Death of His Royal Highness Prince Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, etc.

INTELLIGENCE having been received of the lamented decease, on the 30th ultimo, of His Royal Highness Prince ALFRED ERNEST ALBERT, Duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, Prince of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, etc., second son of Her Majesty the Queen, His Excellency the Administrator hereby directs—

- (1.) That Sunday, the 5th instant, be observed as a day of General Mourning in Western Australia, and that the officers of the Government and all others of Her Majesty's subjects be invited to wear Mourning in token of their sympathy with Her Majesty, Her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie Alexandrovna, Duchess of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, and the Royal Family in their great affliction.
- (2.) That the Flags on all the Public Buildings be hoisted half-mast high, from 8 a.m. until sunset on the above day.
- (3.) It is requested that the Flags on board of the Ships in the Harbours be similarly displayed on the same day.
- (4.) The Commandant of the Local Forces is hereby commanded to cause twenty-one minute guns to be fired on the above-mentioned day, such salute terminating at sunset.
