WHEREAS by the 4th Section of "The Gold-fields Licensing Act, 1888" (52 Victoria, No. 13), it is enacted that whenever it shall appear to the Governor in Council that it is expedient that the provisions of the Act shall no longer apply to any Goldfield, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to direct that the said provisions shall no longer apply thereto, and, upon publication of such Proclamation, the provisions of such Act shall no longer apply to such Goldfield: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that it is expedient that the provisions of the said Act shall no longer apply to the East Coolgardie Goldfield: Now Therefore I, the Administrator of the Government, do hereby direct that, from the publication of this my Proclamation in the Government Gazette, the provisions of the said Act shall no longer apply to the Goldfield of East Coolgardie.




