ALEX. C. ONSLOW. (L. S.)

By His Excellency Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," it is provided that "the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, by Proclamation, declare any portion of the Colony or locality a Reserve for Native Game": Now THEREFORE I, Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the Leschenault Estuary, from its head to its entrance into the sea at Bunbury, to be a reserve for Native Game, and all shooting within such limits is strictly prohibited.

By His Excellency Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act,

1876," the Governor is empowered with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things, to declare and proclaim any adjoining defined portion of any district, not being part of a town, to be united with any Municipality: Now, THEREFORE, I the said Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of the district of York adjoining the Municipality of York, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form portion of the York Municipality:—

Bounded by lines starting from the East corner of Avon Location W, and extending South-South-East about 33 chains to the South side of Knott's Road, thence North-East partly along said side of said road to the South corner of Reserve 13A, thence West-South-Westalong the South-South-East boundaries of York Suburban Lot A3, and Avon Locations U and V to the starting point: And I do also, with the advice aforesaid, declare and proclaim that the said land so united shall form part of the South Ward of the said Municipality.

Bounded on the North-North-West by the South-South-East boundaries of Avon Locations Y 27, Y 26, Y 25, Y 24, and Y 23; on the West-South-West by the East-North-East boundaries of Avon Locations Y 21, Y 20, Y 19, and W, and a South-South-East line of about 33 chains from the East corner of said Location W to Knotts Road; on the South-South-East by a North-Easterly line partly along the South side of said road to the South corner of Reserve 13A, and an East-North-East line along part of the North-North-West boundary of Avon Location 40; on the East-North-East by the West-South-West boundary of Avon Location B to the Avon River, and by said River downwards to the East-North-East end of the North-North-West boundary.

Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 5), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks, as hereunder described, are now open for Dredging and Picking up of Pearl Shell, subject to the Regulations in force.

Description of Banks.

The Western shore of Freycinet Reach extending from the Northern extremity of Heirisson Prong Southwards to the Eastern extremity of Cararang Peninsula.






