WHEREAS a certain Townsite has been duly proclaimed a Townsite under the name and style of "Menzies," such Townsite consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the schedule hereto: AND WHEREAS such Townsite is included in and forms a portion of the North Coolgardie Goldfield: AND WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to except from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business, under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield: Now THEREFORE I, Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such Townsite from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business, under any Miner's Right or Business License, such Townsite being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield, to wit, "The North Coolgardie Goldfield." And I do order all persons, from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

#### MENZIES TOWNSITE.

Bounded by lines starting from the West corner of East Coolgardie Mining Lease 3059 and extending 133° 52' 15 chains 50 links along the South-West

boundary of said Lease, thence 226° 52' 1 chain 29 links, and 130° 52' 10 chains 75½ links along part of the North-West and the whole of the South-West boundaries of Mining Lease 3092, thence 127° 55' 49 chains, thence 217° 55' about 34 chains 71 links, thence 307° 55' about 68 chains 34 links, passing through the North-East boundaries of Mining Leases 3051 and 3050, thence 291° 56' 9 chains 56¾ links along the North-Eastern boundary of Mining Lease 1446, thence 66° 15' 8 chains 61½ links, and 318° 19' about 6 chains 66 links along parts of the Southern and Eastern boundaries of Mining Lease 1435, thence 46° 52' about 32 chains 39 links to the starting point. Excluding any lands now leased under the provisions of the Goldfields Act.

shall be lawful for the Governor to establish any Port or Sub-Port, and declare the limits thereof: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim all that piece of water, within a radius of five miles of the Red Beacon at the Western entrance of Eucla Harbour, to be a Port of the said Colony, and also to be a Warehousing Port, as provided by Section 126 of the said Act.

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WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Elementary Education Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1893," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to constitute Educational Districts, and to define and alter the Boundaries of any District: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Kt., Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the existing Boundaries of the Educational Districts of—

Northam,  
York,  
Toodyay,

And do declare them to be as set forth in the following Schedule.

#### AMENDMENT OF NORTH BOUNDARY OF NORTHAM EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *Northward* by a line starting from a spot on the summit of the Darling Range, situate due West from the South-West corner of Avon Location X, and extending East to said South-West corner, thence East-North-Easterly along its South-South-East boundary to its East corner, and thence North-East to the summit of Mount Pleasant, thence North to the East corner of Avon Location 296, and thence North-North-West, passing along part of the West-South-West boundary of Avon Location W, and the West side of the Bejoording Road to its intersection with the North-North-West boundary of Reserve 1296, thence due North to a point due East from Bolgart Spring, and thence due East.

#### BOUNDARIES OF YORK EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *West* by a due North line from the summit of Mt. Dale; on the *North* by a due East line extending from the West boundary to the West corner of Avon Location f, and East-North-East along its North-North-West

boundary and that of Avon Location J to its North corner thence due East; on the *South* by an Easterly line extending from Mount Dale to the West corner of Avon Location 26 thence East-North-East passing along its North-North-West boundary and that of Avon Location n to the Avon River, and along its left bank downwards to the North-North-West boundary of Avon Location H 2, and along its East-North-East to its North corner, thence East-North East to Mount Stirling; on the *East* by a North line from Mt. Stirling.

#### BOUNDARIES OF TOODYAY EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *West* by a South-South-Easterly line, extending from the 60-mile post on the road from Perth to New Norcia, in direction of the South-West-West corner of Swan Location 95, at Bailup; on the *North* by a due East line passing through Bolgart Spring; on the *East* by a due South line extending from the North boundary to a point on the Bejoording Road, situate at the North corner of Reserve 1296, thence Southward along the West side of road to the North-West corner of Avon Location W, thence East-South-East along part of its West boundary to the South-East corner of Avon Location 296, thence South to Mt. Pleasant; on the *South* by a South-South-Westerly line from Mt. Pleasant to the North corner of Avon Location Z, and along its North-North-West boundary to the South corner of Avon Location X, and thence due West.

### York Municipality.

#### A By-Law to regulate, by means of Standing Orders, the Proceedings of the Council of the Town of York.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," Section 40, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Council to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal such By-laws and Regulations as to them shall seem meet for regulating their own proceedings.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Town of York, that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted according to the following Regulations only, which shall be, and be called, the Standing Orders of the said Council.

#### ORDER OF PROCEEDING.

1. The business of the Council shall be conducted on all occasions with open doors.
2. The Council shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum, which quorum shall consist of not less than three members, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside; but if at the expiration of 30 minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present, the Council shall stand adjourned.
3. Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a chairman from the Councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor.
4. At all meetings of the Council, when there are not three members present, or when the Council is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than three members present, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
5. At all meetings of the Council the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read, as the first business of all meetings of the Council, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
6. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Mayor may make any communication to the Council, which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at any time.

#### LETTERS, PETITIONS, MEMORIALS.

7. Letters, petitions, and memorials shall then be read.
8. Tenders for work shall be considered immediately before the orders of the day are called on, after which reports of committees shall be laid on the table.

#### ORDERS OF THE DAY.

9. The orders of the day shall be numbered, and disposed of in the order in which they appear on the paper, reports of committees being numbered as the first orders for the day.
10. Any member of the Council may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the town clerk at least seven days previous to the meeting at which it is intended to consider the same, and the substance of such notice shall be communicated by the town clerk to the members of Council in the summons for such meeting, and all such notices of motion shall be considered orders of the day.
11. No order of the day shall be proceeded with when called on unless the member who gave the notice, or some member authorised by him in writing to proceed thereon, be present, but the same shall lapse in the order in which they stand on the paper.
12. If, at any adjournment of the Council, any orders of the day on the notice paper have not been called on, such orders of the day shall be set down on the notice paper for the next sitting day, at the end of the regular business.

#### ORDERS OF DEBATE.

13. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise in his place uncovered and address the Mayor, or other presiding officer, and no member, when speaking, shall be interrupted unless called to order, in which case he shall sit down, and the member calling to order shall in the first place name the standing order on the strength of which he rises, and if found to be correct by the Mayor or other presiding Chairman, shall be heard in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.
14. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall put it in writing, and sign and deliver it to the Mayor, or other presiding chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Mayor, or other presiding chairman, shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.
15. Any member may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by simply notifying that such order is disobeyed.
16. The members, in speaking, shall designate each other by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be; the Mayor, or other presiding chairman, shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.
17. No member shall speak twice upon the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion, of which he may then have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried; nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply; the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.
18. The Mayor, or other presiding chairman, shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time upon the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
19. Any member moving a motion of amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question, but any member who may have signed the proposition paper, either as proposer or seconder, to enable the reports of the Committee of Council to be put to the vote for adoption or otherwise by the Council, shall not be held to have spoken thereon by such act, but may address the Council on matters contained in such reports.
20. Any member moving a suspension of the standing orders, or any of them shall be entitled simply to state the grounds of such motion, and the nature and objects of the motion which he may seek to make thereon, but no discussion shall take place upon any such motion.
21. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives to any other member, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

22. Any member may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a member, immediately upon the same being used.

23. The Mayor, or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

24. Any member who shall use any expression capable, in the opinion of the Mayor or other presiding Chairman, of being applied offensively to any other member, shall be required by the Council to withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council.

25. No member shall converse aloud except to call to order, or make any noise or disturbance whilst any member is speaking, or while any other matter is being read or opened; and in case of such noise or disturbance being persisted in after the Mayor or Chairman has called to order, the Mayor or Chairman shall call upon the members making such disturbance, by name, and every such person will incur the displeasure and censure of the Council.

26. When the Mayor or Chairman is putting a question, no member shall walk out or across the Chamber; nor when a member is speaking, shall any member hold discourse to interrupt him except to order, nor pass between him and the Chair.

27. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Corporation relating to the question or matter under discussion.

28. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

29. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

30. The Mayor, or other presiding Chairman, shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

31. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any member of the Council may call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats. All division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

32. No member shall reflect upon any vote of the Council, except for the purpose of moving such vote to be rescinded.

33. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

34. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year unless a call of the whole Council has been duly made for the purpose, and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council—which shall have been negatived by the Council—shall again be entertained during the same municipal year, unless by consent of at least six members of the Council.

35. A debate may be adjourned on motion without any previous notice of motion duly seconded, and without discussion, either to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

36. The member upon whose motion any debate shall be adjourned by the Council shall be entitled to pre-audience on the resumption of the debate.

37. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

38. Every member present in the Council when the question is then put will be required to remain and vote.

39. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes of proceedings.

#### SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

40. In cases of urgent necessity any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least the majority of the Council.

41. Every member of the Council who shall commit a breach of any section of this "part" of these By-Laws, or who shall move or attempt to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter as to which the Council has no legal jurisdiction, or who shall in any other way raise or attempt to raise any question, or shall address or attempt to address the Council on any subject which the said Council has no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who shall use any other language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be held disorderly, or who shall say or do anything calculated to bring the Council into contempt, shall be deemed to be out of order.

42. The Mayor may, without the interposition of any other member of the Council, call any Councillor to order whenever, in the opinion of such Mayor, there shall be a necessity for so doing.

43. Every member of the Council shall have the right of calling the attention of the Mayor to any motion, amendment, statement, argument, or observation moved, raised, or made by any other member which such first-named member may consider out of order.

44. A Councillor called to order shall withdraw while the question of order is being discussed and decided on, unless specially permitted to offer an explanation, retraction, or apology; but on obtaining such special permission such Councillor may explain, retract, or apologise for the matter or remark alleged to be out of order, and if such explanation, retraction, or apology be deemed satisfactory, no further discussion on the question of order shall be permitted.

45. If any Councillor, on being called to order, shall ask such permission to explain, retract or apologise, as aforesaid, the Mayor may, on his own authority, grant or refuse such permission as he may think fit, unless any Councillor shall require the sense of the Council to be taken on this question. In such case it shall be the duty of the Mayor to take the sense of the Council at once, without discussion, as to whether such permission shall be granted, and when any such explanation, retraction, or apology shall have been made or offered by permission of the Mayor, the latter shall in like manner decide, or if required to do so shall take the sense of the Council as to whether such explanation, retraction, or apology is considered sufficient; if such permission be refused, or if such explanation, retraction, or apology be considered insufficient, the question of order shall be considered and decided before any further business is proceeded with: Provided that if such Mayor shall have decided the question of order before any Councillor shall have required the sense of the Council to be taken in reference thereto, such question of order shall not be reopened; and provided further that nothing herein contained shall be held to affect the right of such Mayor to decide finally as hereinbefore provided upon any such point of order after the same shall have been discussed.

46. The Mayor, when called upon to decide points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he shall deem applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting upon the same.

47. Whenever it shall have been decided aforesaid that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected; and whenever said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

48. Any Councillor who shall have been called to order, and who, after having been twice directed to withdraw, as aforesaid, shall refuse to do so, or who shall persist in any line of conduct, or argument, or of observations which shall have been decided as aforesaid to be disorderly, or who shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as aforesaid when required so to do, or who shall be guilty of any other act of disorder, as defined by Section forty-one of this part of these By-laws, shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as a majority of the Councillors then present shall consider satisfactory, shall be liable, on conviction before two Justices of the Peace, for the first offence to a penalty of not less than ten shillings nor more than five pounds, and on second conviction for the like offence he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound nor more than ten pounds; and on a third conviction, and for every further conviction, for the like offence he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than two pounds, nor more than twenty pounds.

49. Whenever any Councillor shall have committed an offence under these By-laws, the Mayor or, in case of his absence, the Chairman presiding at the meeting when such offence was committed, shall forthwith lay or cause to be laid an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

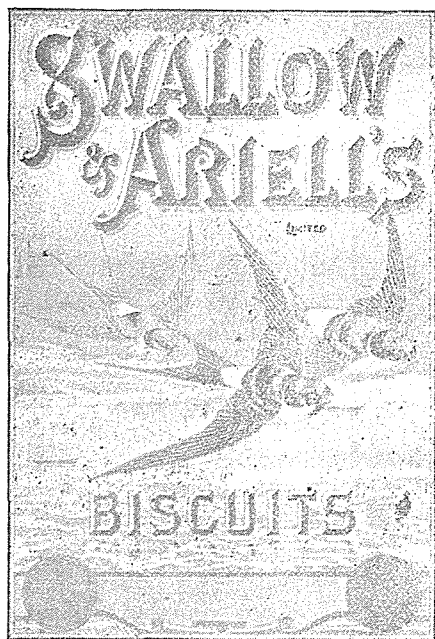

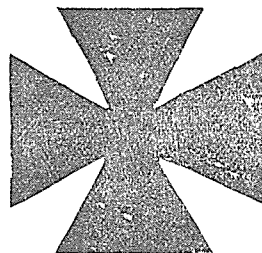

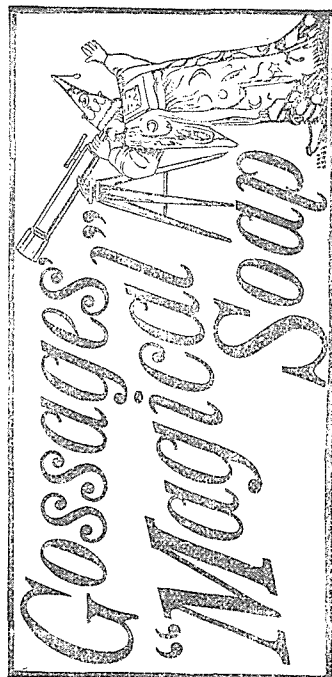
