PROCLAMATION

Mestern Australia, to wit.

ALEX. C. ONSLOW. (L.S.)

By His Excellency Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such district, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: Now, THEREFORE, I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following boundaries:—

Bounded on the North by a due East line produced from Mount Stirling; on the East by the 123rd meridian of East longitude; on the South by a due West line passing through Mount Ridley; and on the West by the 120th meridian of East longitude, shall be, and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

THE DUNDAS MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

AND, FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be for the future as follows:—

THE EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Yilgarn Goldfield, which lies on the 120th meridian of East longitude, due East from a spot situate one mile and a half North from Gullewa Spring, and extending East to a spot due North from the summit of Mount Malcolm; thence South to the said summit; thence in a Southerly direction to a spot

situate 25 miles East from survey post \hat{R} on the

Western side of Goongarrie Lake, at the 90-Mile diggings; thence in a South-Westerly direction to a point situate 5 miles West from the Black Flag diggings; thence South-Eastward to the North-East corner of Hampton Lands Company's Location No. 53; thence Eastward to the summit of Mount Belches; thence due South to a point due East from Mount Stirling; thence West to the said 120th meridian of East longitude, and along it North to the starting point.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered, inter alia, to sever by Proclamation any portion of a Municipality containing rateable

property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, and declare and proclaim it to be a New Municipality: And whereas it is necessary, in order to determine the constitution of the Municipal Council, that the population of the locality to be proclaimed a Municipality shall be declared by the Governor: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Administrator in Executive Council that that portion of the Fremantle Municipality situate on the North side of the river Swan, known as North Fremantle, contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of that portion of the Fremantle Municipality on the North side of the river Swan, known as North Fremantle, to be over One thousand and not exceeding Five thousand: And I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation, sever North Fremantle, on the North side of the river Swan, from the Fremantle Municipality, and declare and proclaim it to be a New Municipality, under the name, style, and title of "North Fremantle."

HEREAS by the provisions of "The Explosives Act, 1885," it is made lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, from time to time, by Order published in the Government Gazette, to prohibit absolutely, or to subject to certain conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation, conveyance or sale of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that, in the judgment of the Governor in Executive Council, it is expedient for

the public safety to make such an Order: Now THEREFORE I, Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Administrator of the Government of Western Australia, do, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, order as follows:—

No explosives shall be manufactured, kept, imported, conveyed, or sold, the physical or chemical condition of which is such as to render the said explosive unfit to pass into consumption, or when the packages containing same are imperfect or insecure.



## RULES

UNDER

## The Dentists Act, 1894

(58 Vic. 19).

WHEREAS by "The Dentists Act, 1894" (hereinafter called the Act) the Dental Board thereby constituted is empowered with the approval of the Governor in Council to make and prescribe such Rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned. AND WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council has nominated as the first Dental Board the following persons, namely:—Dr. Frank Tratman (President), Dr. Kelsall, Dr. Harvey, and Messrs. Bingay, Day, and Matheson.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to make and prescribe Rules under the Act: Now THEREFORE the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in them by and under the said Act, do hereby, by and with the approval of the Governor in Council, make and prescribe the following Rules:—

#### INTERPRETATION.

Section 2 of the  $\operatorname{Act}$  shall be read and construed together with the Rules.

## PART 1.—ELECTION.

1. The first election of members of the Board under section 5 of the Act shall be held on the first Tuesday in the month of December, 1897, and every election thereafter shall be held on the same day and month in each and every succeeding third year thereafter.

Every election to fill any vacancy in the Board, as provided by section 5 of the said Act, shall be held as soon as practicable after such vacancy occurs, and within not more than 28 days or less than 21 days after notice of such vacancy has been advertised as the Board may direct.

- 2. Every person desiring and being qualified to become a member of the Board, shall, not less than fourteen days before the date of an election, forward to the Registrar written notice of his intention to seek election, countersigned by at least two practitioners entitled to vote.
- 3. If there are no more candidates than the number of vacancies, such candidates shall be declared elected.
- 4. If there are more candidates than the number of vacancies, the Secretary shall, at least ten days before the day of the election, post to each person entitled to vote a ballot paper containing the names of all candidates. Such ballot papers shall be returned to the Registrar and be re-

ceived by him not later than 12 o'clock (noon) on the day of election, in envelopes sealed and endorsed "Ballot Paper." The names of any candidates for whom a voter votes shall be left intact, and the remaining names scored through with a pen or pencil. No person shall have more than one vote for each of the six vacancies. The Registrar, on the request of any person entitled to vote residing over one hundred miles from Perth may, at the expense of such person, send him by telegraph the name of every candidate for election, and such person may record his vote by prepaid telegram addressed to the Registrar.

- 5. All ballot papers and telegrams shall be opened by the President at a meeting of the Board to be held at the office of the Board at 11 a.m. on the day of election in the presence of any practitioners that may attend such meeting, and the candidates receiving the largest number of votes shall be declared elected. In case of an equality of votes between any one or more candidates the President shall give a casting vote or votes.
- 6. The six members of the Board elected at a triennial election shall take office on the first day of January following their election, and shall go out of office on the first day of January following the date of the next triennial election.
- 7. If a sufficient number of candidates be not nominated for election, or elected to fill any vacancy or vacancies, the President shall report such fact to the Governor in Council.
- S. The names of the successful candidates, and of every person nominated as a member of the Board under the provisions of the Act, shall be published in the Government Gazette as soon as practicable.
- 9. The omission by the Registrar to send or post to, or the non-receipt of any ballot paper by any person entitled to vote within the time aforesaid, or at all, shall not in any manner invalidate or affect the election.

#### PART II.—MEETINGS.

- 10. Ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held at the office of the Registrar on every first Thursday in every month at the hour of 8 p.m., or at such other place, date, and time as the Board may determine.
- 11. Special meetings shall be called by the Registrar whenever requested in writing by the President, or any two members, provided that three clear days notice of every such meeting shall be given by the Registrar to the members of the board.
- 12. If a quorum of members be not present within fifteen minutes of the time for which the meeting is convened, it may be adjourned to such time and place as those present shall determine.
- 13. At all meetings of the Board, voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot shall be called for by any two members present.
- 14. No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done or authorised by any meeting, shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of such intended rescision or amendment be given in the notices convening the meeting at which such rescision or amendment is proposed.
- 15. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar, and such minutes when signed by the Chairman of the same or any subsequent meeting, shall be binding and conclusive for all purposes.
- 16. If at, or within ten minutes of the time appointed for any meeting, the President be not present, the members may elect a Chairman at such meeting or until the President shall be present.
- 17. At all meetings the business shall be conducted in such manner as may be determined by "Standing Orders" from time to time.
- 18. The omission to post or deliver any notice of a meeting within the time aforesaid, or at all or the non-receipt thereof, shall in no manner affect or prejudice anything done or agreed to at any meeting.

#### REGISTRAR.

- 19. The Registrar shall (1) be appointed by the Board and hold office subject to these Rules, and during the pleasure of the Board.
  - (2.) Be in attendance at his office, or if there be no office, then at his residence or place of business, at such hours and days as the Board may from time to time direct.
  - (3.) Consult the President on any business requiring attention between the various meetings of the Board, and be responsible for the safe custody of all documents and property belonging to the Board.

- (4.) Find security to the satisfaction of the Board in the sum of £50.
- (5.) Present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and he shall also prepare and present to the Board a yearly balance sheet in the month of July in every year.
- (6.) Receive and be responsible for all moneys payable to the Board, and shall bank the same within 24 hours of the receipt thereof.
- (7.) Discharge such other duties as the Board may from time to time direct.

#### REGISTRATION.

- 20. Every person applying for registration as a dentist shall apply in writing, and make and forward to the Registrar an application in the form in the First Schedule, with necessary alterations.
- 21. Every application for registration shall supply in writing to the Board, or to the Registrar, all such information and evidence as the Board or Registrar, as the case may be, from time to time require; and shall when, and as often as required, attend in person before the Registrar or Board, and answer verbally, or in writing, all such questions as may be put to him.
- 22. Every person whose application for registration has been approved shall be entitled to a certificate in the form in the Second Schedule.
- 23. Every person applying for registration under Section 10, sub-section (e), shall pass such examination as the Board may from time to time direct.

Until otherwise determined, such examination shall be in the following subjects:—

Operative and Mechanical Dentistry. Pathology and Therapeutics and Metallurgy, so far as they relate to Dental Practice.

Anatomy of the Head and Neck, and Elementary Physiology (Huxley.)

24. Every person whose application for registration has been refused, and who desires to appeal under Section 11 of the Act, shall, within 14 days of such refusal, make written application to the Board for its reasons for such refusal.

#### APPRENTICES.

25. No person shall act as an apprentice or student to any dentist until he has entered into written articles of apprenticeship, which shall be produced to and registered by the Registrar within one month of the date thereof.

No service by an apprentice or student shall be counted or available except from the date of registration of the articles of apprenticeship.

26. No articles of apprenticeship shall be registered unless and until the apprentice or student therein named shall have passed such examination as the Board shall direct.

#### FEES.

27. The fees specified in the Third Schedule shall be payable and paid to the Registrar in respect of the matters in such Schedule mentioned.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

 $28.\,\,$  The Board may adopt a Seal as the Common Seal of the Board.

Such Seal shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar and deposited at the office of the Board.

Such Seal shall be affixed by the Registrar in the presence of any two members of the Board to any writing when authorised by a resolution of the Board, and not otherwise.

29. The Board may from time to time appoint and dismiss an examiner or examiners, and pay such remuneration as the Board thinks expedient.
