BY-LAW No. 14.

For preventing the use of highly inflummable material in the construction of houses, etc.

Any person who, without obtaining permission of the Any person who, without obtaining permission of the Council, shall within the Municipality erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any house, shed, tent, pavilion, or other structure of canvas, hessian, calico, or other highly inflammable material, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence. Failing the removal of such building within seven (7) days after such notice duly given, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Council to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending person so offending.

BY-LAW No. 15.

BY-LAW NO. 15. Clause 1.—Any person intending to erect any shop, house, fence, or other structure, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Southern Cross, shall give to the Town Clerk (3) three days' clear notice in writing of such inten-tion, describing the nature and situation of such proposed erection; and, if required by the Council, shall furnish for their inspection a copy of plans and specifications proposed to be adopted for such erection, and shall, if so required, provide a duplicate plan or tracing, to become the property of the Council. of the Council.

Clause 2.—Every person who, by neglect or otherwise, shall offend against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Clause 1.—Every person who shall place, or permit to be placed, in any street, lane, yard, or place, whether public or private, any fire or combustible material of any kind in such manner as to endanger any contiguous building shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

Clause 2.—Any unprotected fire in the open air made or permitted within (10) ten yards of any dwelling-house, store, or other building, or within (7) seven yards of any fence, shall, for the purpose of this By-law, be deemed to endanger such building or other structure.

Light on Bathurst Point, Rottnest Island.

THE Government of Western Australia give notice that a light will shortly be exhibited from a Lighthouse now in course of erection at Bathurst Point, the North-East extreme of Rottnest Island, in Lat. 31° 59′ 15″ South, and Long. 115° 33′ 15″ East.

The light, which is a Fixed Dioptric Light of the Second Order, will be exhibited from a stone tower of a natural grey colour, and will have a height of focal plane above high water of 98 feet.

It will be visible from seaward over an arc of 200 degrees, *i.e.*, between the bearings of E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. through North to N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., and should be seen from the deck of a vessel 15ft. above sea level about 15 nautical miles in clear weather.
