By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to declare any land adjoining a Municipality, but not being part of the same, to be united with the same : Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of land adjoining the Municipality of Menzies, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form portion of the Municipality of Menzies :—

the Municipality of Menzies :— Bounded by lines starting from the West corner of East Coolgardie Mining Lease 3059, and extending 133° 52′ 15 phains 50 links along the South-West boundary of said Lease; thence 226° 52′ 1 chain 29 links, and 130° 52′ 10 chains 75¼ links along part of the North-West and the whole of the South-West boundaries of Mining Lease 3092; thence 127° 55′ 49 chains; thence 37° 55′ 60 chains; thence 307° 55′ 100 chains; thence 217° 55′ about 98 chains 50 links to the South-West boundary of Mining Lease 1409; thence 157° 39′ about 2 chains 20 links along said boundary to the North corner of Mining Lease 3016; thence 132° 2′ 18 chains 99 links to the East corner of said Lease; thence 66° 15′ 10 whains $34_{1^{*0}}$ links, and 318° 19′ about 6 chains 66 links along the South-East 1435; thence 46° 52′ about 32 chains 39 links to the starting point.

The entire boundaries of the Municipality of Menzies being as follows :---

Bounded by lines starting from the North corner of Mining Lease 3050, and extending 127° 55' 68 chains 34

links, passing along the North-East boundaries of Mining Leases 3050 and 3051; thence 37° 55′ about 94 chains 71 links; thence 307° 55′ 100 chains; thence 217° 55′ about 98 chains 50 links to the South-West boundary of Mining Lease 1409; thence 157° 39′ about 2 chains 20 links along said boundary to the North corner of Mining Lease 3016; thence 132° 2′ 18 chains 99 links to the East corner of said Lease; thence 66° 15′ 1 chain 73^a₁₀ links, and 111° 56′ 9 chains 56³₄ links along one of the North-West and the North-East boundaries of Mining Lease 1446 to the starting point.

By His Excellency Lieut. Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Albany: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby set apart, as a temporary Quarantine Station near Albany, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed 30 days from this date, Pastoral Lease $\frac{66}{1006}$, known as " Warriup."

'HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," VV the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by land or sea, of any Stock from any country or place: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of all Stock, Poultry, Fodder and Fittings from Asiatic Ports into this Colony as a preventative against Glanders, and Foot and Mouth and other diseases. At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 20th day of January, 1897.

Present :

The Honourables-The Attorney General, The Commissioner of Crown Lands, The Minister of Mines.

W HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895." the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any such stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: NOW THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction of Cattle, Sheep, Dogs, and Horses into this Colony from Queensland and the Northern Territory of South Australia: And, furthermore, prohibits the importation of all hides from Queensland and the Northern Territory, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows :--

1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week.

2. They shall be accompanied by a Certificate from the Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

The Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 16th October, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 19th December, 1896.

SIR. I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of notes exchanged between the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Costa Rica and the Secretary of Articles V., VI. and VII. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica of the 27th November, 1849, together with a copy of an announcement made in the London Gazette.

TRANSLATION.

My LORD.

Foreign Office, San José, November 4th, 1896.

The Government of Costa Rica wish to conclude with those nations with whom they entertain close and cordial relations, new treaties which may be more in harmony with the present interests and necessities of the country and of its commerce.

To this reason, and by instruction of the President of the Republic, I have the honour to inform your Lordship that I denounce in the name of my Government, Articles V., VI. and VII. of the Treaty concluded between this Republic and Great Britain on the 27th day of November, 1849, and signed by the plenipotentiaries Don Joaquin Bernardo Calvo and Mr. Frederic Chafteld. This denunciation is made in accordance with the provisions of Article XV, of the same Treaty. I avail, &c.,

YOUR EXCELLENCY, I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt on the 26th ultimo of your note of the 4th of November denouncing Articles V., VI. and VII. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation concluded between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica on the 27th of November, 1849.

Her Majesty's Government note that this demunciation is made in conformity with the provisions of Article XV. of that Treaty. They therefore accept it, and have announced in the *London Gazette* that Articles V., VI, and VII. of the Treaty will cease and determine on the 26th of November, 1897.

Her Majesty's Government are happy to think that all the other Articles referring to Friendship, Commerce and Navigation will, under the terms of the above-mentioned Article, remain in force, and in order to strengthen the relations of amity, to which they attach much value, they will be prepared to negotiate alternative Articles in place of those now denounced.

They will therefore be glad to be informed of the nature of the alternative Articles which the Government of Costa Rica may desire to suggest.

Extract from the "London Gazette" of Tuesday, December 8, 1896.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Costa Rican Republic a note dated the 4th ultimo, denouncing Articles V., VI. and VII. of the Treaty of Friedship, Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica concluded on the 27th November, 1849.

This notice of denunciation, which is in conformity with the provisions of Article XV. of that Treaty, has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government, and Articles V., VI. and VII. of the Treaty will cense and determine accordingly on the 26th November, 1897.

All the other Articles of the Treaty will remain in force.
