By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the provisions of an Ordinance made and passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Victoria, and numbered twelve, intituled "An Act to provide for the Establishment of Proper Places for the Burial of the Dead," it is made lawful for the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to appoint, by proclamation, such place or places in each district as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the dead: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation appoint the places mentioned in the Schedule hereto as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following towns and places respectively; but subject, always, to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same.

Gerard Smith. (L.s.) By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Albany: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby set apart, as a temporary Quarantine Station near Albany, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed 30 days from this date, Pastoral Lease Table 1, known as "Warriup."

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 20th day of January, 1897.

Present:

The Honourables—

The Attorney General, The Commissioner of Crown Lands, The Minister of Mines.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any such stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction of Cattle, Sheep, Dogs, and Horses into this Colony from Queensland and the Northern Territory of South Australia: And, furthermore, prohibits the importation of all hides from Queensland and the Northern Territory, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows:-

- 1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week.
- 2. They shall be accompanied by a Certificate from the Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

The Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th October, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

The printer of every newspaper shall print upon each of such papers printed by him his name and usual place of abode or business, and shall also, within twenty-four hours after the publication of such paper, send to the Colonial Secretary one copy (at least) of every such paper, signed by such printer, and on which shall be written or printed the name and place of abode of the person or persons by whom he shall have been employed to print the same; and every person neglecting or omitting to comply with any of the provisions aforesaid shall, on conviction thereof before a court of summary jurisdiction, be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding Ten pounds.

ADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Amendment Act, 1892," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Further Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895."

By-Law No. 27 .- Private Hospitals,

Any person who shall establish or carry on within this Municipality, without first obtaining a license from this Board, any private hospital for fevers and contagious diseases, shall be guilty of an offence.

- a. Owners or licensees of private hospitals must obtain a license annually, on or before the 1st January in each year, from this Board.
- b. The drainage, good management, and sanitary affairs must be carried out to the satisfaction of the Medical Health Officer and Health Inspector.
- c. The licensee must keep a proper register of the registration of all cases admitted into or treated in any such hospital, and any officer, Inspector, or servant of this Board may inspect such register at any time.
- d. No case of smallpox or other contagious disease will be allowed in such hospital.
- c. The Board will regulate the number of patients to be admitted.
- f. The license fee shall be 5s.
- g. Nurses and assistants' qualifications must be approved of by this Board before they assist in any hospital.
- h. "Private hospital" shall mean and include all houses, buildings, or places, or structures, whether permanent or otherwise, in which persons are received and lodged for medical or surgical treatment or care, but shall not include institutions maintained by the Government or controlled by a Board appointed under "The Hospitals Act, 1894."
- i. Licensees must provide suitable separate accommodation for patients suffering from any fever or infectious or contagious disease.
- j. Any person intending to apply to this Board for consent to establish a private hospital within this Municipality must publish in two newspapers circulating in this Municipality for one calendar month, and if any ratepayer or resident objects to such hospital he may state such be interest to this Pearl objection to this Board.

Any person offending against this By-law, and not complying with the preceding sections, shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
