## Declaration of Peak Hill Goldfield.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," Section 7, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to proclaim any portion of Crown Lands to be a Goldfield, and that the boundaries of every Goldfield proclaimed may from time to time be altered or cancelled by the Governor, by Proclamation: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that from and after the 1st April, 1897, the portion of Crown Lands bounded by lines starting from an angle in the Northern boundary of the Murchison Goldfield, at the summit of Mt. Hale, and extending along the said boundary in an East-South-Easterly direction to another angle at the summit of Mt. Russell; thence due North to the North-Easterly corner of the East Murchison Goldfield, latitude being on the 26th parallel of South latitude; thence in a Northerly direction to Trig. Station L 15 on Wonyulganna Hill; thence in a North-Westerly direction to the summit of Mt. Bresnahan, between the Angelo River and the Upper Ashburton; thence in a South-Westerly direction to Trig. Station K 20 on a peak near the source of the Lyons River; thence still South-Westerly to the summit of Mt. Gascoyne; thence South-South-Easterly to the starting point on the summit of Mt. Hale,—to be a Goldfield, to be known and called by the name of the

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to alter the boundaries of, and create new Wards within a Municipality: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the North and West Wards of the City of Perth, and to create a New Ward, to be called the South Ward:

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said North and West Wards, and create a new Ward, to be called the South Ward; and do hereby define the boundaries of the said wards to be as follows:—

## NORTH WARD.

Bounded on the *South* by the centre of Mangles Street and Ellen Street; on the *West* by the centre of Palmerston Street, and the South and West boundaries of the Third Swamp Reserve; on the *North* by the centre of Vincent Street and Burt Street; on the *East* by the centre of Walcott Street and old Guildford Road.

## WEST WARD.

Bounded on the *South* by the railway line; on the *West* by the centre of Trevarton and Loftus Streets; on the *North* by the centre of Vincent Street; on the *East* by the West and South boundaries of the Third Swamp Reserve, the centre of Palmerston Street, centre of Ellen Street, and the centre of Hutt Street.

## SOUTH WARD.

Bounded on the *South* by Perth Water and Melville Water; on the *East* by the centre of William Street; on the *North* by the railway line, and on the *West* by the West boundaries of the City.

## Imported Dog Regulations.

## "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

## Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 3rd day of March, 1897.

## Present:

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables—

The Colonial Treasurer,

The Attorney General,

The Minister of Mines,

The Commissioner of Railways.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: NOW THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of Dogs into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, except in conformity with and subject to the following Regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

(1.) No dog shall be landed in the Colony of Western Australia at any place other than within the ports of Albany and Fremantle.

(2.) The quarantine ground in the port of Albany shall be Geakes' Island, and the quarantine ground for Fremantle shall be the enclosure set apart for that purpose on Rottneest Island.

(3.) No dog will be allowed in the quarantine ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine ground may be destroyed or subjected to quarantine by an Inspector.

(4.) All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by the Regulations issued under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," on August 28, 1897, as being only ship's dogs, or dogs in transit to other colonies not requiring to be landed, such dogs, if healthy, shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within any port in the Colony, except as may be otherwise authorised by an Inspector.

(5.) Any master, or owner, or consignee who shall refuse or neglect to have any dog securely chained as directed by an Inspector, or who shall neglect to carry out any order or direction given by an Inspector for the care or security of any dog, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

(6.) Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained may be destroyed or detained in quarantine at the expense of the owner, and any person taking or allowing a dog to be on board a ship where an imported dog is detained shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 for each breach of this regulation.

(7.) A deposit of £10 for every dog to be landed shall be paid on demand to the Chief Inspector, to meet the expenses liable to be incurred in the quarantine and treatment of such dog.

### Regulations under "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893," which shall come into force on the 1st of April, 1897:—

#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE SALE OF TOWN LANDS.

At all sales by auction of Town Lands the purchaser shall, on the fall of the hammer, deposit an amount equal to 25 per cent. of the purchase money, unless he has previously made a deposit on application, in which case he shall deposit a sum which, together with that previously paid, shall make up 25 per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment of the purchase money so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid in equal instalments at the end of three (3) and six (6) calendar months from the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment of purchase money, and in default thereof the purchaser shall forfeit his deposit and all right to the title of the ground.

In any case where the value of improvements on a Lot is added to the upset price, as prescribed in Section 29 of the Goldfields Act, and the Lot is knocked down to any other than the owner of such improvements, the value of the same shall be paid on the fall of the hammer.
