PROCLAMATION

GERARD SMITH. (L.S.)

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled the "Australasian Federation Enabling Act, 1896," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the aforesaid Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation: Now, THEREFORE, I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., the Governor aforesaid, do hereby declare that the said Act shall come into operation on the 22nd day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Rottnest, this 22nd day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GREETING:

E command you that you proceed, according to law, to the Election of Ten Members to represent Western Australia in the Convention established under the "Australasian Federation Enabling Act, 1896;" And we do hereby appoint Wednesday, the 10th day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, to be the day, and do also appoint the Legislative Assembly Chamber, Perth, to be the place of nomination of Candidates at the said Election, and the place where such Election shall be held: And we do further command you that, in the event of the said Election being contested, the poll shall be taken between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Noon only, on Saturday, the 13th day of March, at the place aforesaid: And that you do endorse hereon the names of the persons elected, and do return

forthwith this our Writ so endorsed to the Governor of our Colony of Western Australia, at Perth.
