WHEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such proclamation: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following area to be an area within which no live or growing sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during a period of two years from the 1st day of November, 1901 :---

AREA ABOVE REFERRED TO: Bounded on the Westward by the Great Southern Railway Northward to Beverley by the Eastern Railway to Clack-line Junction, the Newcastle Railway to Newcastle, and thence by road to Walebing, viâ New Norcia, to a point West of HK (conjoined) 107 (Waddouring Rock) : thence West to the sea coast and along it Northerly; on the North by the Murchison River upwards to the 40-Mile Crossing ; on the East by a Southerly line from the 40-Mile Crossing aforesaid to Pinddar, on the Cue Railway, and onwards through the highest peak of the Wongan Hills to a point West of HK (conjoined) 107 (Waddouring Rock) aforesaid ; thence East to a point North of Mindabooka, HK (conthence East to a point North of Mindabooka, HK (con-joined) 196; thence South to Mindabooka aforesaid, and South-South-Easterly to Cape Knob, and on the South by the sea coast.

BY virtue of the provisions of Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby orders that the provisions contained in Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force in Western Australia, and does hereby also make the following orders :--

That notice shall be given immediately by the occupier of any house, premises, or place wherein there is any infectious or contagious disease, to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the District, and if there be no Local Board, then to the Secretary of the Central Board.

That entry may be made at all times to $\mathbf{2}$ houses, buildings, and premises by Medical or other officers of local boards, or the Central Board, for the purpose of carrying out any regulations made by the Central Board, or of inquiring into and ascertaining the presence of such disease.

3. That infected bedding, clothing, and other infected things shall be destroyed or disinfected.

4. That houses, schools, churches, places of assembly or entertainment, and other buildings and premises, shall be cleansed, purified, ventilated, and disinfected by the owners or occupiers thereof, or by medical or other officers of, or persons authorised thereto by the Local Board or the Central Board, at the expense of the owners or occupiers, or where necessary at the public expense.

5. That persons suffering from infectious or contagious diseases shall be removed to a hospital or other place which shall be deemed suitable or convenient by the Central Board, and shall be kept in such place until they are free from infection or contagion.

6. That all persons shall be forbidden and prevented from quitting or entering any house, premises, place, town, or district, which may be declared infected by the Governor in Council or other person or persons authorised by him, in accordance with Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," by notice published in accordance with that section.

7. That the Governor in Council may declare any house, premises, town, or district to be infected.

8. That all persons occupying or using the same house, premises, or place as any person suffering from Bubonic Plague, and all other persons deemed by the Central Board, or the Medical Officer thereof, or the Officer of Health, to have been liable to infection, from any cause whatever, shall be removed to an isolated place approved by the Central Board for that purpose, and shall remain in quarantine for such period as the Central Board may direct.

That the times, methods, and conditions of the burial of the dead shall be such as may be prescribed under any regulation made by the Central Board for this purpose under Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," and by virtue of this order.

That, in order to prevent the introduction and spreading of such diseases as aforesaid, by means of rats-

- (a.) In case of ships coming from any place or country where Bubonic Plague is known or suspected to exist, all rats on such ships shall be immediately destroyed.
- (b.) All rats in all stores, warehouses, and other buildings under the control of the Railway, Customs, and Harbours Departments, at the ports of the State, shall be destroyed.
- (c.) The Local Boards of Health at all the ports and towns of the State shall take the necessary steps to have the rats in such ports and towns destroyed.
- (d.) Complete precautions shall be taken to prevent rats coming ashore from all ships in any port of the State.
- (e.) The bodies of all rats taken, alive or dead, shall be destroyed by fire.
- (f.) An efficient staff shall be appointed to carry out the destruction of rats as aforesaid.
- (g.) A reward shall be offered for the bodies of rats captured at such ports as shall be named in the Regulations framed under this Order.

11. That all cargo from ships or vessels having touched at any port where Bubonic Plague is known or suspected to exist shall be disposed of and dealt with in such manner as the Medical Officer at such port may deem necessary; and all cargo consigned to Perth shall be dealt with at Fremantle in the same manner as cargo consigned to that port.

That as a further precaution as aforesaid, the landing of any articles or goods deemed by the Central Board to be liable to be infected may be prohibited or restricted by any regulation made by the Central Board, under Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," and by virtue of this order.

13. That these orders, made under Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," shall continue in force for one month from the date hereof, unless and until such orders may be revoked, altered, or varied in the meantime.

Municipal By-laws.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 19th September, 1901. IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-law made by the Council of the Municipality of Boulder.

A By-law of the Municipality of Boulder, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 74, for the Regulation and Control of a Fire Brigade in the said Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder order as follows :—

1. The Fire Brigade established by the Council of the Municipality shall be called the Boulder City Fire Brigade, and shall, until the Council otherwise determine, consist of 25 members in addition to the Superintendent.

2. There shall be a Committee of three Councillors—of which the Mayor also shall, *ex officio*, be a member appointed by the Council, called the Fire Brigade Committee, which shall have general supervision of the finances of the Brigade, and shall report thereon from time to time to the Council; provided that no expenditure or contract to expend or pay any sum of money exceeding $\pounds 20$ shall be made by the Committee without the authority of the Council.

3. The Superintendent of the Brigade shall be appointed by the Council.

4. The Brigade, subject to the approval of the Committee, may make, amend, and repeal rules to provide for the appointment of all officers of the Brigade, excepting the Superintendent, and for the general management of the affairs of the Brigade; and within fourteen days after any rule shall be made, amended, or repealed, the Brigade shall deliver to the Council a copy of the same.

5. No rule shall be inconsistent with these By-laws, or with any other By-laws now made or hereafter to be made by the Council, and no rule shall have effect until approved by the Council.

6. All funds of the Brigade shall be paid to an account at some bank. Accounts shall be paid by cheque signed by the Chairman of the Committee and the Town Clerk, after having been passed by the Committee.

7. The funds of the Brigade, whether obtained from the Conncil, the Government, or by private subscriptions, when provided for a special purpose shall be applied to that purpose, and when not provided for a special purpose shall be devoted to the general purposes of the Brigade, that is to say, for the purchase and maintenance of buildings and appliances, the payment of the members of the Brigade of regular fees for services rendered and expenses incurred in attendance at fires, practices, and competitions, and for other expenses incurred in maintaining the Brigade in a proper state of efficiency.

8. The Committee shall cause books of account to be kept, showing full particulars of all moneys received and expended, and such accounts shall be balanced on the 31st October in every year, and the same, together with a summarised statement of receipts and expenditure, and also of assets and liabilities at the date of balancing, shall be ready for audit within seven days after the said 31st October.

9. The Auditors appointed or elected to audit the accounts of the Municipality, or such other person or persons as the Council shall specially appoint for the purpose, shall audit the accounts of the Brigade, and any officer or member of the Brigade who may have in his custody or control any books, accounts, vonchers, or papers necessary for the performance of such audit shall produce and lay the same before such Auditors.

10. The buildings, machines, apparatus, and appliances of every description now in possession of the Council or the Brigade, or which may hereafter be purchased or acquired by the Council or by the Brigade by means of funds provided by or through the Council, shall be and remain the property of the Council; and the Superintendent of the Brigade shall furnish the Council or the Fire Brigade Committee with such information concerning the general condition, state of repair, or other particulars concerning such buildings, machines, apparatus, and appliances as the Council or the Committee may at any time require.

11. For the purpose of extinguishing fires which may occur within the Municipality, the Superintendent or officer in charge for the time being shall at any fire have the command of the Brigade, and also of all appliances euployed in extinguishing such fire.

12. Such officer is empowered to enter upon or through any premises while in the execution of his duty, and to direct the action of the Brigade through or upon such premises, and such officer is also empowered to take water either from tanks, reservoirs, or wells nearest or most convenient to the fire, and otherwise to do any other matter or thing which he shall deem expedient for the purpose aforesaid.

13. Any two members of the Brigade from time to time appointed by the Superintendent shall have power to enter any place of public annusement to ascertain whether danger from fire exists, and to prevent such danger arising.

14. The Superintendent of the Brigade, or the officer in charge for the time being, may employ such persons as may be necessary to assist the Brigade in extinguishing fires.

15. The Council shall have power, should it at any time see fit, to dissolve the Brigade, and on a resolution being passed by the Council that the Brigade be dissolved, and the publication of such resolution in the *Government Gazette*, the Brigade shall thereupon be dissolved, and the Brigade shall forthwith give up possession of and deliver to the Council all buildings and appliances, books and papers, and any other property belonging to the Council which may be in their possession; but the Council shall not control trophies won at competitions or articles obtained by the exertions of the members of the Brigade acting apart from the Council and the Fire Brigade Conmittee.

16. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$.

I have the honour to forward, for your consideration copy of a letter which has been received by His Excellency the Governor-General from the London Committee of the fund for the building, in connection with the Cape Town Cathedral, of a Memorial of the Soldiers and Sailors of all ranks, and of all parts of the Empire, who have given their lives for their Sovereign and their country in the South African war.

The design of the proposed building was forwarded with the letter; but I regret that, no spare copies having come to hand, it is not possible to send you one.

From the ground plan, it appears that the memorial portion consists of the choir, a memorial chapel adjoining, and the choir transept.

I forward also a copy of letter from *The Times* soliciting subscriptions, and shall be glad if you will give it publicity in your State, in order that any citizen who may feel dis-posed to assist should have an opportunity of doing so.

From the names of the signatories of that letter, you will perceive that the movement is a thoroughly repre-sentative one; and I may also mention that Their Majesties sentative one; and I may also mention that Their Majesties the King and Queen are respectively Patron and Patroness of the fund. The vice-patrons are His Grace the Arch-bishop of Canterbury, His Grace the Archbishop of York, Field Marshal Earl Roberts, and Lord Milner; while H.R.H. Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein is President of the Ladies' Committee, and in the list of the General Committee many very well known names occur.

I hope you will be able, at an early date, to furnish me with the roll of names asked for, in order that I may forward it to the Committee.

CAPE TOWN CATHEDRAL MEMORIAL FUND.

From The Times, 6/6/1901.

SIR,

We ask to be allowed to appeal to the British public through your columns on behalf of the proposal to erect in Cape Town a building which shall serve both as a memorial to those who have fallen in the South African war and as a thank-offering for those whose lives have been spared. In pursuance of the precedent of the erection of the English Church at Constantinople after the Crimean war, it has been decided that the present memorial shall take the form of the Eastern portion of the new Cathedrai about to be crected in Cape Town. There is a widespread desire that there should be built on South African soil a dignified and stately monument, hallowed by religions sanctions and dedicated to the service of Almighty God, in memory of the soldiers and sailors of all ranks and of all parts of the Empire, who have given their lives for their Sovereign and their country. For this memorial portion of the Cathedral a sum of at least £30,000 is required. Oppor-unity will be given to preserve on the walls of the building the names, so far as may be possible, of all those who have fallen. It is only right to say that towards the adjacent portion of the new Cathedral a sum of about £20,000 has been subscribed, mainly from Colonial sources.

The Memorial has received the cordial approval of His Majesty the King, who has most graciously consented to become the Patron of the fund; and we are authorised to say that Her late Majesty Queen Victoria "took a great interest in the success of the proposed Memorial."

The names of an influential committee were announced through the Press, on Monday, May 20th. A committee of ladies is also now being formed, of which H.R.H. Princess Christian has graciously accepted the office of President. Her honoured and beloved son was, it is known, very deeply interested in this proposal, and took an active part in its promotion when he was attacked by his fatal illness in Pretoria.

The new Cathedral will be regarded, we trust, as a pledge of the responsibilities both of the Church and of the Empire towards the future well-being of South Africa as well as a glorious Temple for the service of God, and a noble memorial to the courage and heroism of the fallen. In this spirit we most carnestly commend this our appeal, and trust that it may be most generously responded to by rich and poor alies in every part of the Empire. alike in every part of the Empire.

TELEGRAM.

King Edward's accession offers an opportunity of considering the Monarch's titles, and I am very desirous that the separate and greatly increased importance of the Colonies should be recognised, if possible.

I therefore venture to suggest "King of Great Britain and Ireland and of Greater Britain beyond the Seas."

It is possible that some of the self-governing Colonies might desire more special recognition, as King of Canada, King of Australia, but this would give rise to very great difficulties. Other self-governing Colonies, viz., New Zealand, Newfoundland, the Cape of Good Hope, and Natal, could hardly be excluded. It would be also desirable to refer to the Crown Colonies, all of which would be covered by the expression which I propose.

I request that you will consult your Ministers most confidentially, and enquire whether such recognition by the King would be gratifying to them, and, if so, whether they approve of the proposed style.

Referring to your telegram of the 29th January,^{*} respecting the King's title, my Responsible Advisers desiro me to express their high appreciation of your action in inviting the opinion of the Government of Canada on this important matter. They recognise the desirability, if the result can be reached without inconvenience, of making His Majesty's titles convey, not only to His own subjects, but to Poreign Powers as well, some idea of the world-wide character of the Empire over which He rules. They entertain some doubt as to the appropriateness of the expression "Greater Britain," which, while convenient colloquially, is perhaps hardly definite or intelligible enough for such a formal purpose. They would therefore suggest for consideration the expediency of retaining the title of King of Great Britain and Ireland and Emperor of India, and adding the words "King of Canada, Australasia, South Africa, and all the British Dominions beyond the Seas;" but if the mention of greater Colonies be deemed unfair to remainder of smaller Colonies, or otherwise objectionable, the addition to title might be "King of all the British Dominions beyond the Seas." The repetition of the word "King " in the title would perhaps be open to exiticism, in which case, the word "Sovereign" might be used as a suitable synonym. The time has now arrived when we must take leave of the great Island Continent over whose destinies you preside, and the principal object of my mission has been accomplished.

I am proud to have been entrusted by the King with that mission, in accordance with the wish of my beloved Grandmother, and to have had the honour of presiding at the inanguration of the first Parliament of this newly constituted Federation.

The never failing interest and pleasure which the discharge of our duties gave to the Duchess and myself will remain fresh in our memories, and we shall live in the recollection of those memorable and stirring days which witnessed the celebration of Australia's new political birth.

I would ask you to kindly make known to the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth, and to the Premiers of the several States, through their respective Governors and Administrators, and to the whole community, our warmest thanks for the hearty greetings and manifestations which have been invariably displayed towards us from the first memory that me as for the memory characteristics. moment that we set feet on your shore.

To the several Governments we desire to express our sincere gratitude for everything which has been done by them to conduce towards our comfort, convenience, and enjoyment.

I would especially refer to the excellent arrangements nade for our long journeys by rail, the accommodation for which surpassed any that we have ever before experienced.

We are greatly indebted to all the officials and employees whose work must, on these occasions, have been excessive and we trust that the public generally did not suffer from the dislocation of the normal working of the Railways.

The Police arrangements were everywhere carefully conceived, and carried ont with marked tact and ability, though on all occasions I noticed with pleasure how light were the duties of the Police in the streets, where order seemed to be a natural instinct among the vast crowds which thronged them.

The Post and Telegraph Departments displayed the greatest attention and courtesy in dealing with what, I fear, was no inconsiderable addition to their ordinary duties.

our stay in the different States I had the During pleasure of reviewing the Forces of the Commonwealth, numbering upwards of 25,000.

Everyone must have been impressed by this splendid display of fighting material available in Australia. The number on parade, and the cheerful willingness with which the volunteers assembled, often travelling long distances at no little personal inconvenience, gave proof of that fixed readiness to defend the national interests whenever and wherever they may be threatened, which has been declared so unmistakably throughout the Empire.

I feel certain that immeasurable advantages must accrue to the Military organisation of the Commonwealth by its being brought under one central administration.

I look upon it as a great privilege and pleasure to have had the opportunity of seeing and, in the King's name, presenting medals to the officers and men who have returned from the seat of war, and I have noted with much satisfaction the enthusiasm with which they have been received by their fellow countrymen.

1 have been much interested in the Cadet Corps, many of which were particularly smart, soldierlike in their bearing, and well equipped.

I am confident that the great importance of securing thoroughly efficient instruction for these corps will not be lost sight of by the responsible authorities.

It seems to me that in this excellent movement lies a strong power for good, for besides the benefit of a physical training, it inculcates into the coming generation that spirit of subordination and esprit de corps so essential, not merely in the soldier but in the development of the national character.

I have realised, with much satisfaction, that a sound and practical education is placed within the reach of all, and that the opportunities thus given by the State are fully taken advantage of by the people at large.

At the same time, the great importance of physical training is not lost sight of, and I had the pleasure of seeing not only the drill of the cadets but also admirably executed physical displays by the school children in the various States.

The Duchess and I feel that we cannot adequately thank Lady Hopetoun and you for your generous hospitality, for your unfailing kind attention, and for the manner in which you anticipated our wants and personally supervised all the arrangements of our visit.

Our cordial thanks are due to your excellent staff for their untiring patience and kindness in carrying out these arrangements, and for their valuable and ready assistance to me and my staff.

To the Governors and Administrators of the several States and to their staffs we desire to express our sincere thanks for the similar kind and thoughtful consideration which we have received while their guests, and our deep appreciation of the spirit in which all the trouble and inconvenience of entertaining so large a party was met.

We leave with many regrets, mitigated, however, by the hope that while we have gained new friendships and goodwill, something may also have been achieved towards the strengthening and welding together of the Empire through the sympathy and interest which have been displayed in our journey—both at home and in the colonies.

The Commonwealth and its people will ever have a warm place in our hearts.

We shall always take the keenest interest in its welfare, and our earnest prayer will be for its continued advancement, not only in material progress but in all that tends to make life noble and happy.

Cattle may only be removed from Reserve $\frac{1}{6320}$ Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quaran-tine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve

 $\overset{(\Lambda)}{6320},$ Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine areas, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve $\frac{1}{6320}$

Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows :---

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained, and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the salting-floor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

7. All stock carried from any other port of Western Australia than the Port of Wyndham, in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the then next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area.

8. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle

shipped from the East Kimberley Quarautine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

9. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500. Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.
- "Cattle " shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

REGULATION 141.

Clause 6.

(6.) The lessee or applicant for a lease, as the case may be, may summon the caveator or his agent to attend before the Supreme Court, or a Judge in Chambers, or the Registrar of the mining district in which the lease or application for lease is situate, to show cause why such caveat should not be removed; and such Court, Judge, or Registrar may, upon proof that the caveator has been summoned, make such order in the premises, either *ex parte* or otherwise, as to such Court, Judge, or Registrar shall appear fit.

Clause 9.

(9.) Before the expiration of a caveat, the caveator or his agent may make application to a Judge of the Supreme Court, or the Registrar of the mining district in which the lease or application for lease is situated, and upon his giving such undertaking and security, or lodging such sum in Court as the Judge or Registrar may consider sufficient to indemnify every person against any damage that may be sustained by reason of any disposition of the property being delayed, then, and in such case, a Judge or Registrar may make an order directing delay in registering any dealing with a lease, or application for a lease, for a further period to be specified in such order, or may make such other order as may be just.
