# Municipality of Norseman.

By-Law No. 4.—Officers of the Council.

The Chairman.

The Chairman shall have the custody of the common seal, and of all deeds and records of the Council, but he shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the Council.

# The Clerk of the Council.

- 2. The Clerk of the Council shall keep the books of the Council, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Council. He shall attend all meetings of the Council, issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Council or Chairman thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the Municipality, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act required; and shall make up and complete, under the direction of the Council, the rate book; and shall, under the like direction, prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all such books of account as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Council, cause the accounts of the said Council to be balanced half-yearly, as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Council, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all such other acts as the Council or Chairman thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Council office during such hours as the Council may determine.
- 3. The custody of the journals, and all documents whatsoever (except such documents as are hereinafter expressed to be kept by the Chairman) laid before the Council shall be in the care of the Clerk, who shall neither take, nor permit to be taken, any such journals or documents from the Chairman's or Council office, without the express leave or order of the Council.

# The Collector.

4. The Collector, for the time being duly appointed by the Council, shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him; and sums so received by the Collector of the Council shall by him be paid to the Treasurer at intervals of not exceeding seven days, or immediately upon the amount of money in hand at one time exceeding the sum of £20.

# The Treasurer.

5. The Treasurer shall receive from the other officers of the Council all moneys received by them on account of the Municipality and shall issue a receipt for same, and shall forthwith pay same into the bank to the credit of the proper account of the Municipality. The Treasurer shall keep a proper book of all moneys so received by him, and all bank lodgments, and shall supply the Clerk weekly with a copy of all moneys received and paid in by him as above, weekly.

Engineer and Surveyor.

6. The Engineer and Surveyor, for the time being duly appointed by the Council, shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, and he shall, from time to time, report to the Council the state of, condition, or repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Council, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

# Officer of Health.

7. It is the duty of the Officer of Health to superintend the application of all sanitary measures ordered by the

Local Board, and to advise them generally in all such matters.

- 8. The Officer of Health shall make frequent examination of the district under his control, and to see that the duties of the inspectors are efficiently performed and report any neglect of those officers to the Local Board immediately.
- 9. He is, pursuant to the powers contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition and affecting health, and, if found so, to give a certificate in accordance with Section 60 of the Act.

He is also required to examine premises where process of manufacture causing effluvia is carried on, and, if necessary, furnish the Local Board with the required certificate in accordance with Section 57.

He is also to inspect and furnish a certificate, if necessary, of any houses built for habitation, or of any overcrowding, in accordance with Sections 66 and 67.

He is also to assist the Local Board with his presence and advice, if necessary, in order to the carrying out of Section 31 referring to the sale of unwholesome food, and on all occasions to give them the benefit of his medical experience and skill.

- with the least possible delay any undue prevalence of disease in his district, whether general or locally, and, in the latter case, it will be his duty to attract the attention of the Local Board to the locality in order that remedial measures may be at once taken. He is also carefully to note the appearance in his district of any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease or indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstance affecting or likely to involve public health, and he shall immediately make a full report thereof to the Local Board, whose duty it will be immediately to forward his report to the Central Board of Health in accordance with Section 35; and the Health Officer is expected energetically to assist in carrying out and enforcing the Regulations of the Central Board for mitigating, as far as possible, and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases as detailed in Section 38.
- 11. The Officer of Health is to furnish the Local Board of his district, during the months of January and July in each year, with a tabulated report on the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of his district for that period, making any remarks and observations he may think proper, and a general report monthly.

The Officer of Health shall obey the orders of the Council.

# The Sanitary Inspector.

12. The Sanitary Inspector shall sytematically inspect all lands and premises within the Municipality or under the control of the Local Board or Council, shall take all necessary action in cases of any breach of the Health By-laws, and shall generally see to the carrying out of the provisions of the Health Act and the Health By-laws of the Council, shall issue all notices to discontinue or remove nuisances, and shall carry out such other duties as are necessary for the cleanliness and healthiness of the town as may be decided upon from time to time by the Local Board.

# Fidelity Guarantees.

13. The Council may require, from time to time, any officer who has the handling of moneys of the Municipality to find a surety for the faithful discharge of his duties, and the cost of such guarantee shall be borne by the Council.

# By-Law No. 5.

- 1. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—
  - (i.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow or driving any carriage upon or along any footpath.
  - (II.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Council having been first obtained.
  - (III.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
  - (iv.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Council.
  - (v.) Emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter, without permission or a license from, and without having given such security as is required by the Council.

- (vi.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (vii.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (VIII.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
  - (IX.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Council having been first obtained.
  - (x.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (xi.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breakingin any horse, flying any kite, using any bows
  and arrows, or playing at any game to the
  annoyance of any person in any public place; or
  obstructing any footpath or carriage road,
  whether by allowing any cart or animal to
  remain across such footpath or carriage road, or
  by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (xII.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
- (XIII.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (xiv.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place, without permission of the Council, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Council.
  - (xv.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (xvi.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any entire horse for show, hire, or sale.
- (XVII.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Council.
- (XVIII.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.
- (XIX.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other places than those appointed by the Council, or demanding higher rates than authorised by such Council.

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice, or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

- 2. The Council may make such Rules and Regulations with reference to the licensing of carters, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such council may see fit.
- 3. No person, without a license first had and obtained from the Surveyor, shall erect, place, or set up, or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding, or place or erect any posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar, or of depositing, sifting, screening, or slaking any brick, stone, lime, sand, or any other materials for building or repairing any house, or other tenement or erection, or for any other purpose; and such license as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which any such hoarding, scaffolding, posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary. And if any person place, set up, erect, or build, or cause or permit to be erected, placed, set up, or built, any such hoarding or scaffolding, or any enclosed posts, bars, or rails, or any other matter or thing for the purpose aforesaid, or for any other purpose, without such license or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such license, or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such license, then, and a penalty not exceeding £10, and also the sum of £1 for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof, and the said Council may, four days after notice, cause the same to pulled down and removed, and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such Council all the penalties incurred by

- such persons, together with the charges of pulling down, removing, and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed, and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of eight days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such Council may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction, and the proceeds thereof applied to payment of such charges, and the surplus of such proceeds (if any) shall be rendered to the owner or person entitled by law thereto.
- 4. If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street, so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare, he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

### By-Law No. 6.—Slaughter-Houses.

- 1. The Health Officer may, from time to time, visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or any house, outbuilding, lane, alley, or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed; and he shall, if it appear that any accumulation of manure, dung, offal, soil, filth, coal, ashes, or other unwholesome or noxious matter whatsoever ought to be removed, give notice to the person to whom the same belongs, or to the occupier of the premises whereon it exists to remove the same; and if at the expiration of four days after such notice the same be not complied with, the manure, dung, offal, soil, filth, coal, ashes, or other matter referred to shall be removed by the Council at the expense of the person to whom such notice was given, and such expense may be recovered in the same manner as any penalty inflicted hereunder.
- 2. No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within the boundaries of the Municipality without the previous sanction, in writing, of the Council, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ .

# By-Law No. 7.—Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 8.—FIRES IN CHIMNEY FLUES.

The occupier of any premises within the Municipality whereof any chimney flues shall take fire, from having been suffered to become foul, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5: Provided that if any defendant shall plead that such chimney flue did not take fire in consequence of being foul, the onus of proof shall lie on such defendant.

# By-Law No. 9.—Damaging Property, etc., of Municipality.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction, in writing, of the Council) break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove or carry away, any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, water-course, culvert, building, or other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 10.—To prevent Danger from Fire.

Any person who shall (without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the Council) anywhere within the limits of the Municipality, light any unguarded fire, or set fire to any straw, wood, or rubbish, or make any bonfire, or let off any fireworks within the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 11.—To prevent Danger from Firearms.

Any person who shall wantonly, or without lawful excuse, discharge any firearm in or near to or across any public street within the limits of the Municipality shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence. Any person carrying loaded firearms within the Municipality, without the written permission of the Council, shall also be liable, on conviction, to a similar penalty.

# By-Law No. 12.—To prevent Danger from Inflammable Materials.

- 1. Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and who shall not remove the same within two hours after due notice from the Town Clerk, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
- 2. No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occupied by him within the Municipality, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, or other inflammable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Town Clerk, for the time being in

that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflammable material, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £20.

3. The captain for the time being of any fire brigade, or officer in command, or the Chairman, shall be authorised to employ such persons to assist the brigade in extinguishing fires as he may deem necessary. That the said captain or Chairman is hereby authorised to recover the expenses actually incurred by the brigade employed at any fire from the owner or occupier of such premises, any sum or sums not exceeding those mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, such charges being recoverable by action in the Local Court.

### BY-LAW NO. 13.—TO PREVENT DANGER TO PASSENGERS.

Any house or building the roof whereof shall overhang or project over any public street without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or which shall have any cornice, crane, or hoist, or any other fixtures or projection overhanging or projecting over any public street, without the sanction, in writing, of the Council therefor, shall be deemed to be a nuisance, and any owner of any such house or building who shall neglect or refuse to remove or abate such nuisance, within seven days after due notice by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 14.—To prevent the Danger of rapid Driving and Riding round Corners.

Any person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, round the corners formed by the junction of any street in the Municipality with any other street in the Municipality, at a pace exceeding a walking pace, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 15.—To prevent the Danger from the Driving of Vehicles at Night.

Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lanthorn securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 16.—To ensure Control over Vehicles and Horses.

Any person, who, having the care of any vehicle in the public streets, shall be at such a distance from such vehicle as not to have the complete control over every horse drawing the same, and shall not have one wheel of such vehicle chained, or the horse securely tied, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 17 .- Quarries and Timber.

Any person who shall quarry stone, or fell or cut timber on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 18.—Schedule of Licenses and Fees to be Paid Yearly, in advance, on or before 31st January or immediately on such Live Stock or Carriages being kept within the Municipality, or Hand-carts being used in the Streets thereof, or Slaughter-houses being opened therein.

For horned stock over 12 months old, 3s. per head. For horned stock over 6 months and under 12 months, 2s. 6d per head.

For goats, 2s. 6d. per head.
For every carriage of two wheels, 5s. each.
For every carriage of four wheels, 10s. each.
Hand-carts employed, if on the streets, 2s. 6d. each.
For a slaughter-house license, £5.

# By-Law No. 19.—Signobards, etc.

1. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, signs, awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

2. Any person wishing to erect any balcony, verandah or signboard over any part of a street or footway shall obtain permission of the Council, in writing, before so doing; and any balcony, verandah, or signboard so erected by the consent of the Council shall be at least eight feet clear above the street or footway over which it is erected, and shall be built in a substantial manner, and shall be subject to the approval of the Council, both with respect to its strength and appearance; and, further, the Council will have power to remove, or cause to be removed, any balcony, verandah, or signboard now erected, or that may be hereafter erected over any street in the Municipality, not being erected in conformity with this By-law: Provided that the owner or occupier of the premises to which any such balcony, verandah, or signboard is or may be attached, shall have received fourteen days' notice, in writing, from the Council, to remove such balcony, verandah, or signboard after having received the said notice, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10, together with all expenses (if any) incurred by the Council in removing any such balcony, verandah or signboard.

### BY-LAW No. 20.-LAMP POSTS, ETC.

No lamp posts, bridle posts, and flagstaffs shall be erected in any street without the written consent of the Council, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Council, and the Council may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

### By-Law No. 21.—Processions and Bands.

- 1. No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within the Municipality without first having obtained the written permission of the Chairman or Council.
- 2. No band or person shall be allowed to play any musical instrument in any of the streets within the Municipality without first obtaining permission of the Chairman or Council. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 22.—Walls and Fences.

- 1. No person shall erect any fence with bush or other dangerous or inflammable substance, abutting on any public street, without first obtaining permission of the Council in writing.
- 2. Any fence erected and abutting on any public street will be subject to the approval of the Council, and the owner of any such fence shall keep and maintain such fence in good order and repair, and shall remove the same if not so approved and upon the Council ordering the removal of the same.
- 3. No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 23.—Velocipedes, etc.

Any person who shall ride or place a bicycle or other velocipede upon any footpath, and any person riding or placing a bicycle or velocipede upon any street, between sunset and sunrise, without carrying a lighted lamp and an alarm bell attached to the front part of such bicycle or velocipede, and sounding the bell in ample time to allow foot passengers and others to protect themselves from danger, and any person riding a bicycle or other velocipede in or upon any street or roadway in a furious manner, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 24.—Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

Any person who shall throw any orange-peel, vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footpath within the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 25.—Vehicles not having Springs.

Any person who shall cause any wagon, cart, or other carriage not having springs, or drive any animal attached thereto, at any faster rate, speed, or pace than a common walk shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2.

# By-Law No. 26.—Goods left in the Streets.

Any person who shall allow any goods, merchandise, coal, or firewood to remain in any street for a longer period than

necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2.

BY-LAW NO. 27.—REMOVAL OF VEHICLES OR ANIMALS LEFT ON THE STREET.

Any officer of the Council, or any police constable, may seize and remove any animals or vehicles left unattended the owners of any animals or ventiles left unattended in any street, or obstructing any portion of any street, and the owners of any animals so seized or removed shall be liable, and, upon conviction, shall pay any expenses incurred in the care and keep of any such animals or vehicles after such seizure or removal, and shall pay a penalty not exceeding £2.

BY-LAW NO. 28.—IMPURE WATER OR LIQUID MATTER NOT TO FLOW ON ANY STREET

Any owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the Municipality who shall allow any impure water or any liquid matter of any description to flow from such house, land, or premises, into or upon any street, footway, or gutter; and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any liquid matter of any description, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

### BY-LAW NO. 29.—TEMPORARY STALLS.

The Council may grant permission to any person to fix and use temporary stalls, in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, for such time and such places as the Council may think fit: Provided that the general traffic is not obstructed by any such stalls, and that such permission may be withdrawn by the Chairman or Council at any time by written notice: And the Council shall charge the person using a fee not exceeding £5; and any person erecting or using any such stall in or near any street for the above purposes without first obtaining such permission of the Council, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and be subject to a penalty of £5 for each offence.

### BY-LAW NO. 30.--REGULATION OF STREET TRAFFIC ON SPECIAL OCCASIONS.

The Council may, in its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways of any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to such street.

### BY-LAW NO. 31.—PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION GROUNDS.

- All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws.
- The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the Municipality for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three days, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed; but the public will have the right to enter upon such lands, provided they do not in any way interfere with sports or amusements being carried on.
- 3. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed upon any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Chairman or Council.
- 4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Corporation.
- 5. The Council may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
- 6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the Chairman or Council and shall pay a fee; the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.
- 7. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

# By-Law No. 32.—Dairies.

1. Any person or persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the Municipality shall register their names and addresses with the

- Town Clerk, and shall keep their milk stores, shops, or dairies, or milk vessels used for containing milk for sale, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of an officer appointed by the Council.
- 2. No person shall contaminate or adulterate in any way any milk offered for sale within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such

# By-Law No. 33.—Camels and Horse Teams.

No person shall be allowed to camp any camel, dromedary, or horse team within a radius of one mile of the town boundary, for a longer period than is necessary for the loading or unloading of such camel, dromedary, or horse team, without the sanction of the Council in writing, and any person offending against this By-law shall pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence, and any person depasturing camels, dromedaries, or horse teams on the park lands, commonage, or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the Municipality, without the sanction of the Council in writing, shall pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 per day or part of a day for every animal so depastured.

By-Law No. 34.—No Tents, etc., to be erected without

LICENSE.

1. No tent, pavilion, shed, or other structure of calico, canvas, or other inflammable material shall be erected or re-erected or be allowed to remain if already erected by any person or persons within the limits of the Municipality of Norseman without obtaining the consent thereto of the Council, by its Town Clerk, for such time and upon such terms as the Council may decide; and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction of every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum of not less than 5s. nor more than £2: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be Municipality on the public lands thereof or by the Government on any Government reserve, for temporary purposes, of any such tent, pavilion, shed, or structure aforesaid.

2. All persons having obtained permission to erect tents on the Reserves set apart by the Council must conform to the following conditions:—To pay a sum of 5s. a month, in advance, as a license fee and rate for sanitary services in respect of any closet which may be erected by themselves, and in cases where such closet is supplied by the Council, then a fee of 7s. 6d. payable as aforesaid.

# Position of Tents.

All tents erected on such Reserves must be placed in such positions as the Health Inspector or other officer may direct

# Revoke License.

The Council retains to itself the right to cancel any license granted, and remove any tent erected on any of the Reserves.

# Latrines.

Latrines may be erected by the Council, and attended to by the proper person in the employ of the Corporation, for the use of all occupiers of tents on the said Reserves.

# By-Law No. 35.

For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws to which no penalty is herein attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following amendments and additions to the Goldfields Regulations, on and after the 1st day of January, 1897:—

- 1. The whole of Clause 5, page 63, to be omitted, and the following Clause substituted in place thereof:—
  - "5. Any miner shall be entitled to mark off a "Protection Area, in size as follows:—
    - "If distant over one mile and "under three miles from the "nearest boundary of any "other Protection Area, or "authorised holding, pro-"ducing gold at the time of " marking off the Protection 700 "  ${\bf Area}$ 700 x "If distant three miles, and "under five miles... 800 x 800 "If distant five miles, and ... 1000 x 1000 " over
  - "And every such prospecting area shall, from "and after the third day of marking, be "efficiently and continuously worked."
- 2. The following sub-clause shall be added to, and read with Clause No. 20, page 66:—
  - "Provided always, that from and after payable gold shall have been discovered in any Quartz Prospecting Protection Area, and reported as provided, and a Reward Claim marked out thereon, and duly registered, no further Reward Claim shall be taken up and registered on the same line of reef; but all other prospecting areas situated on such line of reef shall lapse, and the ground comprised therein, etc., taken up as ordinary claims only, and of the area provided for by Clause 22 of these Regulations."
