NOTICE is hereby given that the undermentioned Application for the Grant of Letters Patent, and the complete Specification annexed thereto, has been accepted, and are now open to public inspection at this Office.

Application No. 392S.—MATTHEW HENRY READ, of Woolubar, near Kalgoorlie, Western Australia, Blacksmith, "*Safety Monkey for Mining Cages or Buckets and other Haulage Appliances.*"—Dated 5th July, 1902.

Claims:—

1. In safety haulage appliances:—Pivoted gripper jaws as D connected by knuckle-jointed links D3 to pivoted lever as D4, said levers having extensions as D7 and slots as D6, which latter carry dropper or key bars as J3, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.
2. In safety haulage appliances:—A coupling bar as B formed with shoulders as B7 and B3, and with a circular portion as B5 and with a taper or cut away formation as B6, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.
3. In safety haulage appliances:—An operative bar as F provided with controlling springs as F3 and said bar by its movement imparting a combined radial and vertical travel to a locking rod as G1, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.
4. In safety appliances:—A locking rod as G1 formed with spiral grooves as G4 and provided with corresponding grooved blocks as G5 and with a locking block as J which engages with a recessed dropper or

key-bar as J3, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.

5. In safety haulage appliances:—A movable collar as E working on a central guide or sleeve as A4 and such collar having bracket as K for guiding the key-bars J3 and locking blocks as J, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.

6. In safety haulage appliances:—The general construction and combination of the operative parts comprised by the pivoted gripper jaws as D, the coupling bar as B the operative bar as F, and its parts the locking-bar G1 and block J the dropper or key bar as J3, and the movable collar as E, all working together in a fellowship and punctual manner and held or contained in a frame designated by the letters A, A1, A2, substantially as and for the purposes herein explained and as illustrated in the attached drawings.

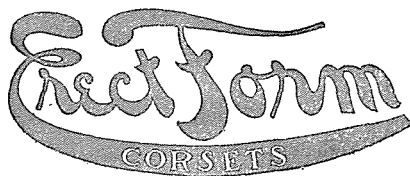
