The Warden or his Deputy shall ascertain and certify the depth of such shaft, and payment shall be made only in respect of the work done beyond the depth certified by the Warden or his Deputy. Any person intending to sink a new shaft with the intention of claiming a bonus shall give notice to the Warden in writing of such intention before the commencement of the work, or before the shaft is down 100 feet.

Amendment of Clause 60 of the Regulations for the Management of Goldfields (re Applications and Survey, Gold-mining Leases).

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 79 of the Goldfields Act (50 Vic., No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clause 60 of the Regulations thereunder, as shown below; to come into force on the 1st October, 1894.

That Sub-section (4.) read as follows:—

The applicant shall, previously to making application for a lease, mark the land intended to be applied for, at each corner, by a post standing three feet out of the ground, and four inches in diameter, such post to be kept uncovered, and set in L trenches three feet long and six inches deep along each boundary line; and shall at the same time post a notice in the form of No. 20a, hereto annexed, on a conspicuous part of the land intended to be applied for; and shall, at the time of lodging his appli-

cation at the Warden's Office, post a notice thereat in the form of Schedule 20. Applications for leases shall be heard by the Warden not less than thirty days after the date of lodging of the application at the Warden's Office.

That Sub-section (5.) read as follows:

Each application must be signed by the party or parties applying for a lease, or by his or their accredited agent or agents, and must be accompanied by a sketch plan of the land intended to be applied for, showing its position and one boundary line thereof, which line shall be considered as the datum line.

That Sub-section (6.) read as follows:—

The applicant shall, within three months after lodging the application, or within such other extended period of time as the Warden may see fit to allow, furnish to the Warden a plan in duplicate and description showing the boundaries of the land as actually surveyed and marked. Such surveying and marking shall be performed by a licensed surveyor specially appointed by the Minister to perform mining surveys. The plan and description of a goldmining lease shall be executed in accordance with the general directions issued by the Minister, provided that the Minister may at at any time cancel the special appointment of any such licensed surveyor.

That Sub-section (7.) read as follows:—

In all cases where the land is so available, the mean length of the area applied for shall not exceed twice its mean breadth, but when, owing to the positions of adjoining boundaries or natural features, this is impossible, any irregularly shaped or intervening piece of land may be applied for, and a lease of such piece may be granted.

That Sub-section (8.) read as follows:-

All leases shall be marked by the surveyor according to the applicant's posts. Provided that should the area of the land marked by the applicant's posts be in excess of the area applied for, the applicant may either amend his application to include the excess area (provided that the total area of the land applied for does not exceed twenty-five acres), or in the event of the area of the land marked by his posts exceeding twenty-five acres, he may amend his application and retain twenty-five acres extending from the line shown in his application as the datum line; and should the area of the land marked by the applicant's posts be less than the area applied for, such less area only shall be granted. Should the applicant, however, show that by increasing the area to the quantity applied for there would be no interference with adjoining rights, the surveyor may make the required alteration.

Surveys of Gold Mining Leases and Declarations as to Pegging.

Amendment of Clauses 60 and 60a of the Regulations for the Management of Goldfields.

Department of Mines, Perth, 27th February, 1895.

Is Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 79 of "The Goldfields Act" (50 Vict., No. 18), has been pleased to amend Clauses 60 and 60A of the Regulations thereunder, as shown below.

E. H. WITTENOOM, Minister for Mines.

Regulation 60, paragraph 6, is amended as follows:—

The survey of every Gold Mining Lease shall be made by a Licensed Surveyor specially appointed by the Minister to perform mining surveys.

The instructions for such surveys shall be issued by the Warden, or Inspecting Surveyor, to the Mining Surveyor, who shall, within three months from the date of application, or within such other extended period of time as the Warden may see fit to allow, furnish to the Warden a plan, in duplicate, showing the boundaries of the land as actually surveyed and marked.

The survey and plan of a Gold Mining Lease shall be executed in accordance with the general directions issued by the Minister.

No Surveyor, acting as a Mining Agent or Broker, shall be competent to perform surveys of Gold Mining Leases, and the Minister may at any time cancel the special appointment of any Licensed Surveyor to perform mining surveys.

Regulation 60a is amended by the omission of the words "Statutory declaration as per Schedule 20B," and the substitution of the word "declaration" in lieu thereof. The Regulation will be read as follows:—

Regulation 60a.—Every application for a lease shall be made at the office of the Registrar of the district within ten days from the time of marking or pegging off the land required, accompanied by a declaration setting forth the day and the hour when such marking or pegging off shall have been completed.

(N.B.—The form of application for lease is altered as below, so as to bear the declaration upon it; but where it is found necessary to use old forms, the words in italics in the fourth, fifth, and sixth lines should be inserted.)

High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.
