#### MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

BY-LAW No. 21.—To require Lights to be carried on Vehicles by night.

Any person who, between sunset and sunrise, from and after the first day of May, 1895, shall in upon, or along any public street or lane within the Municipality of Coolgardie, drive or cause to be driven any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, without having a suitable lamp securely fixed and lighted at the off-side of the front of such vehicle, or shall drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, or of persons only, without having a suitable light securely fixed and lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle, shall be liable to a penalty, upon conviction, not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such offence.

The above By-law No. 21 (of The Municipal Institutions Act) was duly made and passed by the Council on the 19th day of March, 1895, two-thirds of the members of the Council being present.

#### High School Entrance Scholarships.

THESE Scholarships were established in order to enable boys of superior merit in the Elementary Schools of the Colony to continue their studies in a Higher Grade School. Unfortunately of late years these Scholarships have seemed to fail in their original object, the failure being instanced in the very meagre competition resulting at the annual examination. It has been thought that this apparent backwardness on the part of parents to obtain for their sons a superior education may have resulted from their inability to afford the extra expenses (school fees, travelling expenses, &c.) attendant on the residence of the boys at the High School.

With a view to remedy this difficulty, the Government has decided to try the experiment of increasing the Scholarships offered for competition in 1895 from £50 to £75.

The Minister hopes that this action on the part of the Government to try and popularise these Scholarships will meet with increased competition and emulation on the part of the youth of the Colony.



LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

By-law No. 5--to compel the use of Disinfectant.

- 1. The owner, occupier, or any person having the management or control of any house or premises, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Coolgardie, shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a box containing dry earth, ashes, sawdust, or such other material as the Council may approve, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.
- 2. Every person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings upon conviction of such offence, and to a further

penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such refusal or neglect shall occur or be continued.

The above By-law No. 5 of the Health Act was duly made and passed by the Local Board of Health on the 19th day of March, 1895, two-thirds of the members of the Board being present.
