By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

WHEREAS under and by virtue of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such district, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no onger form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following boundaries:-

Bounded by lines starting from Survey Station R 3; thence East about 17 miles 30 chains to a point North from the most Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence South about 29 miles 70 chains to that corner; thence about 234° 50′ 14½ miles to the 40 mile post on part of the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence about 324° 46′ 9 miles 32

chains 44 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 56 links to the starting point, shall be and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

THE BROAD ARROW MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the North-East Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be, for the future, as follows:-

NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the South-East corner of the Coolgardie Goldfield (which is a point about 40 miles East from the summit of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road), and extending East to the 125th meridian East Longitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East from Survey Station R 3, near the Cane Grass Swamp on the 90-Mile Road; thence West to the North-East corner of Broad Arrow Magisterial District; thence South about 29 miles 70 chains to the Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence along the North-East boundary of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District about 141° 35′ about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence along the Eastern boundary of Location 44, to its South East corner, thence about of Location 44 to its South-East corner; thence about 162° 10′ about 1 mile 64 chains to the North-East corner of Location 45; thence South along its Eastern boundary to its South-East corner; thence South to a point about 7 miles 65 chains East from the South-Eastern corner of Location $48\,;$ thence East about 27 miles 15 chains; thence South about 48 miles to the starting point.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be, for the future, as follows :

EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a mile post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield, 40 miles Southerly from Survey Station R 3, and extending 144° 46′ 26 miles 62 chains 37 links along a surveyed line to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of Location 53 and the Western boundary of Location 51 to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of that Location Easterly 119 chains 87 links, Northerly 60 chains, Easterly 160 chains to a point on the Western boundary of Location 48; thence along the surveyed boundaries of Location 48 Southerly 564 chains 87 links, Easterly 443 chains 91 links to the South-Eastern corner of that Location; thence Easterly about 7 miles 65 chains to a point South of the South-East corner of Location 45, thence North to the said corner; thence North along the Eastern boundary of Location 45, four miles to its North-East corner; thence about 342° 10′ about 1 mile 64 chains to the South-Eastern corner of Location 45, about 1 mile 64 chains to the South-Eastern corner or Location 44; thence along the Eastern boundary of Location 44 to its North-East corner; thence about 321° 35′ about 30 miles 53 chains to a point bearing about 54° 50′ from the 40-Mile post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about 234° 50′ about 14½ miles to the starting point.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be, for the future, as follows:

COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield (which is a point about 50 miles West from a cairn marked NB I, near Wangine Soak), and extending South about 118 miles through a cairn, H 26, on Kooarawalye Granite Rock; thence East about 133 miles through the summit of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence North about 48 miles to a point 35 miles East of the South-East corner of Hampton Plains Location 48; thence West 35 miles to the South-East corner of the above-mentioned Location; the South-East corner of the above-mentioned Location; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of Location 48, Westerly 443 chains 91 links, Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of that Location Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, Westerly 119 chains 87 links to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence Northerly 400 chains along the Western boundary of Location 53 to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along a surveyed line 324° 46′ 36 miles 1,481 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 46 links along a surveyed line to a tree, R3, near the Cane Grass Swamm on 90 Mile Road thence near the Cane Grass Swamp on 90-Mile Road; thence Westerly to a cairn marked NB1 near Wangine Soak; thence Westerly about 50 miles to the starting point.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the Yilgarn Magisterial District, and declare them to be, for the future, as follows:-

YILGARN MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a point 90 miles South of a cairn, H 26, on Koorarawalyee Granite Rock, and extended West to a point due South of a point 10 miles West of a cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence North to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence East-South-East to a point about 50 miles due West from a cairn, NB (conjoined) 1, near Wangine Soak; thence South through the before mentioned cairn H 26 to the starting point.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby, with the like advice, alter the existing boundaries of the North Coolgardie Magisterial District, and declare them to be, for the future, as follows :-

NORTH COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield and extending South to the of the Murchison Goldfield and extending South to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence to the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield, which is a point about 50 miles West from Survey Station NB 1, near Wangine Soak, thence about 87° 20 miles 22 chains to Survey Station R 3; thence East to the 125th meridian East longtitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East of the starting point; thence West to the starting point.

THE following Regulations of the South African Republic, with regard to Aliens, are published for general information.

SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLIC.

ALIENS LAW.

Whereas it has been found necessary to make regulations with regard to the admission of aliens into this Republic, it is hereby made known that, in accordance with Article 6 of the Grondwet, the following regulations have been made:

ARTICLE 1.

All foreigners, other than natives, will be admitted into this Republic, provided they are furnished with a proper foreign passport, given by or on behalf of the Government of the country to which they belong and viséd by a Consul or Consular Official of the Republic.

ARTICLE 2.

Such passports must show that the said foreigner has sufficient means of subsistence, or can obtain such by his work.

ARTICLE 3.

Failing the possession of a passport, as aforementioned, foreigners may be admitted on letters of indication, or even on mere mention of their names, provided, however, they can prove their identity, and can show that they can fulfil the conditions laid down in Article 2 to the satisfaction of the authorities named hereafter.

ARTICLE 4.

Admission is granted by the Fieldcornet at the place of st arrival, or, on crossing the frontier, by the official appointed by the Government, through the issue of a travelling and residing passport.

ARTICLE 5.

Such travelling and residing passport shall be valid for a period of three months, but can each time be renewed for a further three menths by the Fieldcornet of the place where the foreigner is residing.

Such renewal can only be refused through non-fulfilment of the requirements laid down in Article 2.

The decision of the Fieldcornet shall be subject to an appeal to the Government.

ARTICLE 6.

Foreigners, who, when applying for a renewal of their travelling and residing passports, declare that they intend to settle in the Republic, need only renew their travelling and residing passports once a year, provided always that they give the required guarantee that they will be obedient to the laws of the country, by making a sworn or other declaration to the satisfaction of the Fieldcornet.

The above regulations shall not be applicable to foreigners, who may be already residing in the Republic, on the coming into force of this law, or who have been duly registered according to law, at the Fieldcornet's office, or who may so register themselves within one month.

ARTICLE 8.

Travelling and residing passports, as mentioned in this law, must be shown on demand to any Landdrost, Mining Commissioner, Resident Justice of the Peace, or Fieldcornet.

ARTICLE 9.

Foreigners who are residing within the Republic, contrary to the conditions of this law, and who are not in possession of the necessary travelling and residing passports, can be expelled from the country, according to Law No. 25 of 1896.

ARTICLE 10.

This Law shall come into force on the 1st of January, 1897.

H.M.S. "Waterwitch" reports the following alterations in buoyage, and the positions of new coral patches not shown in Admiralty chart 1757—(corrected, large corrections, June, 1896):—

A white buoy is situated in 2^1_4 fathoms, N. 57° E., 125 yards from the lightship.

A white eask buoy is situated in 2½ fathoms, S. 14° W., 87 yards from the lightship.

A black cask buoy is situated in 4 fathoms, N. 70½° W., 765 yards from the lightship.

The white cask buoy shown on the chart as S. 55° W., 1 cable from the lightship, does not exist.

A white cask mooring buoy is placed in 8 fathoms, N. 16° W., 160 yards from the green light on the pier.

A white cask mooring buoy is placed in 9 fathoms, S. 81° W., 190 yards from the green light on the pier.

A red cask mooring buoy is placed in $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, S. 15° W., 95 yards from the green light on the pier.

The coral patch N. 84° E., 665 yards from the lightship, has 5 feet of water over it, and is marked by a white cask buoy on North-West end of the shoalest part.

A coral patch of 4½ fathoms exists N. 82° E., 1170 yards—an patch of 6 fathoms, N. 64° E., 1045 yards—from the lightship. Chart affected:—1757.

AUSTRALIA, NORTH-EAST COAST.

The following dangers not shown in Admiralty charts have been discovered by H.M.S. " Dart":—

(a) Halloran Rock (latitude 12° 47' 43" S., longitude 133° 35' 5" E.) is of coral, having 26 feet of water on it at L.W.O.S., and 15 to 16 fathoms close round it.

(b) Ashton Rock (latitude 12° 54′ 5″ S., longitude 143° 32′ 51″ E.) is a small shoal of coral, about one cuble long, and half a cable broad, with depths of from 2 to 3 fathoms on it and 7 to 8 fathoms round. About its centre is a rock having only 5 feet on it at L.W.O.S.

(c) Morris Bank (latitude 13' 5' 9" S., longitude 143' 36' 4" E.) is a small knoll of coral having a least depth of 5\(^1\) fathoms on it at L.W.O.S., and 12 to 13 fathoms close round it.

(d) Glennie Reef (latitude 13' 8' 56" S., longitude 143' 37' 20" E.) is of coral, about a quarter of a mile long, in a N.E. and S.W. direction, and 2 cables broad. It dries 3 to 4 feet at L.W.O.S.

The ground is very foul for half a mile West of Glennie Reef.

Cloak Room and Left Luggage Regulations and Charges.

EFT LUGGAGE.—Parcels and Luggage may, for convenience, be deposited in the cloak room at all stations; but the Commissioner shall not be liable in respect of the loss of any parcel or luggage in excess of the sum of £10, notwithstanding that the actual value of the parcel or luggage lost may exceed that amount.

Scale of Rates.—The following charges shall be payable for parcels and luggage deposited in the cloak rooms:—

A charge of 2d. is made upon each article deposited in one of the Railway Department's cloak rooms for three days, except for bicycles, tricycles, bath chairs, sociables, etc., when the charge will be 4d. each for three days or part thereof.

For articles left in a cloak room over three days an additional charge of 3d. each per day or part of a day will be made on boxes, etc., and 6d. each on bicycles, etc.; but the Commissioner will not be responsible for loss of articles after the expiration of one month from date of deposit.

Cloak room and left luggage charges must be paid to the officer in charge of the cloak room, from whom persons, on depositing parcels, will obtain a ticket, which must indicate the number of parcels deposited, the name of depositor, and the amount paid. These tickets are printed in triplicate, bound up in book form, and numbered consecutively. In computing the charges Sunday is considered a dies non, unless it be the day on which the articles are deposited or taken out, in which case it must be reckoned the same as any other day.

Special Cloak Room.—Special cloak room tickets, printed in triplicate form, may be issued to store-keepers, drapers, and others for use in connection with Perth Station on application to the Station Master. One part of the ticket is to be affixed to the parcel, the duplicate handed to the owner for presentation at the cloak room when demanding his parcel, and the triplicate portion sent with the parcel to the cloak room to be there signed by the officer in charge as evidence of the parcel having been deposited.

The delivery of a parcel on presentation of the duplicate ticket issued to the owner shall release the Commissioner of all liability in connection therewith, and the possession of the duplicate ticket by the officer in charge of the cloak room shall be *primâ facie* evidence that the parcel or parcels mentioned therein have been correctly delivered.

Articles deposited in the Railway Department's cloak rooms must not be delivered up to the depositor for any purpose whatever, unless the ticket be first returned to the department.

When passengers who have deposited their luggage in cloak rooms require to remove one or more of the articles so left (leaving the remainder until a future day) the cloak room ticket held by the passenger must be handed in and storage charges up to date collected thereon, and articles remaining should be re-booked.

When a cloak room ticket is lost, the claimant is required to give satisfactory proof of ownership and sign a declaration indemnifying the Department against loss, etc., in the event of ticket being found and presented; such declaration to be made in the usual manner before a Resident Magistrate or Justice of the Peace.

On and after the 1st February, 1897, articles left in cloak rooms, and unclaimed at the expiration of six months, will be sold by auction.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the issue of Free School Tickets, to enable any child to travel to the nearest State School, provided that such school is the one nearest to the residence of the parents or guardians of such child. The tickets are issued free, and no liability attaches to the Commissioner of Railways in regard to any journeys made upon them. They are available between the stations named thereon for the purpose of attending school for one journey each way, on school days only, and the holders are subject to the Commissioner's By-laws and Regulations for passengers.

Free tickets will only be issued to children living outside the school radius of two miles. Distances are measured by the nearest road.

The tickets must be given up on date of expiry.

Should the train service to the nearest school not be convenient, tickets may be issued to the school most suitably served by the trains running.

Where the children reside at unauthorised stopping places, special application must be made for the trains to stop. If there are no passenger trains by which the children can travel, they are to be allowed to travel in the brake-van of goods trains, provided that no girl be permitted to travel alone with the guard in such brake-van.
