By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53 Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to exempt any portion of the Colony of Western Australia specified in such proclamation from the operation of these Acts: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt that portion of the said Colony North of the 28th parallel of latitude from the operation of the Fishery Acts aforesaid: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation exempt that portion of the said Colony North of the 28th parallel of latitude from the operation of the Fishery Acts before mentioned.

Y virtue of the provisions of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868," I, the said Governor, do hereby adjudge and declare that it is probable that an infectious disease, known as the Bubonic Plague, and dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought into Western Australia by vessels coming from or having touched at any of the Ports of the Islands of Hawaii, New Hebrides, Loyalty Islands, New Caledonia, and Islands adjacent thereto, Portugal, and Portuguese South Africa.

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all or any kind of fishing, and for any times specified in such Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Murray and Serpentine Rivers with their estuaries, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and portion of the Sea should be declared close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the Murray and Serpentine Rivers with their estuaries, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and portion of the Sea, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto attached, to be close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the 1st day of February, 1900.

The notice published in the Government Gazette of 9th June, 1899, providing for Herring and Salmon fishing from 1st April to 31st December in each and every year within that portion of No. 1 Bank (entrance to Peel's Inlet) situate outside (seaward) the Bar, to continue in force.

No. 1 Bank.

"And shall not call at any place or port of the Colony other than the said spot and the port of Wyndham, for a period of two months after such disinfection: Provided that, for the purpose of taking water or coal on board, such vessels may be allowed by the Chief Harbour Master to approach to within 10 feet of the Fremantle Sea Jetty or River Wharf."

The Amended Regulation will read as follows: -

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve  $^{\bigwedge}_{6320}$ , Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle, and shall not call at any place or port of the Colony other than the said spot and the port of Wyndham for a period of two months after such disinfection: Provided that, for the purpose of taking water or coal on board, such vessels may be allowed by the Chief Harbour Master to approach to within 10 feet of the Fremantle Sea Jetty or River Wharf.
