3. No person shall use or employ any vehicle upon any public road or street of the district unless the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are of the proportion specified in Section No. 1 of this by-law.

4. Every vehicle in use on any public road or street in 4. Every vehicle in use on any public road or street in the district shall have the diameter of the axle-arms painted on some conspicuous part on the off-side thereof; and any owner of any vehicle who neglects to have such measurements painted as aforesaid, or who has the same so painted incorrectly, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

5. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Vehicle means and includes any wagon, cart, or lorry or dray, but does not include any vehicle intended solely for the conveyance of passengers.
