1897 PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, to wit.

ALEX. C. ONSLOW. (L.S.)

By His Excellency Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any town or locality containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, and declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality, and to define the boundaries of such Municipality: And whereas it is necessary, in order to determine the constitution of the Municipal Council, that the population of the town or locality to be proclaimed a Municipality shall be declared by the Governor: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Administrator in Executive Council that the Town of Menzies contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the Town of Menzies to be under One thousand: And I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation, declare and proclaim the Town of Menzies to be a Municipality, under the name, style, and title of "The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Menzies," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:

BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSITE OF MENZIES.

Bounded by lines starting from the West corner of East Coolgardie Mining Lease 3059, and extending 133° 52′ 15 chains 50 links along the South-West boundary of said lease; thence 226° 52′ 1 chain 29 links, and 130° 52′ 10 chains 75½ links along part of the North-West and the

whole of the South-West boundaries of Mining Lease 3092; thence 127° 55′ 49 chains; thence 217° 55′ about 34 chains 71 links; thence 307° 55′ about 68 chains 34 links, passing through the North-East boundaries of Mining Leases 3051 and 3050; thence 291° 56′ 9 chains 56¾ links along the North-Eastern boundary of Mining Lease 1446; thence 66° 15′ 8 chains 61⅓ links, and 318° 19′ about 6 chains 66 links along parts of the Southern and Eastern boundaries of Mining Lease 1435; thence 46° 52′ about 32 chains 39 links to the starting point, excluding any lands now leased under the provisions of the Goldfields Act.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.
Whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 30th July, 1868, made by ther Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862. Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the Merchant Ships of the United States of America the measurement whereof should after the 1st January, 1865, have been ascertained and denoted on the registers and other national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships, after making therefrom the same deductions, in respect of crew space and engine room, as would, if such ships were British, be made from their gross tonnage under the laws relating to British Ships.

And whereas by another Order in Council, dated the 19th March.

And whereas by another Order in Council, dated the 19th March, 1883, made in exercise of the aforesaid powers Her Majesty was pleased to direct as follows:—

- 1. As regards sailing ships, that Merchant Sailing Ships of the United States of America, the measurement whereof after the 5th August, 1882, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of Registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
- to be the tonnage of such ships.

 2. As regards Steam Ships:—that Merchant Ships belonging to the United States of America, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 5th day of August, 1882, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided nevertheless that if the owner or master of any such American steamship desires the deduction for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the American Rule, the engine room shall be measured, and the deduction according to the British rules.

 In the same manner of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is

deduction calculated according to the British rules.

And whereas by Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that, whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council, that the tomage regulations of that Act have been adopted by any Foreign Country, and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that Country shall, without being remeasured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tomage denoted in their Certificates of registry on other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tomage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tomage of that ship.

And whereas it has been made to among to Her Majesty in Council

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty in Council that the tomage regulations of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, have been adopted by the United States of America and such regulations are now in force there, having come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1895.

And whereas there still are or may be ships belonging to the United States of America to which the hereinbefore recited Orders of the 30th July, 1868, and the 19th March, 1883, may respectively apply, and it is expedient not to revoke the same, but to let the said recited Orders remain in force so long as there are any ships to which the same may so respectively apply.

And whereas the provisions of Section One of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with.

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, in pursuance and exercise of the powers hereinbefore mentioned, is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to direct that the Merchant ships of the United States of America the measurement whereof shall, after the 1st day of April, 1895, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of Registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

ADDITIONAL BY-LAWS OF THE YILGARN ROADS BOARD.

The Yilgam Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following additional By-laws:

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1888," and "The Amendment Act, 1889," the Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the District of Yilgarn, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Administrator in Council, that the following additional By-laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

- 1. That Kookerdine Tank, Sayer's Tank, and all other wells and tanks vested or that may become vested in the Board, shall be regulated as follows:
- 2. That no water shall be taken or carted from any of the wells or tanks, without first obtaining permission of the Board, under a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20.
- In the case of travellers they shall not take more than their water bags will hold, under a penalty of not less than 5s or more than £20.
- The following will be the scale of charges at the Board's discretion:
 - For every 100 gallons of water, 2s. 6d. 5.
 - For every drink for each head of horses or cattle, 1d.
 - For every drink for each head of camel, 11d.
 - For every 20 head of sheep, 6d.
 - No pigs will be allowed to water at any tank or well.
- No stock or teams are to camp at any one well or tank for more than 24 hours, under a penalty of not less than 5s. or more than £20.
- 11. Any person polluting any catchment, water course, pools, wells, dams, tanks, reservoirs, or other public waters in the Board's district shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20.

By-laws of the Guildford Local Board of $\frac{3 + 5.6}{6.5}$ Health.

OTICE is hereby given that the following By-laws for the Municipality of Guildford, under "The Public Health Act, 1886" (50 Vic. No. 19), have been confirmed by the Central Board of Health, and will come into operation from the 1st November, 1895.

1. The Board shall meet for general business at the Mechanics' Institute, or other recognised office of the Council, Guildford, on the first Thursday in each month at 7.30 p.m., and special meetings may be called at any time by the chairman or any two members of the Board. All meetings of the Board shall be conducted with open doors.

- 2. The duties of the Secretary and Inspector of Nuisances shall be—
 - To make himself thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886," and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board.
 - To visit occasionally, at uncertain times, the several quarters of the town, and, if necessary, give his advice to the occupiers of premises as to the prevention of nuisances and deodorising of offensive matter.
 - To keep a monthly record of all notices issued to abate nuisances and the result thereof, and all other clerical work pertaining to the office
- 3. After the 1st November, 1895, all premises within the boundaries of the town of Guildford shall, when required by the Local Board of Health, be provided with closets, and shall have, in accordance with this By-law, earth closets or privies only; and each seat of such closets or privies shall be of such height and width as shall be approved by the Health Inspector. Persons neglecting to comply with this By-law, within seven days after written notice under the hand of the Mayor has been served on them, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Five shillings for each day they neglect to comply with such notice.
- 4. After the 1st November, 1895, no water closets shall be erected in any house, nor shall any cesspools be constructed on any premises. Persons offending against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 5. Every bucket or pan kept for the reception of nightsoil shall be emptied and cleansed at least twice every week. Every occupier or owner offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five shillings for each such offence.
- 6. No person shall enter any premises within the boundaries of the Municipality of Guildford for the purpose of removing or burying, nor shall remove from off any premises, whether his own or otherwise, any nightsoil or the contents of any cesspool or cesspit, without first being licensed by the Council as a nightman. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.
- 7. Licenses granted to nightmen shall be revocable at the will of the Local Board of Health.
- 8. The Local Board of Health may, from time to time, appoint any place or places for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector of the said Board shall at all times have free ingress and egress upon the said places, and such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in the carrying out the above-mentioned Act.
- 9. Should any nightman neglect or refuse, without reasonable excuse, to properly clean any cesspool, water-closet, or earth-closet, or to remove any other offensive matter for twenty-four hours after demand from the Inspector, or any occupier of premises within the Municipality, he shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five shillings, and the Inspector or occupier may engage any other nightman for the service.
- 10. Nightmen's licenses shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto annexed marked A, or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the Board, and each nightman shall wear a badge to be supplied by and remain the property of the Local Board of Health.
- 11. Nightmen's licenses, at whatever period of the year they may be granted, shall remain in force only until the 31st day of December then next ensuing; provided that apart from any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the Board, upon being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel any such license, or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as to the Board shall seem fit; and if any such nightman shall, after such cancellation, or during the period of such suspension, practise such business as if under the authority of such license, he shall be subject, upon conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.
- 12. Any licensed nightman who shall ask or demand or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, any sum greater than that fixed by Schedule B of these By-laws, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

- 13. Every bucket or pan kept for the reception of night-soil shall be of iron, and shall be of a shape and size suitable for the purpose, and approved by the inspector.
- Every privy or closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house; and every person having or building a closet contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds. No nightsoil or other offensive matter shall be removed before 11 p.m. or after 5 a.m. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be subject, on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five pounds. tion, to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.
- 15. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, bottles, empty tins, or other rubbish in any street or other than the places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing the same, be subject also to a penalty of not more than Two pounds.
- 16. No occupier or owner shall cause or permit water other than storm water to flow from his premises into a street. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 17. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Vic., No. 19. Wherever in these By-laws the word Inspector is used, it shall be taken to mean the Inspector for the time being of the said Local Board, or anyone duly appointed to act in his place.

PURSUANT to Section 24 of "The Public Health Amendment Act, 1895," the following By-laws have been made by the Fremantle Local Board of Health, and confirmed by the Central Board of Health, and shall come into operation on the Twentieth day of December, 1895.

PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

By-law No. 1.

Every private hospital or lodginghouse within the meaning of the said Act approved by the said Local Board of Health, whether heretofore or hereinafter established within the district of such Local Board, shall be registered at the Office of such Local Board:

By-law No. 2.

Every license so obtained shall, subject to the powers of the said Board to cancel or revoke the same, be in force for 12 calendar months from the date of the granting thereof.

By-law No. 3.

The said Board shall have the power at any time, and whether in the case of a private hospital heretofore or hereafter established, to refuse to grant or to revoke or cancel any such license, if in the opinion of the said Board the same, whether by reason of the drainage therefrom or

from any other cause whatsoever, endangers or injuriously affects or is likely to endanger or injuriously affect persons or property in the neighbourhood thereof, or if default shall be made in the observance or performance of any of these or any other by-law or regulation for the time being in force under the said Act, or if in the opinion of the said Board the same is from any cause whatever, relating either to the building or to the conduct or management thereof, undesirable in the interests of public health.

By-law No. 4.

Any person opening, occupying, or conducting or keeping open, occupied, or conducted any private hospital after the making of these or any other by-laws or regulations hereafter to be made by the said Board under the said Act, unless such private hospital shall be duly registered, or after registration thereof has been revoked or cancelled, and any person nursing or otherwise assisting at any such private hospital after written notice that the same is opened, occupied, or conducted in contravention of this by-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such offence, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, the amount of any such penalty, within the limits aforesaid, to be in the dis-cretion of the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered.

By-law No. 5.

The said Board shall have power at any time, and whether in the case of a lodginghouse heretofore or hereafter established, to refuse to grant, or to revoke or cancel, any such license, if the provisions of the said Act, or of these or any other by-law or regulation for the time being in force under the said Act with regard to the construction, management, and conduct of any such lodginghouse, or in any way relating thereto, shall not be complied with, or shall be in any way contravened, or if, in the opinion of the said Board, the same is from any cause whatever, relating either to the building or the conduct or management thereof, undesirable in the interests of public health.

By-law No. 6.

Any person who shall be the keeper of, or have the charge or management of, any lodginghouse not duly registered under the said Act and these by-laws, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, the amount of any such penalty within the limits aforesaid to be in the discretion of the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered.
