By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Decondencies for Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS a certain townsite has been duly VV proclaimed a Townsite under the name and style of "Yalgoo," such townsite consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto: And whereas such townsite is included in and forms portion of the Yalgoo Goldfield: And WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to except from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield: Now THEREFORE I, Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such townsite from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, such townsite being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield, to wit, "The Yalgoo Goldfield": And I do order all persons, from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

TOWNSITE OF YALGOO.

Bounded by lines starting from the East corner of Murchison Mining Lease 504, and extending 50° 23′ 1 chain 13½ links, thence 132° 19′ 29 chains 99 links, thence 185° 15′ 36 chains 1¾ links, thence along the Railway Reserve from Cue to Mullewa 279° 51′ 15 chains 41½ links, 5° 15′ 2 chains

 $\frac{1}{2}$ link, and 279° 51′ 30 chains 83 links, thence 5° 15′ 6 chains \(\frac{1}{2}\) link, and 279° 51′ 30 chains 83 links, thence 5° 15′ 6 chains 56\(\frac{1}{4}\) links, to the South corner of Mining Lease 459, thence along various Mining Leases 44° 31′ 10 chains, 314° 31′ 6 chains, 44° 31′ 10 chains 83\(\frac{1}{2}\) links, 314° 31′ 7 chains 68 links, 63° 29′ 14 chains 27\(\frac{1}{4}\) links, 333° 29′ 1 chain 53\(\frac{1}{2}\) links, and 50° 23′ 10 chains 49\(\frac{1}{2}\) links to the starting point.

The Stock Diseases Act. 1895.

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, the 29th day of January, 1896.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place: And whereas that fearful scourge called "Tick" is known to exist to a large extent amongst cattle in Northern Queensland and the Northern Territory of South Australia: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation or introduction of cattle into this Colony from North of the 21st Parallel of South Latitude in Queensland, and from the Northern Territory of South Australia,

except as provided by No. 12 of the Regulations bearing date 15th January, 1896, gazetted in the Government Gazette of the 17th of January, 1896: PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS that this Order in Council shall not apply to cattle from the "Wave Hill" stations, situated about 80 miles from the Eastern boundary of Western Australia, for a period of six months from the date thereof; such cattle, however, being subject to inspection by an Inspector on introduction or importation.

12. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony, for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time, provided that such stock shall not by reason of such permission become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

With reference to the Earl of Derby's Circular Despatch of the 22nd May, 1883, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of an Order in Council dated the 21st November last respecting the tonnage admeasurement of ships of the Kingdom of Denmark.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS D AN Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1868, made by Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the ships of Denmark, the certificates of Danish nationality and registry of which were dated on and after the 1st October, 1867, should be deemed to be of the tomage denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry:

And whereas by another Order in Council dated the 30th day of December, 1878, Her Majesty was pleased to direct as regards Danish steamships that if the owner or master of any merchant ship belonging to the Kingdom of Denmark and measured after the 1st day of October, 1878, which is propelled by steam or any other power requiring engineroom, should desire the allowance for engine-room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and allowance applicable to British ships instead of under the Danish rule, the engine-room should be measured and the allowance calculated according to the British rules:

And whereas by another Order in Council dated the 20th day of

And whereas by another Order in Council dated the 20th day of April, 1883, Her Majesty was further pleased to direct that in the event of the net registered tonnage of merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Denmark, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room estimated under the British rules, being denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry issued on or after the 1st day of September, 1882, such ships should be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted in the said certificates:

And whereas by Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tomage regulations of that Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there. Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in

Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonuage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonuage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonuage of that ship:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the tomage regulations of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, and that such regulations are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1895:

And whereas there still are or may be ships belonging to the Kingdom of Denmark to which the hereinbefore recited Orders of the 29th February, 1868, the 30th December, 1873, and the 20th April, 1883, may respectively apply, and it is expedient not to revoke the same, but to let the said recited Orders remain in force so long as there are any ships to which the same may so respectively apply:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, Therefore, Her Majesty (in pursuance and exercise of the powers hereinbefore mentioned) is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to decree that the merchant ships of the Kingdom of Denmark, the measurement whereof shall on or after the List day of April, 1895, have been ascertained and denoted in the certificates of registry or other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.


