By His Excellency Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under the provisions of "The Hospitals Act, 1894" (58 Vic., No. 20), the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare any place or places deemed suitable, and provided for the purposes of an hospital or institution for the cure of disease or for the relief of diseased persons, to be a Public Hospital: And whereas a building has been provided on the Public Reserve, Number 2908, at Coolgardie, for an Hospital: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said building should be proclaimed a Public Hospital: Now Therefore I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby, by this my Proclamation, declare the building aforesaid to be a "Public Hospital" within the meaning of "The Hospitals Act, 1894."
