High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Flower enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and Emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.

WATER RIGHTS.

1. Any person or company intending to search for and procure subterranean water for any purpose, either by boring or shaft-sinking, shall give notice in writing to the Warden, in the form of Schedule No. 1, hereto annexed, and such notice shall describe, with sufficient accuracy, the site at which it is proposed to put down such bore or shaft, and also the depth to which it is proposed to bore or sink; and a copy of such notice shall be kept posted for seven clear working days at the Warden's office, and on the site of the proposed bore or shaft; and if no valid objection be lodged at the expiration of seven clear working days, the Warden may, with the approval of the Governor, on payment of the fee of ten shillings, grant the required permission, in the form of Schedule No. 2 hereto annexed, and the surface of land which the permission covers shall vary with the depth, and shall be as set forth in the following Schedule :---

2. In case such circumscribed square does so encroach or overlap any private property, whether freehold or leasehold, the Warden may, on application, direct that the full area of ground specified by the Schedule be surveyed (provided that there be sufficient Crown lands not held under lease in the vicinity to allow of the specified area being included in the one continuous boundary). If there be not sufficient Crown lands available then only as much as may be available can be granted as a Water Right.

4. The permission given to search for and procure subterranean water shall prevent any other person or company from boring or sinking shafts within the area covered by the permission (or water right); always provided that the work of boring or sinking is carried on in such a manner as will, in the opinion of the Warden, enable the required depth to be reached in the time specified in the Schedule following, the time to be calculated from date of Water Right being granted :---

5. Should the work of boring or sinking not be proceeded with continuously, or at such a rate of progress as will, in the opinion of the Warden, enable 500 feet at least to be completed in each year, in cases where the time for completion extends beyond one year, or should the required depth not be reached within the time specified, the Water Right may be declared forfeited by the Warden, and any person or company may then bore or sink within such area as heretofore was secured to the holder of the Water Right, such person or company having previously made application to the Warden for the forfeiture of the Water Right, and obtained the issue of the Water Right in his own name.

6. Upon completing the bore or shaft to the depth specified on the application notice, the holder of the Water Right may apply to the Warden, who, if he be satisfied that the bore or shaft has been put down to the depth specified, and that a supply of water has been struck, shall recommend the granting of a lease covering the surface area specified in the Water Right. The lease shall be for a period of ten years, at the annual rent of $\pounds 2$ per annum.

7. Should a supply of water be struck at a higher level than the depth specified on the application for the Water Right, and the holder of the Water Right not desire to bore or sink deeper, he may apply to the Warden for a lease of such area as he would have been entitled to had he obtained a permission to bore or sink to the lesser depth at which he has obtained the supply, and on the granting of such lease he shall cease to have any right over any further area.

8. Should water not be struck at the depth originally specified on Application Form, and should the holder of the Right desire to bore or sink deeper, he should, if he desires to increase the surface area of his Right, make application to the Warden, in writing, of his intention to bore or sink deeper, and the Warden may, with the approval of the Governor, if there be sufficient Crown lands available, grant him the desired extended area, and endorse the same on the Water Right.

9. Except as to the two acres hereinafter mentioned, nothing in these Regulations shall give to the holder of a Water Right any right to the surface area covered by the Water Right, or shall prevent the granting or issue within the said area to any person or company of any claim, lease, license, area, or other mining tenement or holding under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," or of any Act amending the same or incorporated therewith, or under any Regulations made or hereafter to be made under any such Act, or shall prevent the selling or leasing by the Governor of any lands within any such area under Section 26 of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892," or any amendment thereof, nor the resumption or reservation by the Crown of any portion thereof for a townsite or commonage, or as a State forest, or for any public purpose, nor the sale or disposal by the Crown of any lands so resumed or reserved as aforesaid. Provided, that this Regulation shall not apply to so much of the area covered by a Water Right, not exceeding two acres in the form of a square, with the bore or shaft in the centre, as the holder of the Water Right may desire to occupy for the purposes of his pumping plant, tanks, reservoirs, buildings, or other works and appliances necessary for the working of his shaft or bore.

10. A Water Right shall not confer any right to any minerals found in the course of boring or sinking, nor shall it prevent any person from prospecting the area covered thereby.

11. Subject, as hereinafter mentioned, the whole of the subterranean water obtained below the surface area, covered by a Water Right, and within the vertical planes produced from the boundaries of such area, shall be deemed to be the property of the holder of the Water Right, and he shall be under no restrictions as to the sale of such water. Provided, however, that any lessee or holder of any claim, license, area, or other mining tenement, or other holding, and any purchaser or lessee under the provisions of Section 26 of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892," shall be at liberty to sink, bore for, obtain, use, and enjoy, upon his lease or holding, all such water as he may require for his own purposes and workings, and not for sale; and provided, also, that nothing in these Regulations shall affect the rights of any purchaser from the Crown or his assigns (whether acquired before or after the making of these Regulations) of lands situate within a townsite or other portion of the area covered by a Water Right.

12. The holder of a Water Right shall have no claim against any person or company whose rights are saved under the provisoes to the last preceding Clause, in the event of such person or company draining the bore or shaft of such holder by the sinking of another bore or shaft on his or their own ground, within the boundaries of the Water Right; nor against the holder of any other Water Right who by boring or sinking upon his own area, shall drain the bore or shaft of such first mentioned holder. Provided, always, that the bore or shaft of the holder of one Water Right shall not come within the vertical boundary planes of the area of another holder, whatever may be the geological character of the country through which the bore or shaft is sunk.

13. The holder of a Water Right, if water has been struck in his bore or shaft, shall keep all buildings, fences, pumping gear, tanks, and bore or shaft in good order and condition, and to the satisfaction of the Warden, and on his failing to comply with this condition, the Warden may declare the Water Right to be forfeited.

14. In case of forfeiture for any reason, and upon the expiration or sooner determination of any lease if the same be not renewed, the bore or shaft, and the buildings, plant, pumping gear, and other appurtenances of the bore or shaft may, unless the same be removed within two months, be sold by auction by the Warden, and the proceeds of such sale shall be handed over to the late holder of the Water Right, after payment of all expenses and claims against him.

15. Should water not be struck when the bore or shaft has attained the specified depth, and the holder of the Water Right does not desire to bore or sink deeper, then the Water Right shall lapse.

16. If water has been struck and aftewards, at any time during the currency of the lease, the water disappears, from natural causes, or if, in the opinion of the Warden, no reasonable supply has been obtainable from the bore or shaft for a period of twelve consecutive months, then the Water Right shall lapse, and the lease, if issued, may be cancelled by the Warden, with the approval of the Governor.

17 The Warden may, at any time during the sinking of any bore or shaft under a Water Right. order that the holder of such Water Bight shall provide samples of strata passed through by such hore or shaft and placed in the sample case provided by the Government for such purpose. The case will be delivered free of cost to the holder of the Water Right at the site of the bore or shaft, and the said holder shall be responsible for the safety of the said case and the samples therein until the same has been removed by the Government. Upon failure or refusal to supply the samples, for one month after being directed by the Warden, he may declare the Water Right to be forfeited. And this Regulation shall be held to apply to the whole of the core from any diamond drill boring for water on a Water Right.

18. Any forfeiture under these Regulations declared by the Warden shall be subject to the approval of the Governor, and upon such confirmation the Water Right shall, subject to the application of No. 5 of these Regulations, be null and void.

The expression "Water Right" in these Regulations shall, unless inconsistent with the context, include the lease issued under No. 6 of these Regulations.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The Medical Act, 1894.

W HEREAS by "The Medical Act, 1894" (hereinafter called the Act), the Medical Board thereby constituted is empowered to make and prescribe Rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned; and whereas by the Act it is provided that the members of the Board shall be nominated from time to time by the Governor in Council, and that the President of the said Board shall also be nominated from time to time by the Governor in Council; and whereas on the 16th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the Governor in Council nominated, as President of the said Board, Alfred Robert Waylen, and as the members thereof the^a said Alfred Robert Waylen, Henry Calvert Barnett, Henry Frederick Harvey, James William Hope, Henry Trueman Kelsall, Daniel Kenny, and Frank Tratman; and whereas it is desirable to make and prescribe Rules under the Act: Now therefore the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in them and under the Act, by and with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, hereby, at a meeting held at Perth this 6th day of March, 1895, make and prescribe the following Rules:—

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction of these Rules Section 3 of the Act shall apply.

MEETINGS.

1. Monthly meetings of the Board shall be held on the first Wednesday in each month, at 3.30 p.m.; and special meetings shall be held at such times as the President or any two members of the Board may require.

Any monthly meeting of the Board may be postponed to and held at such hour and place as the Board may by resolution direct.

2. Special meetings shall be convened by the Registrar, at the request of the President or any two members of the Board, by posting or delivering to each member 48 hours' written notice stating the time and place of such meeting.

The omission to post or deliver any such notice, or the non-receipt thereof, shall in no manner affect or prejudice anything done or agreed to at any such meeting.

3. If a quorum of members be not present within fifteen minutes of the time appointed, the meeting may be adjourned to such time and place as those present shall determine.

4. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless a ballot is called for by any member present.

5. No resolution passed, or any act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded, amended, cancelled, or revoked at any subsequent meeting, unless prior notice of such intended rescission, amendment, cancellation, or revocation has been given in the notices convening the meeting.

6. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar, and shall, when signed by the President or Chairman of the same or any subsequent meeting, be binding and conclusive for all purposes.

REGISTRATION.

7. Every applicant for registration as a medical practitioner shall, at least five clear days before the then next ordinary monthly meeting of the Board, lodge with the Registrar—

- All diplomas by virtue of which he claims to be registered;
- (2.) A declaration in the Form A in the Schedule; and
- (3.) The sum of five guineas.

8. Every applicant for registration as a medical practitioner, by virtue of any qualification comprised in the thirteenth head of Schedule II. of the Act, shall, in addition to complying with the last preceding rule, lodge with the Registrar such evidence as the Board may from time to time require to satisfy itself that the qualification is one within the meaning of the said Schedule.

Every such applicant shall, if any diploma lodged by him is in a language other than English, lodge with the Registrar a certified translation thereof by such person or persons as the Board may from time to time determine. 9. Every applicant for registration shall attend in person before the Board at any or every meeting when his application is being considered, and at such other meetings as the Board may require, and answer all such questions as may be put to him, and shall also supply in writing all such information and evidence as the Board may from time to time require.

The Board may require any applicant to answer questions, or supply information or evidence on any matter, either verbally or in writing, under oath or affirmation or otherwise.

10. Every person applying to have his name restored to the Register, under Section 10, Sub-section (4) of the Act, shall supply such written or verbal explanation as the Board may require, and pay a fee not exceeding two guineas.

11. Every person applying, under Section 14 of the Act, to have a higher degree or qualification registered, shall supply such evidence of such higher degree or qualification as the Board may require, and pay a fee of five shillings.

REGISTER.

12. The Register shall be kept by the Registrar in the manner and form contained in Schedule B hereto.

13. Any person may, on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d., inspect the Register at any time between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., at the office, or (if there be no office) at the residence of the Registrar.

Complaints.

14. The name of any medical practitioner who is convicted of any felony or misdemeanour, under Section 12 of the Act, shall be erased from the Register on proof to the Board, by production of a certified copy of the conviction, or of an affidavit or declaration or certificate from any officer of the Court or Tribunal before which such medical practitioner was so convicted.

15. The name of every medical practitioner convicted of any offence other than felony or misdemeanour as aforesaid, and which in the opinion of the Board renders him unfit to practise, shall be erased from the Register, unless such medical practitioner shall personally show cause to the contrary to the satisfaction of the Board.

16. Every medical practitioner charged by the Board of infamous conduct in a professional respect shall have served upon him personally, or posted to him to his address in the Register, or if there be no such address, to his last known address in Western Australia, notice of the nature of the charge and of a date (not being less than 14 days from such service or posting) when such charge will be heard by the Board and considered.

The President may, upon the application of any medical practitioner so charged, extend the time for hearing such charge.

17. At the meeting of the Board at which such charge is heard, the same may thereupon be dealt with forthwith, or the Board may from time to time adjourn the hearing to such dates and hours and places as to it may seem meet.

18. Every medical practitioner so charged may apply to the Registrar to issue a summons for the attendance or production of any person or documents whom or which it may be desired to call or produce. Such summons shall be in one of the Forms C and D in the Schedule.

UNDER the provisions contained in Section 24 of "The Public Health Act" (50th Vic., No. 19), and amendments thereto, the Local Board of Health of the Municipality of York, by the powers therein contained, do hereby make the following By-Laws for the abatement and prevention of Nuisances, and for securing the Healthfulness of the Municipality of York.

General By-laws.

No. 1. Words used in these by-laws and having meanings assigned to them by the 50th Vic., No. 19, Section 2, as amended by 55 Vic., No. 22, shall have the same meaning in these by-laws.

No. 2. The Local Board of Health may from time to time appoint any place or places, within the Municipality of York or elsewhere, for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter, and may at any time cancel or vary such appointment; and the inspector of the said Board may, at all times, have free ingress and egress upon the said places, and such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in carrying out the above-mentioned Act. No. 3. No person shall deposit, place, or put any nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter whatsoever from any house, stable, cowhouse, lane, yard, or other premises, in the Municipality of York, in any place within the said municipality, other than the place or places appointed by the Local Board of Health for such purpose under the last section, except in such box or receptacles as the Board may from time to time authorise.

No. 4. No person shall exercise or practise, or be in any manner concerned in the business of a nightman, or drive any night cart within the limits of the Municipality of York, until after and unless he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector of the Local Board of Health.

No. 5. Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman, whether as master or labourer, or otherwise, shall make an application for a license so to do, at the inspector's office, which application shall be in writing, and shall be signed by two or more respectable householders, certifying the fitness of the applicant to hold such license; and such license he shall, upon presentation of such certificate, and registry being made of his true name and place of abode, be entitled to receive; provided it shall be lawful for the inspector to refuse to issue such license to any person who shall have been convicted of any offence against the provisions herein contained.

No. 6. Nightman's licenses shall be in the form contained in the schedule hereto annexed (marked A), or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the said Local Board.

No. 7. Nightman's licenses shall be of two kinds, namely, masters' licenses and labourers' licenses; and every license, of whatever description, and at whatever period of the year the same may be granted, shall remain in force only until the thirty-first day of December next ensuing; provided that, apart from or in addition to any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the said Local Board, upon being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman, whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel any such licenses or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as the said Local Board may think proper : and if such nightman shall, after such cancellation, or during the period of such suspension of his license exercise the duties of a nightman, he shall be subject to and liable, upon conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. 8. If any person, for the purpose of securing a nightman's license, shall use or employ, or shall cause to be inserted in such license any false or fictitious name, or description of his place of abode, he shall be subject to the penalty described herein for offences against the provisions hereof, and such license shall be cancelled.

No. 9. Whenever any licensed nightman shall change his place of abode he shall, within two days next after such change of abode, give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector, specifying his new place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse thereon a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

No. 10. Every licensed nightman, whenever or so long as he shall be engaged in removing any nightsoil, or other offensive matter or thing, or in driving any nightcart, or otherwise in conducting the said business, shall carry with and about him his license, and shall produce and show the same whenever required by any person to do so; and such license he shall on no pretence whatever lend or part with to any person.

No. 11. Every licensed nightman, before using any cart or other carriage as a nightcart, shall register the same in such manner as the said Local Board may direct, in the office of the Inspector, and shall receive a memorandum of the number assigned to such cart; provided that no such registration of any nightcart shall be made unless and until such cart shall have been inspected by the Inspector or other officer appointed for that purpose by the Local Board of Health, and certified by him to be fit and suitable for the purpose of a nightcart.

No. 12. Every licensed nightman shall, whilst using any cart or other carriage as a nightcart, have painted, and kept at all times conspicuous, on the right side thereof, white upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman" in letters not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and the number assigned to such cart in figures of not less than four inches in length, of proportionate breadth.

No. 13. Every nightcart shall be kept by the owner thereof watertight and free from leakage, and shall be provided with covering, so as effectually to prevent any splashing or spilling of anything carried therein.

No. 14. Every licensed nightman shall, within twentyfour hours of demand made for that purpose by the person responsible for such cleansing, as hereinafter mentioned, or by any person authorised in that behalf by the Local Board, properly cleanse any cesspool or earth closet or bucket kept for the reception of nightsoil, dustbin, or other offensive matter, and shall be entitled to and charge therefor from the occupier of the premises the sum that shall be fixed by the Local Board from time to time, of which due notice shall be given in at least one local paper. If any licensed master nightman shall without which due notice shall be given in at least one local paper. If any licensed master nightman shall, without good, just, or lawful excuse, neglect, decline, or refuse to properly cleanse any such cesspool, earth closet, bucket, dustbin, or other offensive matter as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a breach of these by-laws, and may be proceeded against for every such offence before two Justices of the Peace for the distnict Peace for the district.

No. 15. Any licensed master nightman, or licensed labourer, or other person who shall ask or demand, or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, a sum greater than that fixed by the Local Board from time to time provided in section (14), shall be guilty of an offence accent these by large offence against these by-laws.

No. 16. No privy or cesspool shall be emptied, nor any nightsoil carted away, nor any offensive liquor or matter of any kind whatever pumped out of or removed from any house or premises whatever, within the said Municipality, between the hour of 5 am and the hour of 11 pm of any between the hour of 5 a.m. and the hour of 11 p.m. of any day.

No. 17. The word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who, for remuneration, shall remove, or assist to remove, any nightsoil or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever, and the words "night cart" shall mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any nightsoil, ammoniacal liquor, or other offensive liquor or substance.

No. 18. The occupier or occupiers of premises whereon earth closets, or buckets, or other receptacles above ground are kept for the reception of nightsoil, shall keep the same clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause them to be cleaned at least once a week, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

No. 19. Every bucket, or pan, or other receptacle kept for the reception of nightsoil shall be first approved by the Inspector, and shall at all times be free from leaks and holes, and shall have affixed thereto a handle working on each side.

No. 20. Every closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house or occupied building, and every person having or building a closet contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

No. 21. No closet shall be erected except in such a position as shall be approved by the Inspector or other officer appointed by the Local Board of Health; and any person being guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

No. 22. Any person who shall lay, cast, or throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast, or thrown any bottle, bottles, broken glass, china, crockery, empty tins, or other rubbish or refuse in or upon any carriage way, footway, street, reserve, or other public place within the District of the said Local Board shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace for the District, forfeit and pay for the first offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, for the second offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and for the third and subsequent offence not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence.

No. 23. Whenever in these by-laws any act, deed, matter, or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed, matter, or thing is unrected to be done, or any act, deed, matter, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, comply, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing, or prevent being done any act, deed, matter, or thing shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws; and in determining the responsibility of the person against whom any proceedings may be taken under the by-laws, it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person is the occupier of the premises where on the offence is committed.

For every offence against any of the provisions No. 24. of these by laws to which no fixed penalty is attached herein, the offender shall, upon conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. 25. All penalties recoverable under these by-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Vict., No. 19.

BY-LAWS.

THE following By-Laws shall have force and effect within the Municipality of Southern Cross :-

1. All dwellings, tenements, shops, stores, hotels, offices, schools, hospitals, or other buildings shall be provided by schools, hospitals, or other buildings shall be provided by the owner, occupier, or agent with a sufficient number of substantially constructed closets, and every closet must be provided with a sufficient number of pans placed in a position approved by the Inspector of the Local Board of Health; and the owner, occupier, or agent shall keep all closets and pans in good sanitary order, and provided with trap doors facing right-of-way, and shall have all pans emptied at least once a week, or as often as may be required by any officer of the Local Board of Health.

2. All dwellings, tenements, shops, stores, hotels, offices, schools, hospitals, and other buildings shall be provided with proper rubbish pits, boxes, or pans of a size and pattern to be approved of by the inspector, and all rubbish shall be placed therein; provided always, that such an accumulation of rubbish shall not exist so as to be a nuisance.

The owner, occupier, or agent shall cause to be emptied any rubbish pit, box, or pan used on the premises at least once a week, or oftener if required by direction of an officer of the Local Board of Health.

3. No noxious or dangerous trade shall be permitted within the limits of the Municipality.

- (a.) In the event of a death or accident necessitating the slaughter of horses, cattle, sheep, or any other animals within the Municipality, such slaughter shall not take place, except under a special permit in writing for each and every case, which shall be obtained from an officer of the Local Board of Health.
- (b.) Such permit shall only be granted on the con-dition that all carcases, offal, or any other nuisances shall be conveyed away to the area to be defined in such permit; and in each and every case such carcase shall be burnt and thoroughly destroyed by the owner or other person in charge of such cattle, horses, sheep, or any other animals.

4. Upon receipt of a report from the medical officer of the Local Board of Health that a nuisance exists or is likely to be caused in any portion of the Municipality, the

officer of the Board shall at once proceed to carry out the instructions of the medical officer; and all costs, expenses, and charges incurred by the officer of the Board in carrying out the order or direction of the health officer shall be recoverable at law from the owner or occupier of, or agent for, the premises upon which the nuisance existed or is likely to be caused.

5. No person shall burn or destroy rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substances within the limits of, or so closely adjacent to the limits of, the Municipality if any such burning or destroyal creates, or is likely to create, a nuisance. Provided always, that if in the opinion of the health officer any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, he may give authority in writing for burning same.

6. All dwellings, tenements, shops, stores, hotels, offices, schools, hospitals, town lots (whether regularly occupied or not), shall be kept and maintained in such sanitary order as shall satisfy the medical officer; and all orders given by the medical officer for the prevention or removal of a nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent forthwith, though nothing shall prevent the medical officer from having a nuisance removed without notice, and the cost incurred in such removal shall be borne by the owner, occupier, or agent of the property upon which any nuisance

may exist. 7. All expenses incurred in removing or abating a nuis-ance shall be borne by the owner, occupier, or agent of the premises upon which such nuisance exists; and, failing the payment of all such charges on the demand of the officer of the Board, such officer shall sue for the recovery of all charges and costs with or without further notice.

8. Any person or persons found creating a nuisance shall be liable to prosecution without notice; and, if required under the order of the health officer, shall remove such nuisance forthwith, and shall pay full charges and costs of removal.

9. In case of breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance shall, on conviction before any Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than (5s.) five shillings nor more than (£10) ten pounds.
