REGULATIONS.

WRIT.

1. The Governor shall issue the Writ to the Returning Officer for the purpose of submitting the question of the acceptance or rejection of the Constitution to the Electors.

The Writ shall be returnable to the Governor within the time prescribed thereby, and shall be in the following form or to the like effect:—

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen,

GREETING :

WHEREAS by "The Australasian Federation Enabling Act (Western Australia), 1900," it is enacted that on the 31st day of July, 1900, a Poll shall be taken of the Electors of Western Australia upon the question of the acceptance or rejection of a Bill to constitute the Commonwealth of Australia: We therefore, with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Colony of Western Australia, command you that you do proceed, according to law, to the taking of the said Poll; and that you do endorse hereon the result of the said Poll, and do return this Our Writ, so endorsed, to the Governor of Our said Colony of Western Australia, at Perth, not later than the _____ day of _____ in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred.

COPY OF WRIT TO BE SENT TO EVERY ASSISTANT RETURNING OFFICER.

2. Upon the receipt of the Writ the Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable, transmit a copy thereof, certified by him to be correct, to every Assistant Returning Officer.

Such certificate shall be in the following form:—

I certify that this is a true copy of the Writ for the taking of a Poll upon the question of the acceptance or rejection of a Bill to constitute the Commonwealth of Australia, issued by the Governor to me on the day of 1900.

DATE OF RECEIPT TO BE ENDORSED ON WRIT.

3. Upon the receipt of a copy of the Writ, the Assistant Returning Officer shall endorse on it the date of its receipt, attaching his signature in verification. He shall retain such copy in his possession.

Such endorsement shall be in the following form:—

NOTICE OF ELECTION.

4. Upon the receipt of the copy of the Writ, or upon receipt of previous instructions, the Assistant Returning Officer shall take immediate steps to make it generally known throughout the Electoral District that the Poll is about to be taken. He shall do so by inserting a notice twice, at the least, in the local newspapers, if any; and if no newspapers are published and circulated within the Electoral District, he shall cause notices to be conspicuously posted at each of the polling places or places of general resort in such District. He shall moreover notify by similar means the places at which Voters' Certificates may be obtained, and the names of the Registrar and Assistant Registrars appointed to issue them. He will also supply such Registrars with printed Voters' Certificates, and applications for the same. Every such notice shall be in the following form:—

I, the undersigned, hereby notify that I have this day received from the Returning Officer duly appointed under the above-named Act a copy of a Writ for the taking of a Poll upon the question of the acceptance or rejection of a Bill to constitute the Commonwealth of Australia.

NOTICE OF NEW POLLING PLACES.

5. The like public notice shall be given of every polling place within the Electoral District subsequently appointed or cancelled.

PRESIDING OFFICERS TO BE SELECTED.

6. The Assistant Returning Officer shall also appoint presiding officers at the several polling places other than the place at which he himself presides, and may pay to him a fee not exceeding two guineas if a Government Officer, and not exceeding three guineas if not a Government Officer, for his services. But if the time will not permit of the delay necessary for carrying out such an arrangement, or if other circumstances render it absolutely necessary for him to depute and despatch a person to act as presiding officer at any distant polling place, the fee to be paid shall be determined by circumstances; but the expense incurred shall not be disproportionate to the services rendered.

The appointment shall be made in writing under the hand of the Assistant Returning Officer, in the form following:—

ESTABLISHMENT OF SEVERAL POLLING BOOTHS AT THE SAME POLLING PLACE.

7. When a larger number of electors is likely to vote at a polling place than can conveniently vote in the same polling booth, the Assistant Returning Officer may appoint two or more polling booths at that polling place, and shall, in such case, appoint presiding officers to take the Poll at the polling booths at which he does not himself preside.

APPOINTMENT OF POLL CLERKS.

8. The Assistant Returning Officer and the presiding officers, with his approval, may, in case of necessity, appoint Poll Clerks to assist in taking the Poll.

The remuneration to be paid to a Poll Clerk shall, unless otherwise specially approved by the Colonial Secretary, be one guinea.

PREPARATION AND SUPPLY OF BALLOT PAPERS.

9. The Returning Officer shall cause ballot papers to be printed, which shall be $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches by $5\frac{3}{4}$ inches in size.

Ballot papers shall be supplied by him, in sufficient numbers, to the Assistant Returning Officers, who shall supply the presiding officers at the different polling places.

If at any polling place the supply of ballot papers proves to be insufficient, the presiding officer shall cause ballot papers to be written, which shall be as good and effectual in all respects and shall be dealt with in the same manner as the printed ballot papers supplied by the Returning Officer.

COPIES OF ROLLS TO BE SUPPLIED.

10. The Assistant Returning Officer shall supply to all presiding officers copies of the rolls of his Electoral District certified under his hand.

He shall also supply to each presiding officer a proper ballot box of wood or other opaque material, with lock and key; but this direction shall not exempt any presiding officer from his duty to see that the same is provided.

He shall despatch messengers with the necessary documents, materials, and ballot box to all presiding officers who are beyond the reach of speedy and sure communication.

The registrar and every assistant registrar for each Electoral District shall deliver the lists of voters for each polling place, prepared under the provisions of Section 7 of the Australasian Federation Enabling Act (Western Australia), 1900, to the respective presiding officers.

BALLOT PAPERS TO BE INITIALED.

11. The Assistant Returning Officer at the booth where he himself presides, and at every other polling place the presiding officer, shall at the time of delivery, and not before, mark with his initials in ink or pencil the back of every ballot paper given to a voter.

He shall also, upon delivering a ballot paper to a voter, make a mark against the name of such voter upon the roll, or upon the list of voters' certificates issued.

MODE OF VOTING.

12. Every person who has received a ballot paper shall retire alone into a compartment or ballot room provided for the purpose at the polling place, and shall there, if in favour of the acceptance of the Constitution, strike out the word "No," and if against the acceptance of the Constitution, strike out the word "Yes," and then shall fold the ballot paper so as to conceal the face thereof, but so that the initials of the Assistant Returning Officer or other presiding officer may be seen; and, after exhibiting such initials to such presiding officer, shall deposit the paper in the ballot box.

BALLOT PAPERS OF ABSENT VOTERS

13. The Assistant Returning Officer, on receipt of any ballot papers of absent voters, shall, without opening the envelopes, retain them in his possession until the commencement of the poll, and shall at any convenient time or times, during or immediately after the taking of the poll in the presence of such persons as may be present, proceed to open the envelopes containing the counterfoils, and having made a mark on the copy of the Electoral Roll in use at his polling place against the name of each person who appears by such counterfoils to have voted, shall keep such counterfoils. Having thus dealt with the counterfoils the Assistant Returning Officer shall proceed to open the envelopes containing the ballot papers received up to the close of the poll, first seeing that the seals of the said envelopes are intact; and as he takes out any ballot paper from its envelope, he shall, without opening the same, deposit it in the ballot box.

PRESIDING OFFICER TO COUNT HIS BALLOT PAPERS AND MAKE
OUT WRITTEN STATEMENT.

14. Immediately on the close of the poll at a polling place other than the principal polling place in the Electoral District, the presiding officer shall, in the presence of his poll clerks (if any), and also of such electors as may attend, not exceeding

six, open the ballot box and examine and count the number of votes therein, and the number given for the acceptance and for the rejection of the Constitution, and publicly declare the result.

The Presiding Officer shall then and there prepare and sign a written statement containing the numbers, in words as well as figures, of the votes given at the polling place which he has examined and counted, both for the acceptance and for the rejection of the Constitution, and shall seal up all the ballot papers so examined at the polling place, and all books kept by him during the polling, and shall at once forward or deliver them to the Assistant Returning Officer, together with the roll used by him during the poll, signed. Such statement shall be in the following form:—

ASSISTANT RETURNING OFFICER TO COUNT BALLOT PAPERS
TAKEN AT THE SEVERAL POLLING PLACES.

15. As soon as possible after the Assistant Returning Officer has received from the several presiding officers the sealed papers containing the ballot papers taken at the different polling places, and their statements of the numbers of the votes recorded there, he shall open such sealed parcels and examine and count the number of votes at each separate polling place (deciding any doubtful cases as he proceeds) and then make out, in respect of each polling place, a written statement of the number of votes given at each polling place, both for the acceptance and for the rejection of the Constitution, and sign the same. Such statement shall be in the following form:—

He shall immediately transmit such statement to the Returning Officer.

He shall also make up, seal, and endorse, in separate parcels, the ballot papers, rolls, books, and papers received from each presiding officer, in the manner prescribed, concerning the ballot papers, rolls, books, and papers kept and used by him at his own polling place.

STATEMENT OF POLL.

16. As soon as possible after the Assistant Returning Officer has examined and counted all the ballot papers examined and counted at the several polling places, and has ascertained the total number of votes given both for the acceptance and for the rejection of the Constitution in respect of his Electoral District, he shall publicly state the result of the poll in respect of his Electoral District.

He shall also, as soon as practicable after the declaration of the result of the poll in respect of his Electoral District, enclose in one packet the several sealed parcels above mentioned of the several polling places, and seal the packet and endorse it with a description of the several contents, the name of the Electoral District, and the date of polling, adding his signature thereto, and transmit such sealed packet to the Returning Officer.

ASSISTANT RETURNING OFFICER TO EXAMINE ROLLS
FOR CASE OF PERSONATION.

17. The Assistant Returning Officer, as soon as practicable after the declaration of the result of the polls, shall examine the rolls which have been used and marked by himself and the residing officers at the several polling places, and ascertain whether any electors appear to have voted at more than one polling place. He shall then make out a list showing the names and numbers of all the electors who appear to have so voted, and forward a copy thereof under his hand to the Returning Officer.

RETURNING OFFICER TO COMPILE RESULT OF POLL AND
DECLARE IT.

18. From the statements received from the several Assistant Returning Officers, the Returning Officer shall ascertain the total number of votes given in Western Australia, both for the acceptance and for the rejection of the Constitution, and shall forthwith publicly declare the result of the poll. He shall also, as soon as possible, transmit to the Colonial Secretary a statement, under his hand, showing the particulars of the voting and the result. Such report shall be in the following form:—

VOUCHERS FOR ELECTION EXPENSES.

19. An account of all necessary and unavoidable expenditure incurred by the Returning Officer shall be made out in the form of vouchers for "services performed," or articles supplied. In the first shall be inserted the names of the Assistant Returning Officers, presiding officers, and poll clerks, and the fees payable to them, and also the name of each messenger necessarily employed, with the amount due for his services; in the latter, particulars shall be given of all outlays for necessary incidental expenditure. These vouchers shall be certified by the Returning Officers and be forwarded to the Under Secretary, who, upon approval, shall cause payment to be made either to the Returning Officer or the several individual claimants, as may be expedient.

REMUNERATION OF ASSISTANT RETURNING OFFICERS.

20. There shall be paid to every Assistant Returning Officer, for the performance of all duties imposed upon him in connection with the taking of the poll, a fee of five guineas.
