Altering Boundaries of the Eastern Goldfields, and Dividing North Coolgardie Goldfield into Districts.

# PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, }
to wit.

GERARD SMITH. (L.S.)

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to proclaim any portion of Crown Lands to be a Goldfield, and that the Boundaries of every Goldfield proclaimed may, from time to time, be altered or cancelled by the Governor by Proclamation: Now Therefore I, Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the existing Boundaries of the

### YILGARN GOLDFIELD,

and hereby proclaim the Boundaries of the said Goldfield to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point 90 miles South of a cairn H26, on Koorarawalye Granite Rock, and extending West to a point due South of a point 10 miles West of a cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence North to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence East-South-East to a point about 50 miles due West from a cairn marked NB (conjoined) 1 near Wangine Soak; thence South through the beforementioned cairn H26 to the starting point, excluding all town sites and fee simple lands within the said boundaries.

And with the like advice I do hereby alter the existing Boundaries of the

### COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD,

and hereby proclaim the Boundaries of the said Goldfield to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield (which is a point about 50 miles West from a cairn marked NB 1 near Wangine Soak) and extending South about 118 miles through a cairn H26 on Koorarawalye Granite Rock; thence East about 133 miles through the summit of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence North about 48 miles to a point 35 miles East of the South-East corner of Hampton Plains Location 48; thence West 35 miles to the South-East corner of the abovementioned Location; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of Locacation 48, Westerly 443 chains 91 links, Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of that Location Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, Westerly 119 chains 87 links to the South-West corner of Location 51 thence Northerly 400 chains along the Western boundary of Location 51 and the Eastern boundary of Location 53 to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along a surveyed line 324° 46′, 36 miles 1,481 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 46 links along a surveyed line to a tree R 3 near the Cane Grass Swamp on the 90-Mile Road; thence Westerly to a cairn marked NB 1 near Wangine Soak; thence Westerly about 50 miles to the starting point, excluding all town sites and fee simple lands within the said boundaries.

and hereby proclaim the Boundaries of the said Goldfield to be as follows:

Bounded on the North by an East and West line passing through the summit of a Granite Rock, near the 50-Mile Soak, on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; on the East by a Soak, on the Dundas and Lake Letroy Road; on the East by a North and South line through a point 52 miles East of Mount Ridley; on the South by an East and West line passing through the summit of Mount Ridley; on the West by the production South of the Western Boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield, excluding all townsites and fee simple lands within the said boundaries.

And with the like advice I do hereby alter the existing Boundaries of the

### NORTH COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD,

and hereby proclaim the Boundaries of the said Goldfield to be as follows:

Bounded by lines starting from the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield, and extending South to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence to the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield, which is a point about 50 miles West from Survey Station NB 1, near Wangine Soak; thence East to Survey Station NB 1; thence about 87° 20 miles 22 chains to Survey Station NB 3; thence East to the 125th meridian Fact Longitude. R 3; thence East to the 125th meridian, East Longitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East of the starting point; thence West to the starting point, excluding all townsites and fee simple lands within the said

And I hereby further declare that the aforesaid North Coolgardie Goldfield shall be divided into the following districts, viz.:-

### ULARRING DISTRICT.

### MENZIE'S DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from Survey Station NB 1 near Wangine Soak, and extending Easterly along part of the Southern boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield to Survey Station R 3; thence East along part of the Southern boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield about 49 miles 5 chains; thence North-North-Westerly to Survey Station R 43, between Yerilla and Niagara; thence North 12 miles, then North-West to a point on the Northern boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield; thence West along that boundary to the North-Eastern corner of the Ularring District; thence Southerly through a point 15 miles East of Mount Ida to the starting point.

### ANNO QUINQUAGESIMO NONO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

No. 39.

AN ACT to regulate the Width of Tires to be used on certain Vehicles, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, 12th October, 1895.]

DE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

IN this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

- "Local Authority" means the municipal council of any municipality as to roads within the limits of such municipality, the roads board of any district as to roads within such district, and as to all other public roads the Director of Public Works.
- "Vehicle" means and includes any wagon, dray, cart, or lorry, but does not include any vehicle intended solely to carry passengers.
- 2. ON and after the First day of May, One thousand eight Width of tires hundred and ninety-six, no person engaged in building, constructing, width of the prescribed selling, or making vehicles shall build, construct, or make, sell. or hire, or offer for sale or hire any vehicle, unless the width of the tires of such vehicle shall be in the following proportion to the diameter of the axle arms of such vehicle, namely:-

When the diameter of the axle arm is

upon any public road.

- 2 inches the width of the tire shall be 3 inches
- the width of the tire shall be  $3\frac{1}{2}$
- the width of the tire shall be 4
- the width of the tire shall be  $4\frac{1}{2}$ the width of the tire shall be 5
- ON and after the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, no person shall import into Western Australia any vehicle, the tires on the wheels of which vehicle are not of
  prescribed width. the width prescribed by or specified in the preceding section, and if any such vehicle be imported, no person shall use or employ it

4. ANY person offending against the provisions of either of the two preceding sections shall be liable for each and every such offence, against provisions of upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Penalty for using vehicles with tires not of prescribed

IF on or after the First day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, any person uses, employs, or drives upon the public roads any vehicle, the tires of the wheels of which vehicle are not of the width prescribed by section two of this Act, he shall be liable for each and every such offence, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Axle arms and wheels may be examined.

(1.) ON and after the First day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, any local authority, or the mayor or any councillor of a municipality, or any member of a roads board, or any officer of a municipality or roads board, or any officer or constable of the police force may measure and examine, or cause to be measured and examined, the axle arms, wheels, and tires of every vehicle in use on any public road, or imported into the Colony, or in the possession of any coach, carriage, or cart builder, or person having vehicles for sale or hire.

Penalty for refusing or obstructing examination.

(2.) Any person who refuses to allow any local authority or any officer or person as aforesaid to measure or examine the axle arms, wheels, or tires of any vehicle, or prevents or obstructs the measurement or examination thereof, shall be liable for each offence, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Vehicles to have diameter of axles, &c., painted on conspicuous part.

ON and after the First day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, every vehicle in use on any public road shall have the diameter of the axle arms painted on some conspicuous part on the off side thereof; and the owner of any vehicle who neglects to have such measurement painted as aforesaid, or who has the same so painted incorrectly, shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for each and every such offence a sum of not less than Five shillings nor more than Five pounds: And each and every day during which any vehicle shall continue to be used as aforesaid without having the measurement correctly painted as aforesaid shall be deemed a fresh offence.

By-laws, local

(1.) EVERY local authority may from time to time make authority may make. and prescribe, amend, repeal, or add to such by-laws as it thinks fit for carrying this Act into effect.

To state penalty for breach.

(2.) Such by-laws shall, where the nature of the case permits, state some maximum fine or penalty for any neglect or breach thereof, provided that no such fine or penalty shall exceed Ten pounds.

To be confirmed and published.

(3.) No by-law shall have any force or effect until the same shall be confirmed by the Governor and be published in the Government Gazette.

Evidence by Government Gazette.

(4.) The production of a copy of the Government Gazette containing any such by-law shall be conclusive evidence that such by-law was duly made and confirmed as aforesaid.

Summary procedure.

ALL offences against the provisions of this Act or the bylaws made thereunder, in respect of which any fine or penalty is imposed, may be heard and determined, enforced and recovered summarily before any two or more Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions.

Sections of Shortening Ordinance incorporated.

10. SECTIONS A, C, F, G, and H of "The Shortening Ordinance, 1853," shall be incorporated with and taken to form part of this Act to all intents and purposes, and in as full and complete a manner as if the said sections had been fully set forth in this Act.

THERE shall be an appeal from any conviction by Justices of the Peace for any offence against this Act, or from any order dismissing any information or complaint, or from any order for payment of money, whether for costs or otherwise; and the proceedings on such appeal shall be conducted and regulated in the manner prescribed by Part IX. of "The Police Act, 1892."

Appeal provided.

EXCEPT as hereinafter mentioned, every fine or penalty imposed for any offence against this Act or the by-laws made there- Appropriation of fees, etc. under shall be paid to the Crown, provided that when any such fine or penalty is imposed for any offence committed within the limits of a municipality or of a district constituted under "The Roads Act, 1888," one moiety of such fine shall be paid to the municipal council or roads board within the limits of whose municipality or district such offence was committed.

THIS Act may be cited as "The Width of Tires Act. Short Title. 1895."


