TWELFTH SCHEDULE (Section 186).

A REGULATION of the Municipality of Fremantle, made under the 56th Section of Part VIII. of the Tenth Schedule to "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," in force in the Municipality by virtue of a By-Law of the above-named Municipality, numbered 67, for regulating the carriage of persons and goods.

# Reward for the Discovery of Mineral Phosphates (Manures).

T is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to approve of the following rewards being offered for the discovery of mineral phosphates within the State of Western Australia, viz.:—

£500 if discovered upon Crown lands. £250 if discovered upon private lands.

The following are the conditions under which the rewards are offered and will be paid:—

- 1. That the mineral phosphates be easily accessible and within reasonable distance of a railway or seaport.
- 2. That the Minister for Lands must be satisfied the deposits contain enough mineral phosphates to supply all ordinary requirements of the State for at least two years.
- 3. That the manure can be disposed of at a price that will allow of its being remuneratively used for agricultural purposes.
- 4. That the average composition of the phosphates shall be not less than 35 per cent. of tricalcic phosphate; provided however, should a phosphate of a lower average composition be discovered, the Minister may pay a reduced reward.
- 5. One-half of the reward to be paid when the Minister is satisfied as to the extent and value of the deposit, and the other half when 500 tons have been sold from the works.

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Lands or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing on the area of Crown Land hereafter to be known and distinguished as the Kanowna State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:—

Bounded on the South and West by lines extending East 560 chains and North 640 chains from the South-West corner of \$\infty\$7466, the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

The boundaries published in the Government Gazette of 6th July, 1900, are hereby cancelled.

Any person offending against this Regulation shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £20.

IS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Sections 153 and 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the leasing of any Town or Suburban Lands which may be declared open for selection as Residential Leases:—

- 1. An application for a lease of town or suburban land declared open for selection as a Residential Lease shall be made in the form of Schedule "A."
- 2. The applicant shall be a male person above the age of 18 years, not being an Asiatic or African alien; or a female, not being an Asiatic or African alien, who is above the age of 18 years and the sole head of a family.
- 3. Applications shall be made to the Minister for Lands, but shall be lodged at the office of the Land Agent of the District within which the land is situate, or in case the land is situate within a Goldfield, then at the office of the Warden of such Goldfield, and shall be transmitted to the Minister by the Land Agent or Warden with his recommendation thereon.
- 4. Applications shall take priority in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of "The Land Act, 1898," and Section 2 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."
- 5. Every application shall set forth the number, position, and area of the lot applied for, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form of Schedule "B."
- 6. A fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application, in addition to the rent, at the rate of 10s. per annum, as provided in Section 10 following.
- 7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.
- 8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."
- 9. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and of so much of the land below the natural surface to a depth of 40 feet, if situate within a Goldfield or Mining District, and to a depth of 2,000ft. in respect to all other lands.
- 10. Every lease shall be granted for a term not to exceed 21 years, at the rent of 10s. per annum, payable in advance, as prescribed by Section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898," the first payment to be made with the application. At the expiration of the said term, the Lessee shall have a preferential right of renewal for a further period of 21 years, on the terms and conditions prescribed by any Act or Regulations in force for the time being, should the land demised not be required by the Government.
- 11. Every Town or Suburban Lot leased under these Regulations shall be taken possession of within one month of the approval of the application for the same, and shall be used as the habitual abode of the Lessee, or some member of his family, for at least nine months in every year, and shall not be used for any business purpose, or for any purpose other than that of residence.

- 12. Any Town or Suburban Lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, or any portion thereof, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose, at three months' notice to the Lessee, published in the Government Gazette; and immediately after the expiration of such three mouths, all the estate and interest of the Lessee in the land demised, or the portion resumed, as the case may be, shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted: Provided that, on any such resumption, the Lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister the fair value of any improvements existing on the said land, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the Lessee and one by the Minister; any difference of opinion between the said Valuers to be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.
- 13. In case of the refusal by the Minister of any application, notice thereof shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to the address given in the application, and the fee paid on the application and the deposit of rent shall thereupon be returned to the applicant on demand.
- 14. No person shall hold any Residential Lease within the distance of two miles from any other Residence Area or Residential Lease or Town or Suburban Lot held by him.
- 15. No Lessee shall transfer or underlet the premises demised by any lease, except with the consent of the Minister in writing first obtained, after production by the Lessee of the lease, and a statutory declaration by the transferee in the form of Schedule "B," and on payment of a fee of 5s.
- 16. No transfer or sub-letting of a lease shall be allowed until after the expiration of three months from the date on which the same was granted.
- 17. No transfer or underlease of any portion of the demised premises shall be approved on any conditions whatsoever.
- 18. The Governor may, at any time, by notice in the Government Gazette, exempt from the operation of these Regulations any portion of any Town or Suburban Lands which may have been declared open for selection.
