By His Excellency SIR ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

THEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, made and passed in the Twenty-seventh year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 21, intituled "An Ordinance for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim, and do hereby constitute a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands to be holden on the second Thursday in July next, and thenceforward on the second Thursday in each month, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, at Yalgoo, in the Yalgoo Goldfield District.

Roads Board By-Laws.

THE following By-Laws are published in accordance with the provisions of Section 64 of "The Roads Act, 1888."

PLANTAGENET ROADS BOARD—NEW BY-LAWS, 1895.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1888," Section No. 62, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Board to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal such By-Laws as to it shall seem meet, &c., &c., and it is furthermore enacted, in Section 64, that such By-Laws, when confirmed by the Governor, and published in the Government Gazette, shall have the force of law: Now, pursuant to the powers contained in the above Act, it is ordered and directed by the Board that the following By-Laws shall, from and after their confirmation and publication as aforesaid, be new By-Laws of the Board, in addition to those already in force:—

Interpretations.

- 1. The following words shall have the meaning assigned to each respectively:—
 - "Board" shall mean the Plantagenet Roads Board.
 - "Act" shall mean "The Roads Act, 1888."
 - "District" shall mean the Plantagenet Roads District.
 - " ${\it Team}$ " shall mean any vehicle drawn by oxen, horses, or camels, or any of them.
 - "Tire width" shall mean the collective width of all the wheels of a vehicle (for instance, a wagon of four wheels with three-inch tires shall have a collective tire width of 12 inches).
 - "Road" shall mean main road within the meaning of the Act.
 - "Bridge" shall mean any bridge or culvert within the Plantagenet Roads Board District.

TO PROTECT ROADS FROM BEING UNDULY DAMAGED.

2. Any carrier, owner, employer, or other responsible person or persons driving or employing a driver driving a team on any road in the district who shall load, or cause to be loaded, more than five hundredweight to each inch of tire width of the vehicle he drives or causes to be driven, shall, so soon as a period of three months elapses after the confirmation and publication of this By-Law, forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty of not less than Ten shillings and not exceeding Five pounds for the first or any following offence against this By-Law.

TO PROTECT BRIDGES FROM FIRE.

3. Any person or persons who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board) or shall place any bushes, blackboy tops, rushes, or any other inflammable material under or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place or for any other purpose, shall, after the confirmation and publication of this By-Law, forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds for the first or any following offence against this By-Law.

To facilitate the Publication of By-Laws and Notices.

4. Any exhibition of By-Laws of local application required by Section No. 64 of the Act shall be deemed to be complied with and fulfilled by the Board after they have affixed or caused to be affixed, and by keeping so affixed to a notice board set up at the entrance gate or gates (if any), or otherwise at some conspicuous place at any railway station, siding, or bridge, a copy of the By-Laws referring to roads which the aforesaid railway stations, sidings, or bridges are in juxtaposition or are the terminal points.

DIEECTIONS FOR SENDING SAMPLES.

- 1. Send from Soz. to 4oz. of each sample.
- Do not crush the sample unless you wish to send an average from a large quantity.
- Wrap each sample separately in strong paper, enclosing a piece of white paper with the number of the sample and your own name.
- 4. Address the parcel to "The Government Assayer, Perth."
- Send a letter at the same time to the same address, stating for what metals you desire the samples to be assayed, and enclosing the fees.
- 6. Always retain duplicate samples of whatever you send, marked with the same numbers, and dated.
