By His Excellency Sir Alexander CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any Town or locality containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, and declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality, and to define the boundaries of such Municipality: And whereas it is necessary, in order to determine the constitution of the Municipal Council, that the population of the Town or locality to be proclaimed a Municipality shall be declared by the Governor: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Administrator in Executive Council that the Town of Esperance contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the Town of Esperance to be under One thousand: And I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation, declare and proclaim the Town of Esperance to be a Municipality, under the name, style, and title of "The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Esperance," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:-

BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSITE OF ESPERANCE.

Bounded by lines starting from the shore of Esperance Bay at a point situate 9 chains 52 links

North, and 1 chain 52 links West from the South-East corner of East Location 1, and extending West 19 chains 61 links to the West boundary of said Location 1, and along it and the West boundary of East Location 4, North about 79 chains 67 links, thence East to the said shore of Esperance Bay, and along it Southward to the starting point.

Rewards for Destruction of Native Dogs. (47 Vict., No. 13, 1883.)

CIRCULAR.

THE attention of all Government Residents, Police and Resident Magistrates, and Justices of the Peace is called to the fact that it has come to the knowledge of the Government that divers ingenious artifices are resorted to by unscrupulous persons, in order to obtain the reward fixed by the law for native dogs' tails, such as the purchasing from natives of the tails of their dogs which are not destroyed, thus defeating the object of the Act; the artificial manufacture of what closely resemble native dogs' tails with bits of the skin of the dog, which, when green, are closely wound round a piece of sinew or a rat's tail, and the hairs neatly pointed at one end; the sending of tails from one district to another to secure the higher reward, and other devices of a like nature; every care should, therefore, be exercised in order to prevent fraud, in determining whether the tail produced is genuine, and that the dog from which it has been taken has been destroyed before the reward is paid.






