## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to declare any land adjoining a Municipality, but not being part of the same, to be united with the same: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of land adjoining the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form portion of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the South-East boundary of Kalgoorlie Townsite, situate 223° 27′ 26 chains from its most Easterly corner, extending 223° 27′ 24 chains; thence 313° 27′ 30 chains 80 links; thence 43° 27′ 26 chains; thence 133° 27′ 7 chains 20 links; thence 223° 27′ 2 chains; thence 133° 27′ 23 chains 60 links to the starting point.

The entire boundaries of the Townsite being as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 270° 0′ 29 chains 26 links, and 0° 0′ 15 chains 4 links from a Cairn on the summit of Mount Gledden, and extending 223° 27′ 50 chains; thence 313° 27′ 30 chains 80 links; thence 48° 27′ 26 chains; thence 133° 27′ 7 chains 20 links; thence 43° 27′ 24 chains; thence 133° 27′ 23 chains 60 links to the starting point.

The Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of the 1st January, 1897, is hereby rescinded.

## Stock Regulations.

"The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 20th day of January, 1897.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895." the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any such stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction of Cattle, Sheep, Dogs, and Horses into this Colony from Queensland and the Northern Territory of South Australia: And, furthermore, prohibits the importation of all hides from Queensland and the Northern Territory, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows:

- 1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week
- 2. They shall be accompanied by a Certificate from the Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

The Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 16th October, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

## Market By-Laws.

W HEREAS by Section 99, sub-section 16, of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for the general regulation of all Markets and Fairs, and for the other purposes enumerated in the said Section 99, sub-section 16: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Town Council of the City of Perth that the following By-laws shall be the By-laws of the City of Perth for the general regulation of the Perth Markets and for the other purposes enumerated in the said Section 99, sub-section 16.

## Markets to be open on all lawful days.

1. The General Market known as Perth Markets shall be open for the sale of all marketable commodities every day during the year from 6 a.m. till 8 p.m., except on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, on which days no business shall be transacted therein: Provided that on the evenings of Saturdays, and on the evenings immediately before Christmas Day and Good Friday the Market shall remain open till 10°30 p.m. No person other than the officials of the Market shall, on any pretence whatever, be or remain in the said Markets except upon such days and during such hours as the same shall be open for the transaction of business, except by special permission of the Council or Inspector.

#### Appointment and Duties of Inspector.

- 2. There shall be appointed by the City Council an officer to be called the Market Inspector, whose duties shall be generally as follows:—
  - (a.) To see that the Market Regulations are duly observed in and with respect to the Markets.
  - (b.) To preserve order and regularity in the Markets.
  - (c.) To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the Markets, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome; and to hand over the same to the Health Inspector to be dealt with by him as provided by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and any Acts amending the same.
  - (d.) To prohibit the sale of any articles in such Market which he may consider noisome or offensive.
  - (e.) To take charge of the Market weighbridge and of the scales and standard weights and measures of the Markets; to have such weights and measures legally stamped, and all others used in the Market adjusted thereby, receiving for every weight and measure so adjusted the sum of Threepence, and for weighing any article or articles on the Market weighing bridge or scales the several amounts specified in Schedule A hereto.
  - (f.) To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the Markets, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.
  - (g.) To appoint the several standing places for the deposit of goods, wares, and merchandise in the Markets, as well as the places for depositing utensils or materials used for the fixing of stalls, and to order the removal of same when and in such manner as he may deem necessary.

### Shops or Stalls.

3. The Market shops and stalls shall and may be used for the sale of any wares, merchandise, fish, meats, and dairy and farm produce (with the exception of hay, straw, and green fodder), which shall be sold in such other portion of the Markets as may be directed.

#### Weight of Goods sold.

4. All meat, butter, cheese, groceries, fruit, or potatoes offered for sale in the Markets shall be sold by Avoirdupois weight only.

Rents and Dues to be paid.

5. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any wares, merchandise, fish, meat, and dairy and farm produce in the said Markets without first having paid to the Market Inspector of the said Markets all rents or dues payable in respect thereof.

#### Penalty for resisting Inspector.

6. Any person who shall wilfully obstruct the Inspector or his assistants in the discharge of his or their duties shall, independently of any other penalty which he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

#### Penalty for driving into Market by wrong gate.

7. The driver of any vehicle who shall drive the same into the Market by any other than the gate set apart for entrance, or who shall drive any vehicle out of the Market through the entrance gate, or who whilst driving into, within, or out of the Market shall drive at faster than a walking pace shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

#### Penalty for obstructing Footways.

8. Any person who shall deposit any matter or thing, or any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow in such a position as to obstruct any avenue or footway in the said Markets, or in any other place therein than such as shall be appointed therefor by the Market Inspector, and shall neglect or refuse to remove the same on being required to do so by the Inspector, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

#### Nails, hooks, etc., not to be placed without permission.

9. Any person who shall drive or insert any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the wood, stone, brick, or ironwork of any shop or stall in the said Market, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any such shop or stall without the consent, or contrary to the directions of the Inspector, and any shop or stall holder who shall neglect or refuse to take down any nail, hook, peg, or fittings in his or her stall when required to do so by the Inspector, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

#### Penalty for sweeping and leaving dirt on gutters.

10 Any person who shall sweep or cause to be swept any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the avenues, gutters, or footways of the said Markets, and allow the same to remain there, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

#### Penalty for not cleansing stall.

11. The holder of any shop or stall in the said Markets who shall fail or neglect, within one hour after the opening of the Markets, to thoroughly cleanse his or her shop or stall and the gutter in front thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

#### Penalty for non-observance of Market hours.

12. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale in the Market any marketable commodity before the opening or after the closing of the Market, or before or after the time (if any) appointed especially for the sale of such commodity, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

## $Penalty\ for\ Immorality,\ etc.,\ in\ the\ Market.$

13. Any person who shall be or behave in the said Markets in a drunken or disorderly state or manner, or excite any riot or disturbance, or curse, or swear, or use any indecent or abusive language, or be guilty of any obscene or indecent conduct therein, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

## Penalty for False Weight.

14. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale by weight or measure any article which, when tried by the Market Inspector, shall be found less than the weight or measure represented, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence, and any person offering to purchase any such article may require the same to be weighed or measured in the presence of the Market Inspector.

#### Manner of carrying Poultry.

15. No person shall bring live poultry into the Market except the same be in a properly constructed coop.

#### Stalls to be let.

16. All permanent stalls shall be let by auction or otherwise for such period as the Council may determine from time to time, and rent for the same shall be paid weekly in advance. The holders of permanent stalls shall not transfer or sublet the same without the consent in writing of the Market Inspector first had and obtained.

### Recovery of Rent.

17. All Rents and Dues in respect of Market Shops or Stalls shall be paid to the Inspector at his Office every Monday morning in advance, and no Stall-holder shall be allowed to sell until such rent and dues be paid.

Names may be affixed to Stalls and same fitted up under direction of Inspector.

18. Any Stall-holder who shall be desirous of having his or her name or calling affixed to any stall or shed, or to have the same enclosed in any particular way, shall apply to the Market Inspector, who may cause the same to be done at the cost of such applicant, and such work shall not be done otherwise.

#### Name Plates for Vehicles.

19. Every vehicle used by any Hawker for the purpose of trading in the Market, or for removing therefrom any commodity purchased therein, shall have affixed on the near side thereof a special Name Plate, which must be procured from the Market Inspector. Every Hawker requiring such a Name Plate shall produce his Hawker's License to the Market Inspector, and deposit with him the sum of two shillings and sixpence, but such sum shall be refunded to such Hawker upon his ceasing to trade in the Market and returning the said Name Plate.

#### Wholesale Market.

20. Such portions of the Market as shall not be appropriated for the purpose of permanent Stalls or Shops shall be used and known as the Wholesale Market.

#### Temporary Standing Places.

21. Every person other than the holder of a permanent Stall or Shop, who shall bring into the Market any market-able commodities for sale, shall occupy such place in the Wholesale Market as shall be pointed out to him by the Market Inspector, and shall pay the Tolls and Dues set out in Schedule B. hereto in respect of such commodities.

#### Sales by Auction.

Marketable Commodities may be sold by Auction in the Wholesale Market daily (Sundays, Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted), between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 a.m., and it shall not be lawful to sell by Auction in the said Market except between such hours.

#### Auctioneers.

Any licensed Auctioneer who shall desire to sell by Auction within the Market shall first obtain a permit from the Town Clerk. The fee payable in respect of such permit shall be Ten shillings per month.

#### Chinese, etc.

No Stall in the said Market shall be leased or let to any Chinese, Japanese, Asiatic, or other coloured person.

## Penalties not otherwise enumerated.

25. Every person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-laws, for which no specific penalty is thereby provided, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

The printer of every newspaper shall print upon each of such papers printed by him his name and usual place of abode or business, and shall also, within twenty-four hours after the publication of such paper, send to the Colonial Secretary one copy (at least) of every such paper, signed by such printer, and on which shall be written or printed the name and place of abode of the person or persons by whom he shall have been employed to print the same; and every person neglecting or omitting to comply with any of the provisions aforesaid shall, on conviction thereof before a court of summary jurisdiction, be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding Ten pounds.

HEREAS the Brunswick Roads Board, by resolution passed at a meeting of the Board, held at Brunswick on the sixth day of June, 1896, resolved to take, for 'the purpose of opening a new line of communication, the Lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

West Australian Government Railways.

Cloak Room and Left Luggage Regulations and Charges.

EFT LUGGAGE.—Parcels and Luggage may, for convenience, be deposited in the cloak room at all stations; but the Commissioner shall not be liable in respect of the loss of any parcel or luggage in excess of the sum of £10, notwithstanding that the actual value of the parcel or luggage lost may exceed that amount.

Scale of Rates.—The following charges shall be payable for parcels and luggage deposited in the cloak rooms:—

A charge of 2d. is made upon each article deposited in one of the Railway Department's cloak rooms for three days, except for bicycles, tricycles, bath chairs, sociables, etc., when the charge will be 4d. each for three days or part thereof.

For articles left in a cloak room over three days an additional charge of 3d. each per day or part of a day will be made on boxes, etc., and 6d. each on bicycles, etc.; but the Commissioner will not be responsible for loss of articles after the expiration of one month from date of deposit.

Cloak room and left luggage charges must be paid to the officer in charge of the cloak room, from whom persons, on depositing parcels, will obtain a ticket, which must indicate the number of parcels deposited, the name of depositor, and the amount paid. These tickets are printed in triplicate, bound up in book form, and numbered consecutively. In computing the charges Sunday is considered a dies non, unless it be the day on which the articles are deposited or taken out, in which case it must be reckoned the same as any other day.

Special Cloak Room.—Special cloak room tickets, printed in triplicate form, may be issued to store-keepers, drapers, and others for use in connection with Perth Station on application to the Station Master. One part of the ticket is to be affixed to the parcel, the duplicate handed to the owner for presentation at the cloak room when demanding his parcel, and the triplicate portion sent with the parcel to the cloak room to be there signed by the officer in charge as evidence of the parcel having been deposited.

The delivery of a parcel on presentation of the duplicate ticket issued to the owner shall release the Commissioner of all liability in connection therewith, and the possession of the duplicate ticket by the officer in charge of the cloak room shall be *primâ facie* evidence that the parcel or parcels mentioned therein have been correctly delivered.

Articles deposited in the Railway Department's cloak rooms must not be delivered up to the depositor for any purpose whatever, unless the ticket be first returned to the department.

When passengers who have deposited their luggage in cloak rooms require to remove one or more of the articles so left (leaving the remainder until a future day) the cloak room ticket held by the passenger must be handed in and storage charges up to date collected thereon, and articles remaining should be re-booked.

When a cloak room ticket is lost, the claimant is required to give satisfactory proof of ownership and sign a declaration indemnifying the Department against loss, etc., in the event of ticket being found and presented; such declaration to be made in the usual manner before a Resident Magistrate or Justice of the Peace.

On and after the 1st February, 1897, articles left in cloak rooms, and unclaimed at the expiration of six months, will be sold by auction.

Its Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the issue of Free School Tickets, to enable any child to travel to the nearest State School, provided that such school is the one nearest to the residence of the parents or guardians of such child. The tickets are issued free, and no liability attaches to the Commissioner of Railways in regard to any journeys made upon them. They are available between the stations named thereon for the purpose of attending school for one journey each way, on school days only, and the holders are subject to the Commissioner's By-laws and Regulations for passengers.

Free tickets will only be issued to children living outside the school radius of two miles. Distances are measured by the nearest road.

The tickets must be given up on date of expiry.

Should the train service to the nearest school not be convenient, tickets may be issued to the school most suitably served by the trains running.

Where the children reside at unauthorised stopping places, special application must be made for the trains to stop. If there are no passenger trains by which the children can travel, they are to be allowed to travel in the brake-van of goods trains, provided that no girl be permitted to travel alone with the guard in such brake-van.
