WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Circuit Courts Act, 1897," the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that such portions of the State of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form Circuit Districts, and, further, that a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held in every such district once at least every three months, at a time and place to be appointed by the Governor by the like or any subsequent Proclamation: AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 22nd day of May last, the then Governor declared that a portion of the said State should be constituted a Circuit District, to be known as the Eastern Goldfields Circuit District, and appointed the third Wednesday in December as one of the times at which a sitting of the Supreme Court should be held in the said District: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to alter the time for holding the said sitting of the Supreme Court in the said District: Now, THEREFORE, I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the last Monday in November next as the time at which the said sitting of Supreme Court shall be held, in lieu of the third Wednesday in December aforesaid.

## THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

## LEONORA LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS power is given to Local Boards of Health to amend, alter, or repeal any of their By-Laws, the Local Board of Health of Leonora amends the following By-Laws as under:—

By-law No. 27, (Clause 4, to be altered to read:—

“The contractor shall visit every premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, and shall cause the same to be emptied as often as may be from time to time directed by the Inspector.”

By-Law No. 32, Clause 2, to read:—

“All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition, and removed by the contractor, owner, or occupier as often as the Inspector shall from time to time direct.”

By-law No. 34—Add:—

“Contract shall mean and include the exchange of slops or refuse for pig food for the service of removing same.”

## THE AGRICULTURAL LANDS PURCHASE ACT, 1896

(Act 60 Vict., No. 26).

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations in connection with the "Land Purchase Board" appointed under the above Act.

R. CECIL CLIFTON,  
Under Secretary for Lands.

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such time or times, at such place or places as the Minister for Lands, or other officer authorised by him in that behalf, shall from time to time appoint.

2. Every meeting of the Board (excepting an adjourned meeting) shall be convened and appointed by the Minister for Lands, or other officer authorised by him in that behalf, by posting to each member of the Board at his usual address, at least seven clear days before the date of such meeting, a notice in writing specifying the date and place of such meeting. Any omission to post such notice as aforesaid to any one or more members of such Board shall not invalidate such meeting.

3. Members for the time being constituting the Board shall, before entering into the consideration of the several offers referred to them for their report (in accordance with Section 6 of the above Act), choose one of their number to be the Chairman for that meeting (including any adjournment thereof), but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.

4. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman shall preside. No meeting of the Board shall be deemed properly constituted under these Regulations unless three members thereof shall attend thereat throughout.

5. The members present at any meeting convened and appointed as aforesaid shall have power to adjourn such meeting to such other time and place as a majority present at such meeting shall agree upon: Provided always that any such meeting shall not be adjourned for any greater period than seven days.

6. The Minister for Lands shall from time to time forward to the Board particulars of any offer or offers received pursuant to Section 5 of the above Act, and in respect of which a report or reports is or are required, and immediately after the consideration thereof by the Board the Chairman for the time being thereof shall, with all convenient speed, make and return to the Minister for Lands the report or reports, in writing, of the Board, touching the several matters referred to in Section 6 of the above Act. Such report or reports shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board and the several members thereof present at any such meeting.

7. All matters which shall be considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present. Each member to have one vote, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

8. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of £2 2s. for each sitting of the Board, convened and appointed as aforesaid, and shall also, in addition, be entitled to and shall receive his transport expenses actually incurred and paid by him, and a subsistence allowance of £1 10s. per diem when travelling or absent from home in the business of the Board.

9. Any member of the Board who shall not be present at any meeting within 15 minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same, without reasonable excuse, shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance, or for any transport expenses or subsistence allowance as hereinbefore mentioned.

10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

11. No member of the Board during his tenure of office shall be eligible to make any offer to surrender land to His Majesty under the provisions of the above Act, and no member shall act in any matter in which he shall have any direct or indirect interest.

The Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of 2nd July, 1897, are hereby cancelled.

- Each sample must weigh at least 6oz., but not more than 2lbs.
- Each sample must be enclosed in a separate canvas bag or strong paper wrapper, with a slip of paper bearing the name and address of the sender, together with a private mark by which it may be readily identified.
- The parcel must be forwarded *prepaid* to:—

Geological Survey Office,  
Perth.
- A letter must be sent at the same time to the same address stating for what metals the samples are to be assayed, or containing other instructions as the case may be.

Throughout the State South of the Tropics this month was decidedly wet, in compensation for the extremely dry weather experienced during August; and the general rains which set in on the 7th proved most beneficial to the agricultural districts, where the fall for the month was from 1 to 2 inches above the average.

Very heavy weather was felt on the South-West and South Coast between the 9th and 13th.

The rainfall at the Perth Botanical Gardens, 555 points, has only been exceeded on one occasion, viz., 601 in 1890.

The Climate Maps show that the atmospheric pressure throughout the State was about normal, except in the South-West, where it was below; and the temperature about an average.

Two stations in the Tropics, viz., Marble Bar and Derby, registered 100 deg. in the shade.

Cold nights were still experienced inland, as is shown by the following table:—

Each other member of the Court, £2 2s.
  - (b.) When the members of the Court, on a day when no sitting of the Court is held, meet in consultation for considering or settling an award, or meet in connection with a case which is before the Court for the purpose of inspecting any works, manufactory, or place where workers are employed, the time so occupied shall be deemed to be a sitting, provided that in every case the fact of the meeting is certified by the President.
  - (c.) No more than one sitting during any one day shall be charged for or allowed.
  - (d.) There shall be payable to each member of the Court (other than the President), in addition to the foregoing fees, for each day's absence from Perth :—

When the sitting is held within the Eastern or Western Industrial District, an allowance of 25s.

When the sitting is held elsewhere within the State beyond 25 miles from the General Post Office, Perth, an allowance of 20s.

- (e.) The President shall receive travelling allowances as paid to Judges of the Supreme Court for the time being.
- (f.) In addition to the foregoing fees there shall be payable to each member the cost actually paid or incurred by him in respect of fare for passage within the State by rail, vessel, or coach to and from the town in which he resides.
- (2.) A Board of Conciliation or Special Board of Conciliators :—
  - (a.) For each day's actual sitting of the Board—  
The Chairman and each member of the Board, £1 1s.
  - (b.) When a majority of the members of the Board, on a day when no sitting of the Board is held, meets in consultation for considering or settling an award, or meets in connection with a case which is before the Board for the purpose of inspecting any works, manufactory, or place where workers are employed, the time so occupied shall be deemed to be a sitting, provided that in every case the fact of the meeting is certified by the Chairman.
  - (c.) No more than one sitting during any one day shall be charged for or allowed.
  - (d.) In addition to the foregoing fees there shall be payable to each member, for each hour or portion of an hour in excess of two hours, travelling within the State to and from the town in which he resides, for the purpose of attending the sitting of the Board, 2s. 6d.; but not exceeding one guinea in any one day.
  - (e.) In addition to the foregoing fees there shall be payable to each member the cost actually paid or incurred by him in respect of fare for passage within the State by rail, vessel, or coach to and from the town in which he resides.
