WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," the Governor is empowered with the advise of the Executive Council, amongst other things, to declare and proclaim any adjoining defined portion of any District, not being part of a town, to be united with any Municipality: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that pertion of the District of Toodyay adjoining the Municipality of Northam, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form a portion of the Northam Municipality:—

Bounded on the East-North-East by part of the East-North-East boundary of Avon Location P5; on the South-South-East by the South-South-East side of Streatham Street being parallel to and at the distance of 14 chains 51 links North-North-West from the South-South-East boundary of said Avon Location P5; on the West-South-West by the West-South-West side of Burn Street, being parallel to and at the distance of 55 chains 11 links West-South-

West from the aforesaid East-North-East boundary of said Avon Location P5; and on the North-North-West by the right bank of the Avon River.

HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Administrator, to set apart Temporary Quarantine Stations near Perth and Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as Temporary Quarantine Stations near Perth and Fremantle respectively, for the purposes of the said Act, the localities known as "Perry's Limekiln Paddock" and "Davilak Paddock."

A PROCLAMATION.

ft.s. H. W. NORMAN. Governor.

By His Excellency General Sir Henry Wylle Norman, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Governor and Com-mander-in-Chief of the Colony of Queensland and its Dependencies its Dependencies.

HEREAS By an Act passed in the thirtieth year VV of Her Majesty's Reign, and numbered 19, intituled the "Diseased Animals Act," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to prohibit or put restrictions on the introduction or importation of cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, and other animals, or of any one or more kind of animals into the Colony of Queensland, or into any district thereof, from such places and during such time as may appear necessary, and any such Proclamation to alter or revoke by a similar Proclamation: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to prevent the introduction of cattle suffering from tuberculosis and of horses suffering from glanders and farcy, which diseases are readily communicable from cattle and horses, respectively, to the human subject: And whereas tuberculin has been found to be an almost infallible diagnostic of tuberculosis, and mallein an equally effective diagnostic of glanders and farcy: Now THEREFORE I, Sir HENEY WYLLE NORMAN, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the pro-visions of the said Act, and by and with the advice of the

Executive Council, do hereby notify and declare that, until this my Proclamation shall have been altered or revoked, all cattle arriving from any place beyond the Colonies of Australia, Tasmania, and New Zealand shall, on arrival, be subjected by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to a tuberculin test, and all horses be subjected to a mallein test, and that if any of such cattle or horses shall be found to react to such test they shall either be returned to the places from which they were shipped or be destroyed or shall from which they were shipped or be destroyed, or shall otherwise be dealt with as the Minister charged with the administration of the above-named Act shall direct.

Kobinson's Despatch No. 6 of the 16th January, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council applying certain provisions of the Patent, Designs, and Trade Marks Acts, 1883 to 1888, to Western Australia.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Acts, 1883 to 1888, it is, amongst other things, provided-

That if Her Majesty is pleased to make any arrange ment with the Government or Governments of any Foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs, and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade mark in any such State, shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under the said Act, in priority to other applicants, and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in such Foreign State.

Provided that his application is made in the case of a patent within seven months, and in the case of a design or trade mark within four months from his applying for protection in the Foreign State with which the arrangement is in force.

Provided that nothing in the aforesaid provision contained shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the date of the actual acceptance of his complete specification, or the actual registration of his design or trade mark in this country as the case may be.

The publication in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the respective periods aforesaid of any description of the invention, or the use therein during such periods of the invention, or the exhibition or use therein during such periods of the design, or the publication therein during such periods of a description or representation of the design, or the use therein during such periods of the trade mark, shall not invalidate the patent which may be granted for the invention or the registration of the design or trade mark.

The application for the grant of a patent or the registration of a design or the registration of a trade mark under the said provisions must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under the said Act: Provided that in the case of trade marks any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under the said Act.

And it is further provided-

That where it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the Legislature of any British possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs, and trade marks patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to apply the provisions first recited with such variations or additions, if any, as to Her Majesty in Council may seem fit to such British possession.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Empress of India that the Legislature of the Colony of Western Australia has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs, and trade marks patented or registered in this country.

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said Acts, doth declare, and it is hereby declared, that the provisions of the said Acts hereinbefore specified shall apply to the Colony of Western Australia.

And it is further ordered and declared that this Order shall take effect, so far as regards patents, at the expiration of seven months, and so far as regards designs and trade marks at the expiration of four months from the date of this Order.


