### Application for Amendment.

IN the matter of Letters Patent No. 1375, dated 11th November, 1896, granted to William Norman for an Invention for "Improvements in Seed and Manure Drills."

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned William Norman, of Blyth Street, Adelaide, in the Province of South Australia, Grain Merchant, has applied to amend the complete specification of his said invention, alleging his reasons for so doing (1.) To more particularly describe and ascertain the invention than is set forth in the original specification; (2.) To describe the invention in a manner as is found to be practicable and best for use.

The Amendments proposed are as follows, viz.—[Reference being had to amended Copy of Specification lodged in Patent Office, Ferth.]

Page 2.

Line 2.—After the word "manure," insert the word "when."

Line 3.—After the word "particularly," insert the word "First."

Line 4.—After the word "drills," insert the words "Secondly,—to an adjustable device for holding the tines into the ground." Also substitute the word "Thirdly" for "further."

Line 6.—Strike out the word "drill."

Lines 12 and 13.—Substitute "Fig. 2.—A side elevation of the adjusting device for keeping the tine in the ground, and of the stump-jumping contrivance attached to each of the drill tines."

Page 3.

Line 28.—Strike out the words "The stump jumping attachment," and insert the words "The adjustable device for holding each of the tines independently in the ground."

### Page 4.

Strike out lines 6, 7, and 8, and insert "A series of holes is provided in the upper part of the upright N2 by placing a pin in one of which the collar O is prevented from rising, and by means of the lever P through the bar N each or any tine can be lifted clear of the ground. It also regulates the depth of the tine in the ground and prevents it from going too deep when passing from hard to soft ground. Each of the arms N being provided with a separate device for adjusting the pressure and for retaining the tine in the ground; it is possible by this means to give a greater or less pressure to any of the tines as the nature of the work may require."

Line 18.—Strike out the words "In addition to."

Line 19.—Strike out the words "this the," and insert the word "Each." Insert the word "also" after the words "tine is," and for the words "an auxiliary stump," substitute the words "a stump."

Line 23.—Strike out the words "when the" and insert the word "The," also insert the word "On" after the letter "Q."

Line 24.—Alter the word "meets" to read "meeting," and strike out the words "The arm N rises upon the pivotted end N1 compressing the spring N3 until the arm N strikes against the axle A. Should the obstruction not then be passed the tine Q will still further" after the word "obstruction."

Line 29.—Strike out the word "operating," and insert the word "coiling."

Line 30.—Strike out the word "coiled" before the word "spring."  $\!\!\!\!$ 

Line 31.—Strike out the words "so that when," and insert the word "on." Strike out the word "is," and insert the word "being." Alter the words "springs" to "spring," and insert the words "uncoiling of the" before it.

Line 32.—Strike out "and N3" after the reference letter "R1." Alter the word "cause" to "causes," and strike out the words "the arm N and" immediately following it.

Line 33.—Strike out the word "their" after the word "resume," and insert the word "its." Also strike out the words "in addition to providing a."

Strike out Lines 34 and 35.

Page 5.

Strike out Lines 6 and 7.

After claim 3 insert fresh claim—"4. In seed and manure drills, a device for adjusting the pressure for keeping each tine independently in the ground."

#### Page 6.

Insert fresh claim—"5. In seed and manure drills the combination with a bar carrying the tine to which pressure is applied by means of an upright piece and spiral spring of a device by which the pressure upon the spiral spring (such as N3) can be adjusted at will consisting of a collar (such as O) provided with a jointed lever (such as P) substantially as herein described."

Alter "Claim 4" to read "Claim 6."

Alter "Claim 5" to read "Claim 7," and strike out the word " supplementary " appearing therein.


