"This cross plate is exceedingly rigid and co-operates with the multipart or sectioned arrangement of the clearer in making it possible to maintain the vibrations of the clearer at an exceedingly high speed, thereby enabling the machine to turn out a greatly increased output.

"Each section of the clearer is composed of a base plate 73, which, in case the comb-like form of clearer is used, serves as a carrier for the teeth 65, and on this base plate is mounted a second plate 74, having a housing 75 adjacent each end thereof, in which the arms 76 from the eccentric straps are pivotally mounted on studs or short shafts 77, passing through said housings and secured therein by pins 78.

"The arms 76 have stops 79 in order to keep them properly centred in said housings, and each arm 76 terminates at its rear end in a semi-circular portion 80 of the eccentric strap, the remainder thereof being composed of the opposite semi-circular portion 81, which together are bolted about the adjacent eccentric."
